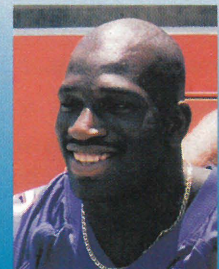

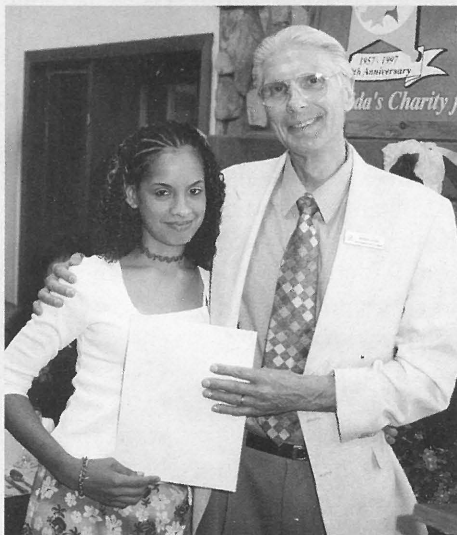

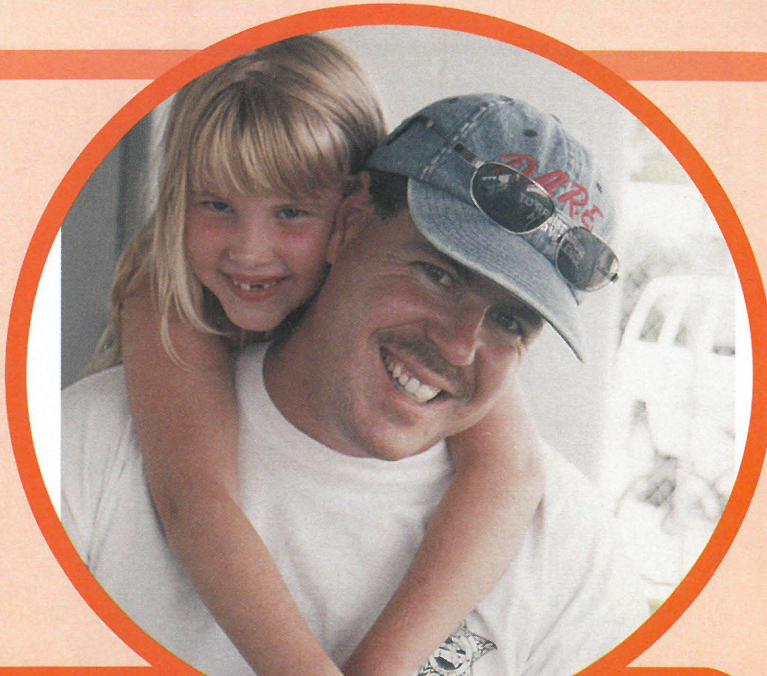

They have been there since the beginning. For nearly 20 years, volunteer Deputies have assisted the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches Summer Camping Programs without fail. Some even use personal vacation days for the opportunity to attend summer camp each year. Their loyalty and dedication provide guidance to deserving youngsters from around the state. To so many troubled and lonely kids, Deputies are now their friends; to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, they have become —



Faithful Friends

So many of the boys and girls who attend the Youth Ranches Summer Camping Programs each year have misconceptions, even fears, about the men and women behind the Sheriff's badge. It takes personal interaction with volunteer Deputies to change negative perceptions they have developed from others in their school or their community. It takes time for youngsters to learn a law enforcement officer's main desire is to serve and protect them as well as their family and friends.

"Before these kids came to camp, the only contact I had with them was when they were in trouble. Now they see me as a real person...they come up to me, give me a hug or shake my hand and tell me what a wonderful time they had at camp," said Gilchrist County Deputy Sheriff C.J. Schauble.

Along with the routine recreational activities at summer camp, time is scheduled for special law enforcement educational classes and instruction. Because of past misconceptions, Deputies use these classes to share experience and advice, in an attempt to establish healthy relationships with youth. During the course of a typical one week session, boys and girls experience how to communicate and cooperate with each other as well as with law enforcement. They learn quickly how to be a part of a group, working and playing in an environment that promotes teamwork and respect.

Pasco County Corporal Stimac adds, "On the high ropes course, we really bond with the kids. Every day you see the kids getting along better with us, the counselors and each other. The camp helps them learn about trust and teamwork."

