President's Perspective

A message from Harry K. Weaver, President of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund



By the time you read this, our Youth Fund boys and girls will have begun a new school year with all of the challenges, trials, good times and opportunities for personal growth that go with it.

Perhaps we are just riding high from last year's successes, but we, as staff, are really looking forward to another school year and the opportunities we will have to get involved, to be supportive, and to be just a part of this very important period in the lives of our young people.

Last year, one of our boys received an associate degree in Computer Science from the junior college. We had seven high school graduates from the Boys Ranch, one from the Youth Ranch, and three from the Girls Villa, for a total of eleven. Nine of our Boys Ranchers completed courses and received certificates of completion from the local Vocational-Technical School. The courses were in marketable skills such as automotive repair, auto-body repair, horticulture, farm management, and agricultural mechanics.

We are elated about our Youth Fund educational program at this point. Perhaps, we just had a good year, but we choose to believe that we have reached a plateau in the education of the young people we serve where we have the means to give them the help they need to overcome the handicaps of bad beginnings.

It hasn't been a solo effort by any means. Most of our boys and girls attend the public schools in our host communities. The administration and teachers in these public schools have "gone the extra mile," many times over, to be helpful and cooperative in the education of our young people.

Our Learning Centers, on each Youth Fund campus, provide a place for catching up and learning good study habits for those boys and girls who, due to previous circumstances of life, have fallen too far behind, academically, to function effectively in a public school system. The Learning Centers are also well equipped and staffed for vocational evaluation, testing, and counseling and work closely with local Vocational-Technical School facilities.

In giving credit where it is due, let us not overlook the efforts of our cottage parents and other staff who, on a one-to-one basis, keep the youngsters on course when the going gets tough. Praising, scolding, getting them to the school bus on time, helping with the homework or whatever it takes, these dedicated people provide love, one of life's most critical ingredients.

Now that a plateau has been reached in our educational program and we know that we have the basic framework from which to assure our boys and girls a quality education, we might take a break...It's been a long, hard climb...but we won't. We always like to see if we can do things a little better.

I will close by saying a very big thank you to all of you who have, through your kindness and generosity, always helped us to do things a little better and to make the lives of a lot of boys and girls a whole lot better.

THE FLORIDA SHERIFFS YOUTH FUND IS . . .



A charitable, non-profit corporation, sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, to manage and operate the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, Youth Ranch, Youth Camp, and any other Youth programs that might later be developed by the Florida Sheriffs Association. An important function of the Youth Fund is the raising, receiving, budgeting, and disbursing of funds for its programs. The Youth Fund and its programs are supported almost entirely by voluntary gifts. Gifts and beguests can be made to the Youth Fund for the exclusive benefit of any single program, such as the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, Youth Ranch, or Youth Camp, or they may be made without restriction, to be distributed among existing programs as most needed or to be used for the development of new programs at the discretion of the Governing Board. Youth Fund Central Offices are co-located with the Boys Ranch.

BOYS RANCH IS...

A residential group child care program for dependent, neglected, or homeless boys between the ages of eight and eighteen. It is not an institution for juvenile delinquents. The Boys Ranch is sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association and operated by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund. It was founded in 1957 and currently has approximately 108 boys in residence at any given time. The Boys Ranch is located in North Florida, about halfway between Jacksonville and Tallahassee and nine miles north of the town of Live Oak on County Road 795.

YOUTH RANCH IS...

The most recently developed residential group child care program of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund. Also sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, it was founded in 1976 and opened in 1978. It is located just east of the intersection of the McMullen-Booth Road and County Road 102 near Clearwater, Florida. The Youth Ranch has approximately 30 boys and girls in residence at any given time. It provides care in a homelike environment for brothers and sisters who are dependent, neglected, or homeless. Mailing address and telephone number are the same as for the Youth Fund.

GIRLS VILLA IS...

A similar program for girls located two miles east of Bartow, Florida, on Route 60. Originally conceived by the Sunshine State Women's Chamber of Commerce of Madeira Beach, Florida, the Girls Villa was adopted as a project of the Florida Sheriffs Association in 1970. The first buildings were completed and the first girls admitted in 1972. There are approximately 50 girls in residence at any given time. Mailing address and telephone number for the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, and Youth Ranch are the same as for the Youth Fund.

YOUTH CAMP IS ...

A Youth Fund operated camping facility which incorporates a summer program and a year-around wilderness program for boys and girls. The 154-acre campsite is located one mile northeast of Barberville. Campers are normally selected from among boys and girls who have had Requests for Service submitted to the Youth Fund on their behalf. Many of these youngsters are already on the waiting list for admission to Youth Fund residential facilities. The camping program was initiated in 1981 and acquired its present location in late 1982. Please contact the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund for further information.

