

To some, it's a sonnet, Colorful and fleeting, But, to us, it's the Ultimate Christmas greeting.


It's buoyant and bouncy, And somewhat akin To the carefree holiday Mood we are in.

May your hopes ever rise, And your life stay in tune For a Christmas as merry As a big, bright balloon.





The corn crop was a winner. The hay crop — an essential ingredient for keeping our livestock fat and fit through the winter months — topped out at around 16,000 bales.

We produced some prize watermelons and faced our usual dilemma between satisfying the healthy appetites of our boys and cashing in at the market. True to tradition, the boys won out and, by the time they had eaten their fill, we had only one truckload left to take to market.

A gift of 45 Charolais cattle from generous friends in St. Petersburg boosted our herd to 300 and also helped us to maintain our usual high quality.

A herd (covey? flock? bunch?) of rabbits, complete with cages, provided many hours of enjoyment for the boys, and added some variety to our agricultural spectrum.

Toss in some 30 good-looking horses, a mule or two, and some pigs and you have a ranch worthy of the title.

Our Donkey's In Show Biz







"The horse people can be counted on to make any fundraising project a success," said one of the spectators at the twoday meet. He added he felt the sponsors were motivated by their admiration for Sheriff Moreland, as much as they were by their desire to help the Ranch and Villa.

In any event, everyone seemed to benefit — Moreland through the compliments he received for his success as a compassionate, professional lawman; and our boys and girls through the funds raised.

WHAT'S A GIFT ANNUITY?

Several interested persons have inquired about the new gift annuity program with the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch Fund. The one statement we hear most often is, "We know about commercial annuities with insurance companies, but gift annuities are puzzling to us."

An annuity is a type of income insurance or protection. In commercial annuities, insurance companies, using statistics and actuarial tables, are able to guarantee income payments for the remainder of a person's life rather than pay death benefits to his heirs. Annuities are a very practical and sound way of assuring income in later years.

Also, the annuity concept is often better than simply investing capital and using the interest as a source of income because the total cost is lower. A commercial annuity is essentially an income paid to a person for a specified period, usually for the remainder of his or her life, in return for a stipulated premium paid, generally, in one lump sum. The payments received from this type of annuity are taxed as regular income.

Gift annuities differ from commercial annuities in two ways:

- 1. Part of the original investment or payment is a GIFT to a non-profit organization; in this case, the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch Fund. This qualifies the annuitant for special tax advantages; namely, a charitable tax deduction from income taxes and largely tax-free income payments for life. About 70% of the income is tax-free.
- 2. Because part of the payment is a GIFT, percentage rates and return income are reduced slightly from those of a commercial agreement. In this sense, a gift annuity isn't as lucrative, but, because a gift annuity is partly a gift to a worthy cause and partly an income provider, it satisfies both the desire to help and the need for a guaranteed life income.

There are four gift annuity plans designed to meet an individual's particular needs. Each agreement offers unique advantages and benefits:

SINGLE LIFE

A single life agreement pays for one life, and income rates are determined by the age of the beneficiary. A regular fixed income is paid for life and, as is the case with all gift annuity agreements, it is irrevocable.

JOINT AND SURVIVORSHIP

This gift annuity covers two lives simultaneously. This is the plan most often taken by husband and wife. Any two persons may enter this agreement and they need not be related. Income rates are determined by the ages of the two people involved.

SURVIVORSHIP

This plan pays for two lives in sequence rather than simultaneously. Income is paid to the donor for the rest of his or her life and a second person is named to receive the income for the remainder of his or her life. Income rates are determined by the ages of those involved.

ANNUITY THROUGH YOUR WILL

A sum of money or assets are specified in a person's will to be used for the purchase of a gift annuity for a relative, a friend or anyone the person desires; income rate is determined by the age of the beneficiary.

Another question frequently asked is if the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch Fund is solid enough to guarantee life income payments. By law, the Boys Ranch Fund is required to operate an independent fund or account to maintain the gift annuity program. This account is administered by professional managers with a leading banking institution and annuity payments are guaranteed not only by the fund established for that purpose, but also by the total assets of the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch Fund. Periodic reports are filed with the State Insurance Commissioner's Office to assure its ability to fulfill every obligation that is made.

If you feel it is wise to plan carefully for the future and your plans include a gift to a worthy cause and you desire supplemental income for life, then it may be to your advantage to consider a gift annuity with the Boys Ranch Fund.

Good way to go — if you like snake meat — Twelve Ranchers and two adult leaders traveled more than 100 miles down the Suwannee River on a wilderness survival canoe trip. Carrying no food, each crew member was allowed to take a knife, a canteen, one blanket, one fish hook and a length of fishing line. The daily menu consisted of whatever the river and the surrounding wilderness yielded — on one occasion a snake that was cooked and gingerly eaten. Torrential rains prevented the canoeists from reaching the Gulf of Mexico, but they went twice as far as a similar group traveled last year.





Seeing it is believing it — There's a saying that you really can't appreciate the Boys Ranch unless you've been there, and Lee County Sheriff Frank Wanicka discovered it's true. He was an active supporter of the Ranch before he visited it, but, afterward, his enthusiasm reached new heights. After staying overnight and getting to know some of the boys, he fumbled around for adequate adjectives and finally said lamely, "Well, it's just great." New remedial ed program started

Although preliminary work is just getting under way on the Boys Ranch Education Center building, we already have 18 boys enrolled in a new remedial education program which will eventually be housed in the new facility.

Using the Ranch library as a temporary classroom, the program employs two full-time teachers and utilizes part-time teaching skills of other staff members.

Initial emphasis is on reading and basic academic skills, but the students will also receive instruction in arts and crafts, vocational familiarization and physical education.

Ranchers have been attending the public schools in nearby Live Oak ever since the Ranch opened for business in 1959, but there are some boys whose basic academic skills are so far below average that they cannot function successfully in the public school system. These are the boys the new program is designed to help. Usually they are at the eighth grade level or under.

Late afternoon reading classes for high school level boys, and a special tutoring program in reading and mathematics are also part of the educational spectrum.


YOUTH FUND










Progress On The Waterfront