Consistency, routine and structure are important fac-

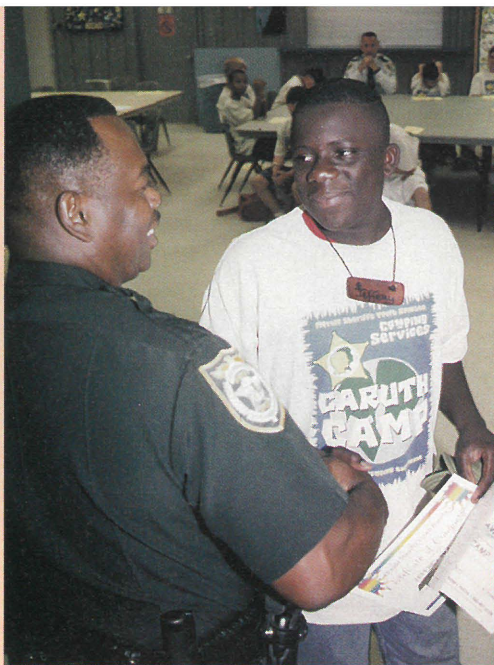


Youngsters at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp learn that a law enforcement officer's main desire is to protect and serve them.

tors in the continued development of at-risk youth. Daily schedules help provide stability while the return of experienced law enforcement officers help provide a healthy balance of positive role models. Many of the kids who attend camp have never had the pleasure of sitting down to eat a wholesome meal around a table of friendly faces. For them, summer camp is not just about dodge ball or horseback riding.

"The camp enables them to do things they would not be able to do. I've even been helping a few kids learn to ride a bike," said Corporal Staklinski of Pasco County.

Whether it's the Youth Camp, Caruth Camp or one of many mobile camping stops around the state, camp activities

are designed to help youth overcome fears, build self-esteem, and improve self-confidence. By playing games and working together to solve problems, at-risk kids can begin to enjoy the benefits of teamwork and comradery.

Occasionally, troubled and neglected youth may exclude themselves from camp activities. When a Deputy sees a youngster sitting alone or disrupting a group activity, their job becomes trying to make the boy or girl feel welcome or comfortable; communicating with these children is key to helping them overcome fears and apprehensions. Deputies know each child adjusts differently to his/her environment. That's why camp allows kids to play at their own speed and make choices that are comfortable to them.

First Class Deputy Johny Jones from Manatee County boasts, "We really try to enjoy ourselves at camp. I look forward to seeing some of these same kids back in our county. Hopefully the experience has been very positive for them. Our goal is to help them learn and grow so they can become responsible and respectful citizens."

Each and every summer, for nearly 20 years, Deputies have devoted their time and energy to helping boys and girls at camp. Their compassion, experience and training have helped campers overcome fears and build self-esteem. Without their wisdom and guidance, at-risk campers would lose the valuable relationships with the men and women of the Sheriff's Star. Their loyalty to summer camp is without question. Florida's Deputies will always be there to help children in need. They always have been and they always will be our faithful friends.

What's in a Name?

The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches mobile camping program has gone through a name change but still offers the same therapeutic camping experience boys and girls around the state.

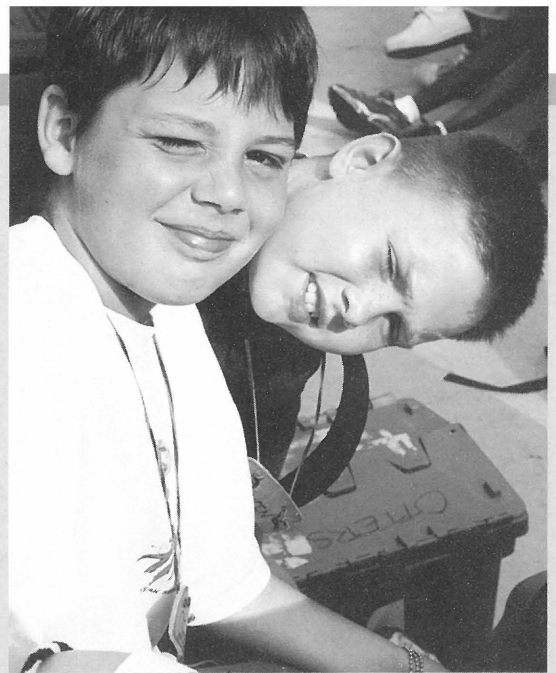
"We're always looking for new and unique ways to help more kids," said Youth Ranches President Roger Bouchard. "The name may have changed, but nothing else has."

