


Proverb Purloined: From King Solomon We Filched Our Formula for Raising Boys

King Solomon said it some 24 centuries ago. The Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch adopted it as a formula for raising boys some 24 years ago.

And, recently, the Rev. Art Carter lifted it out of the 22nd Chapter of the Book of Proverbs to sum up what he is trying to accomplish in his unique ministry as Boys Ranch Chaplain. "Raise up a child in the proper way," he paraphrased, "and later in life he will not depart from it."

That's a piece of bedrock prose in the Boys Ranch philosophy, and Carter labors many more than his required 40 hours a week trying to put it into practice. In the business of raising boys, he's part of a team that includes social workers, unit directors, the learning center staff, group parents and other assorted adults, but he's the one who is primarily responsible for adding a spiritual dimension to the process. He does it in a number of ways: through counseling, through worship, through teaching, and through general pastoral duties such as hospital visits. He is also available for baptisms, weddings, funerals and staff counseling.

When a new boy arrives at the Ranch, the chaplain is

usually one of the first people he meets. Carter gives him a Bible, suggests some New Testament readings, inquires about his spiritual background and explains that Sunday church attendance, in the Ranch Chapel or in Live Oak churches, is compulsory for all boys and on-duty staff

members. "Some boys come here very used to going to church," Carter explained. "They've been in churches. They've seen churches. They know what it's all about, but we also have boys who come here and say they've never been in church."

Attending Sunday church services in the Ranch Chapel is a comfortable experience for Ranchers because the worship is conducted by boys, for boys. Carter delivers the weekly sermon, which is pitched on an elementary level, but boys do everything else. They light the candles, read the Scriptures, take up the offering, lead the hymn singing, present vocal and instrumental solos, and occasionally deliver short talks.

Easter is celebrated with a sumrise service on the banks of the Suwannee River for early risers, plus a later service in the chapel. The annual Christmas service features an enactment of the nativity scene with boys playing various roles. Other special services held annually include one that coincides with the Alumni Reunion and features former Ranchers as speakers; and one that is held outdoors in the arena during the Boys Ranch anniversary celebration. This latter service is strictly unconventional because many of the worshippers attend on horseback.

Carter's congregation, which averages about 96 boys and some 35 staff members, is unique because the members of the flock and their minister live and work in close proximity in an isolated setting. Counseling opportunities abound.

"My counseling is done primarily from a spiritual standpoint," Carter explains. "I usually don't get too much into psychological areas, and therapeutic areas and that kind of thing. That's more for the social workers. Mine is more like: 'Where are you spiritually? What do you think abut God? Do you have a Bible? Do you know what to read, how to read it?'

"If a boy has a specific problem and he wants to talk about it, then I have skills that I can use to sometimes help him solve his problem. Often boys will tell a chaplain something they would not tell anybody else. That's not always true, but it depends on relationships and a lot of other things.

"Some boys have doubts about God. They're not sure whether God really exists or not."

What are the boys' thoughts about sin?, Carter was asked.

"Oh, yes, sin. They'll come to me and say, 'Man, I've got a habit in my life, or whatever, that I just can't do anything about. It dominates me. I want to do right, but I can't.' That is very typical."

Carter, a native of Jacksonville with a Masters Degree in Theology, came to the Boys Ranch as chaplain in 1979 after spending 14 years as minister or associate minister in various Baptist churches in Florida and Mississippi.

His early ambition was to be a social worker, but, while attending Florida State University, he became active in youth work at Tallahassee's First Baptist Church and felt called to enter the ministry. He may have found the best of both worlds in his present job.

He doesn't count or try to limit his hours of work. "It's supposed to be 40 hours a week," he said, "but that's a rarity. You go when you're needed. If somebody's sick at ten o'clock at night, that's when you go. It doesn't matter. That's just that. Somebody calls you on the phone and says, 'We've got a particular problem. Couldn't you talk to him?'...or whatever, then you go. I do, and most ministers do. That's just the way it is."

President's Perspective

A message from Harry K. Weaver, President of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund



It makes us feel good when we find a new way to reach more youngsters, and there is a lot of gratification in having a new project work well the first time you try it.

This summer, the Boys Ranch hosted a camping program, in two sessions of one week each. The first session was held July 19-25, and the second was held August 2-8.

The camping program was designed for boys who met the eligibility criteria for Youth Fund services, but the initial two sessions were limited to younsters between the ages of 10 and 14. Boys attending the summer camp were those for whom Requests for Services had been received and who were already receiving counseling and other services from Youth Fund social workers before the camping program began. Many of these youngsters may eventually be admitted into residential care. For some, the camping experience may help to make residential care unnecessary. In any case, this week at the Boys Ranch gave them a chance to look us over and vice versa.