Before they go:

We teach girls how to make it on their own

Debra Dickler and Cindy Landry have graduated from high school with honors, and now they are leaving the Girls Villa to go out on their own.

This is a big step — one that is booby-trapped with many pitfalls — and naturally we will worry about them, but not as much as we have worried about some of the previous Villa graduates.

Debra, who is 19, and Cindy, who is 17, are better prepared than their predecessors because they are making their exit through our new Independent Living Program.

All summer they lived in a small cottage apart from the other girls, and we handed them big helpings of freedom. They were almost on their own — free enough to find out what it's like to live on a strict budget and settle their own squabbles — but staff members were always in the background ready to help them over rough spots, if needed.

And the girls admit there were some rough spots. Living on a food budget that allowed \$2.75 per person per day was not easy. "One of our big mistakes," said Debra "was when we went grocery shopping without a calculator and ran up a bill of \$70 when we only had \$40 left in our food budget."

They had to make up the shortage with cash received as graduation gifts, and later on, when the lesson had sunk in real good, the Villa reimbursed them.

After that they began checking the food ads carefully for bargains, saving redeemable grocery store coupons, using their calculator religiously, making a list before going shopping, and taking advantage of double coupon days at the supermarket.

Thrift gave them a lift, and also allowed them to have steak about once a month.

"Now our biggest thrill is reading the Sunday paper looking for sales of things like towels, linens, food and furniture," said Cindy.

Both girls were working during the summer, but Debra's job was only part-time, and there were some arguments about how to divide the household chores. Finally it was agreed that Debra would cook on weekdays and Cindy on weekends.

"Now when she cooks, I just automatically clean up," said Cindy.

Little things like setting the air conditioning ther-

mostat created friction. When Debra's friends discovered that she could receive phone calls at any hour of the day or night, they started calling her around midnight and 1 a.m. This disturbed Cindy.

It soon became obvious that the girls were going to have to agree on some rules of their own. They did, and harmony prevailed.

Suggestions they picked up in Marriage Preparation class also helped the girls to get along. "We learned to be constructive arguers," said Cindy.

"Yes," said Debra," and we usually ended argu-

ments by saying: 'You want a divorce?' And then we would both break up laughing."

The girls found that freedom was fun when it gave them special privileges like staying out until midnight on dates; going to the 9:30 p.m. movie instead of the 7:30; making phone calls without worrying about a time limit; enjoying more privacy; sitting in the living room with a soft drink; and using the Villa "convenience car" for shopping errands and other trips.

But, they also discovered that they had to earn their freedom by making mature decisions, holding a job, doing more household chores than usual, obeying rules, balancing a checkbook, and living within a tight budget.

Debra and Cindy were partially supported by the Villa while they were in Independent Living, but it was not a free ride by any means. They were required to pay ten cents a mile for the use of the convenience car, and pay for long distance phone calls. A portion of the money they earned had to go into a savings account, and they also had to use their own funds for personal items. If they failed to conserve electricity and their utility bill was a lot higher than usual, they had to pay a portion of it.

The girls have learned many valuable lessons during just a few months in the Independent Living Program — lessons that will benefit Debra in her proposed secretarial career, and Cindy in her plans to pursue an engineering career.



Above all else, the girls discovered that freedom has a price tag — that it can only be enjoyed if it is used properly — and now they seem to be ready to apply this discovery out there in the real world.

We think they can do it, and Cindy thinks so too. She feels that she and Debra will be strongly influenced in the future by the respect and affection they hold for the people on the Villa staff who have been their friends.


"What used to kill me the most about being disciplined," said Cindy, "was having to face the people I cared about. And, even now, I am not likely to do something wrong because it would hurt me if they found out."



WISHING WORKS!

But We Were Pushing Our Luck When We Wished for a Bulldozer

Yes, wishing works!

Many times we have wished for something urgently needed at the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, Youth Ranch or Youth Camp, and — presto — almost like magic — we have gotten it.

In fact, our wishing has worked so well that we have organized it.

Each month we make up a list of things we need and distribute it to Youth Fund department heads, Regional Directors and Vice Presidents for Planned Giving.

Officially it's our "Project List." Unofficially we call it our "wish list," and it's a handy thing to have around.

If a prospective donor asks us what we need, we simply consult the list and suggest a whole string of choices.

A recent list included movie projectors, ceramic molds for arts and crafts classes, musical instruments, riding mowers, lamps, cassette players, tables, chairs, books, a public address system, weight lifting equipment, cars, trucks, a fire alarm system, burglar alarms, office equipment, woodworking tools, a pottery wheel, welding equipment, and on and on...The variety is amazing, and so is the response we get from generous donors. They give us many of the things we "wish" for. At times it seems that their benevolence is unlimited.

However, many months ago, when we put a bull-dozer on our "wish list" we wondered if we were pushing our luck too far. It certainly seemed that we were, because the bulldozer stayed on the list month after month. Then, just when we were about to take it off the list, something happened to restore our faith.