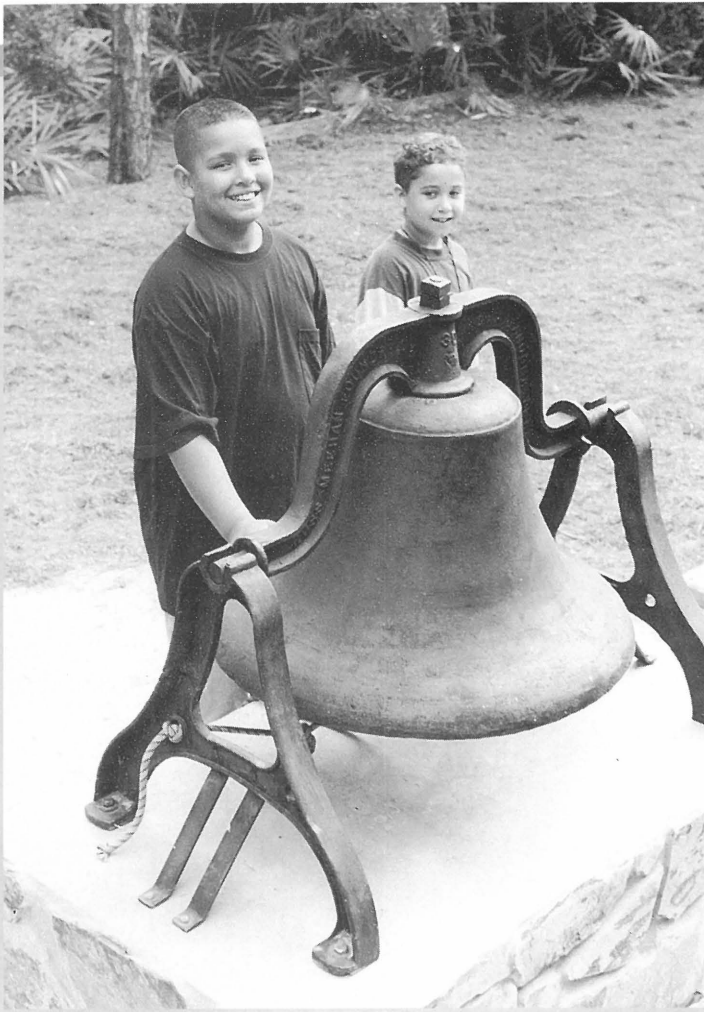
Established as a way to bring the camping experience to even more boys and girls, "Harmony in the Streets" consists of a mobile camping unit, which, all summer long, travels into community centers and local schools to give underprivileged boys and girls the opportunity to experience a week of summer day camp. With help from local Sheriff's Offices and staff from Youth Ranches camp locations in Barberville and Inglis, these makeshift campsites provide needy youth with many of the same therapeutic camping activities as our permanent programs.

Harmony in the Streets provides disadvantaged kids the opportunity to enjoy summertime games as well as team-building activities like arts and crafts, basketball, swimming and environmental education. Even some highlights of the Youth Ranches Challenge Course can be re-created in temporary locations. These proven activities help at-risk boys and girls build self-esteem and self-confidence. But, more importantly, camping provides underprivileged youth the chance to learn and use teamwork; promoting "harmony" is key to providing safe and healthy communities.

Originally slated in only a handful of counties, "Harmony in the Streets" has been growing fast. This year, three mobile camping units will be traveling the state to visit locations in almost 10 different counties.

With the generous support of local communities, the Youth Ranches plans to continue to prevent juvenile delinquency by expanding this outreach program and by providing wholesome recreational activities to Florida's unsupervised, needy children.