Mutual observation was not the only benefit. The camping program had a law enforcement theme. It was designed by a committee of sheriffs, appointed by the Youth Fund Board of Directors, in cooperation with members of the Youth Fund staff. The camp counselors were deputy sheriffs. The assistant counselors were young people who are junior deputies or members of law enforcement explorer scout groups. During the first session, the sheriff who provided the counselors and assistant counselors was, himself, very much involved — visiting the campers and bringing demonstrations of a S.W.A.T. Team, trained dogs, and other techniques of law enforcement.

The kids "ate it up," and they also found many qualities to admire among the deputy sheriffs who were their constant companions throughout the camping experience. We feel that many of these youngsters, who may have grown up with a distrust and dislike of both the law



BOYS RANCH IS ...

A residential group child care program for dependent, neglected, or homeless boys between the ages of eight and eighteen. It is not an institution for juvenile delinquents. The Boys Ranch is sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association and operated by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund. It was founded in 1957 and currently has approximately 100 boys in residence at any given time. The Boys Ranch is located in North Florida, about halfway between Jacksonville and Tallahassee and nine miles north of the town of Live Oak on County Road 795.

THE FLORIDA SHERIFFS YOUTH FUND IS . . .

A charitable, non-profit corporation, sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, to manage and operate the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, Youth Ranch, and any other Youth programs that might later be developed by the Florida Sheriffs Association. An important function of the Youth Fund is the raising, receiving, budgeting, and disbursing of funds for its programs. The Youth Fund and its programs are supported almost entirely by voluntary gifts. Gifts and bequests can be made to the Youth Fund for the exclusive benefit of any single program, such as the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, or Youth Ranch, or they may be made without restriction, to be distributed among existing programs as most needed or to be used for the development of new programs at the discretion of the Governing Board. Youth Fund Central Offices are co-located with the Boys Ranch.

GIRLS VILLA IS...

A similar program for girls located two miles east of Bartow, Florida, on Route 60. Originally conceived by the Sunshine State Women's Chamber of Commerce of Madeira Beach, Florida, the Girls Villa was adopted as a project of the Florida Sheriffs Association in 1970. The first buildings were completed and the first girls admitted in 1972. There are approximately 24 girls in residence at any given time. Mailing address and telephone number for the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, and Youth Ranch are the same as for the Youth Fund.

YOUTH RANCH IS . . .

The most recently developed residential group child care program of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund. Also sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, it was founded in 1976 and opened in 1978. It is located just east of the intersection of the McMullen-Booth Road and County Road 102 near Clearwater, Florida. The Youth Ranch has approximately 20 boys and girls in residence at any given time. It provides care in a homelike environment for brothers and sisters who are dependent, neglected, or homeless. Mailing address and telephone number are the same as for the Youth Fund. and the lawman, were getting a fresh point of view through their summer camp relationships with representatives of law and order. If we did no more than alter the attitudes of just a few, the potential benefit is great for the youngster and for society.

We should not overlook the fact that the counselors were also learning from the boys. Having had the opportunity to talk with these youngsters in a relaxed setting, the deputy sheriffs returned to their regular duties with a heightened understanding of today's young people and why they think and act as they do.

This pilot summer camping program was a test program to determine if it is feasible to operate a summer camp at the same location as a residential group child care program such as the Boys Ranch. If so, we are also interested in determining how many campers we can handle in any one session and how many sessions we can have in any one summer season without adversely affecting the Boys Ranch residential programs. The initial two sessions were set up to accommodate 42 boys — 21 in each session.

It well may be that the location of the camping program, the criteria for selection of campers, or both may change in future years based upon the experience we have gained in this pilot program. We are reasonably certain, however, that we have seen the beginning of a very worthwhile new program that will enable the Youth Fund to touch the lives of many more troubled youngsters.



Youth Ranch Fund Drive Continuing; Building of New Facilities Assured

CLEARWATER — Contributions are still coming in and the Pinellas County drive to raise \$1 million for new facilities at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch is continuing, but the outcome is no longer in doubt.

After the campaign total topped \$250,000 at the end of July, Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund President Harry Weaver declared that the new facilities will definitely be built. He said he was confident the necessary funds would be obtained and construction would begin before the end of 1981.

The proposed new facilities include an activity center and a residence cottage — the third on the Youth Ranch campus. The activity center will be named in honor of Don Genung, Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund Vice President for Planned Giving and also a former Pinellas County Sheriff. It will house a learning facility for remedial education, a chapel, library, large activity room, a kitchen and an arts and crafts shop.

In the fund raising campaign headed by William H. Vickers, of Clearwater, the largest contribution as of the end of July was a gift of \$60,000 from the Order of Rainbow for Girls, an adjunct of the Eastern Star. It will be earmarked to construct the ativity center chapel, which will be named in honor of Mrs. Leta MacMinn, former Supreme Inspector of the Rainbow Order.

The largest individual contribution as of the end of July was a gift of \$55,000 from Miss Nancy Pilcher, of Clearwater, a long time Youth Ranch benefactor.


REACHING OUT! Boys Ranch Hosts Campers In Unique Summer Program