Early in 1983 Youth Fund officials were attending a meeting at the Plantation Golf Resort, in Crystal River, to help with plans for a fund raising golf tournament. Citrus County Sheriff Charles Dean was there. So was W.W. Caruth, Jr., the owner of the resort and a loyal supporter of the Youth Fund.

During lunch — just like magic — Caruth casually mentioned that he had a 1940 model D6 Caterpillar bulldozer. He said he had been wondering if the Boys

Ranch could use it.

Youth Fund President Harry Weaver told him right off that the Boys Ranch certainly could — that, in fact, a bulldozer had been the biggest thing on the Boys Ranch "wish list" for many months.

Caruth said in that case he would give it to the Boys Ranch.

Then Sheriff Dean suggested that, considering the age of the bulldozer, it would be a good idea to take it to the Withlacoochee Vocational-Technical School and let the students completely overhaul it before sending it to the Ranch.

This scenario was agreed upon, and the Vo-Tech students spent most of the 1983-84 school year rebuilding the bulldozer from the ground up. Many of the parts were replaced, and several features were added to modernize it — including a cab to protect

GREAT MEMORIES!

Our Youth Camp Provided Them For Hundreds of Deserving Kids

The summer is just about gone, but great memories live on for hundreds of boys and girls from all over Florida who attended the 1984 summer camping sessions at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp.

They participated in a wide range of activities such as swimming, boating, canoeing, games, sports, horseback riding, treasure hunts, water carnivals, hiking, arts and crafts, nature study, archery, fishing, rifle marksmanship, skits, sing-alongs and a camper awards night.

As a special treat, various Sheriffs' Departments provided demonstrations of helicopters, trained dogs, rescue teams, SWAT teams, scuba divers and batmobiles.

The majority of the counselors were college students, but deputy sheriffs also volunteered for counseling duty to lend credence to the camp slogan: "Law Officers Are Your Friends." In day-to-day contacts, campers had an opportunity to discover that people who wear badges can be caring, friendly and helpful.

Because the camp is operated for the benefit of neglected, unsupervised and troubled youngsters, many of whom cannot afford camp fees, there is no charge. However, campers were required to have a physical examination, provide their own transportation to and from camp, and bring \$10 for spending money.

The camp, which is one of four child care programs operated by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund, offered five ten-day sessions during the summer and enrolled approximately 450 boys and girls.

Ken Edgar, the Youth Camp Director, said the 1984 summer program was the best yet because of a more experienced staff and improved facilities. This year, for the first time, the staff included experienced employees from the Wilderness Camp that is being developed in tandem with summer camping. Also on the staff were college interns who were preparing to go into child care work and related fields.

The after dinner program of skits, puppet shows, group singing and similar activities was greatly improved, Edgar said, because staff members were endowed with a greater than usual amount of talent and creativity.

This year every camper was required to contribute

one hour a day to a work program that included a variety of chores such as painting buildings, cutting grass, chopping firewood, and trimming trees.

Edgar said he was surprised at the enthusiasm generated by the work program. He attributed this to the attitude of the program leader who loved to work and took pride in his accomplishments. Apparently his "work is rewarding" philosophy rubbed off on the kids.

More than usual emphasis was put on problem solving during the 1984 sessions, particularly through the use of "Life Skills" discussions that focused on getting along with other people, maintaining good health, building character, and similar subjects.

This is the fourth year that the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund has been operating a camping program. It began on a modest basis in 1981 when some tents were pitched at the Boys Ranch, and some Youth Fund and Boys Ranch employees were diverted from their regular duties to head up a temporary staff. Deputy sheriffs, junior deputies and law enforcement explorers were recruited as counselors.

In 1982 the camping program was expanded to accomodate 256 boys and girls. It utilized Boy Scout and Girl Scout facilities, and a small itinerant staff headed by an experienced camping director moved from campsite to campsite to supervise volunteer

volunteer counselor, gave instructions in marksmanship and firearms safety.

counselors.

Near the end of 1982 the Youth Fund purchased Camp Ticochee, a Girl Scout reservation, and immediately changed the name to Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp.

Since the camp had not been in use for a while, considerable work had to be done to get the facilities ready for the 1983 summer camping session. Work on improvements was continued between the summer of 1983 and the summer of 1984, and, as a result, everything was in much better shape for this year's sessions.

Located at Barberville, approximately 15 miles north of Deland, the Youth Camp occupies 154 acres of wooded property. It has a full range of camping facilities, including a large swimming pool and a small lake.

It was held at the Boys Ranch May 19 and 20, and, since the program did not include the usual banquet and business meeting, there was plenty of time for fun in the sun.


Alumni members joined with current Boys Ranch residents and staff members for a variety of activities that included swimming, horseback riding, a hayride, games and contests.