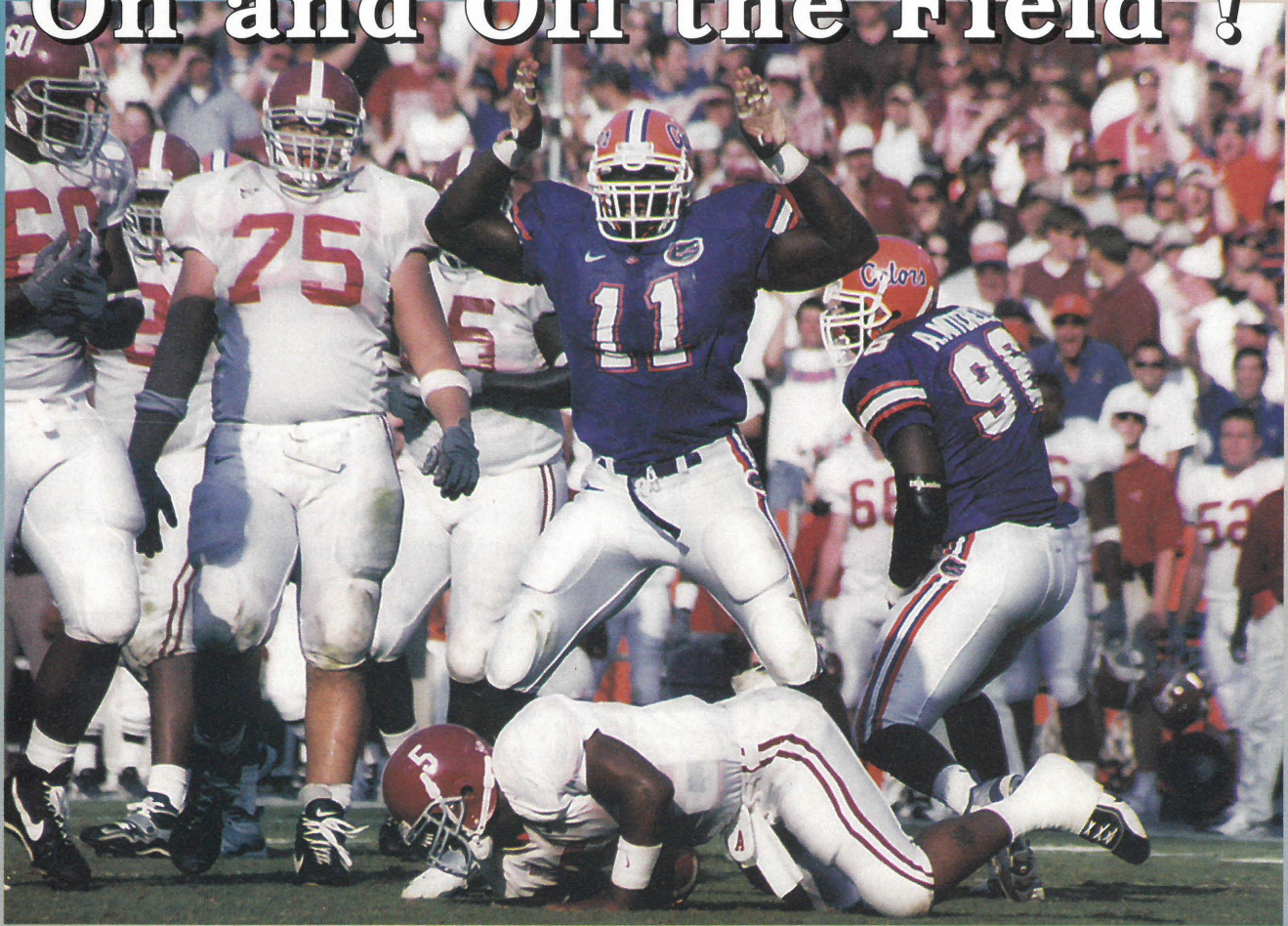

Thaddeus' Success On and Off the Field !



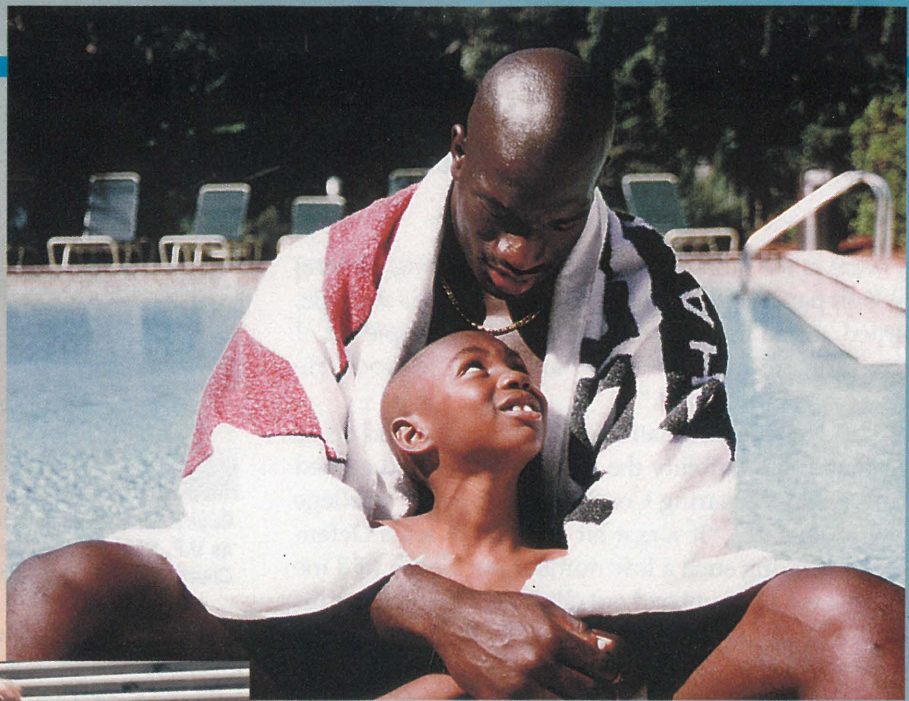

Yes, he is an alumnus of the University of Florida, playing his last year of eligibility as a graduate student and focusing on his plans for the future.

"I would love to play football in the NFL," boasts the former high school All-American. "But, if that doesn't work out, I have plenty of options to choose from." Understated by no means, Bullard has worked hard to ensure his success, no matter what his chosen path turns out to be.

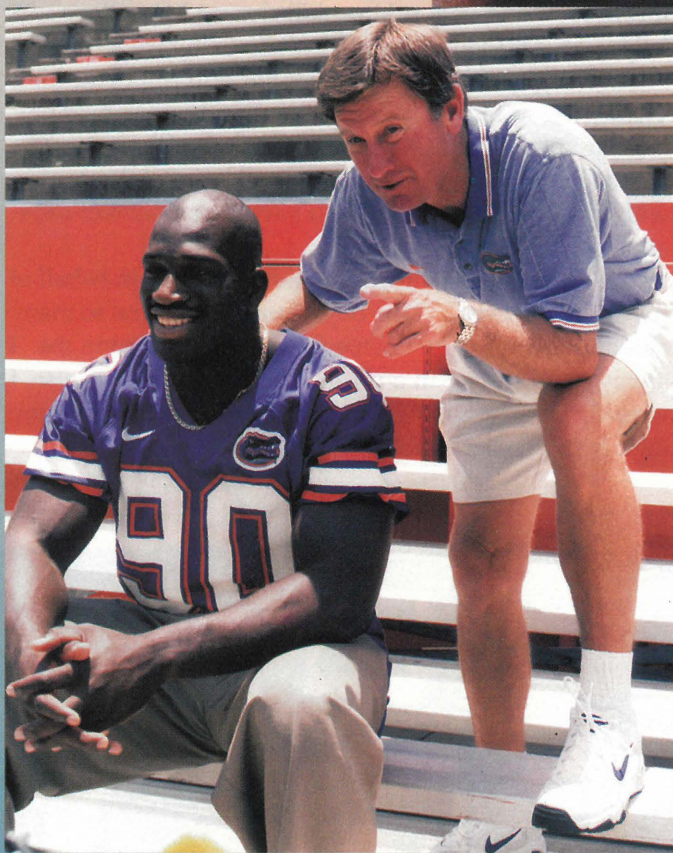
Several years ago, Bullard's future wasn't so bright. He was a belligerent, super-sized teen who used fights and force to get his way. Without respect for authority or the desire to pursue his education, he was well on his way to a life of delinquency and crime. Then, in the summer between 8th and 9th grade, this angry young man took a sharp turn to the "right" and forever changed his life.

As Thaddeus walked into the Boys Ranch Cafetorium on his first day at on campus, all eyes turned to meet this 6'1" 190 lb 13 year old. "Wow" remarked one smaller Rancher, eyes looking up in awe. "Can I be on his team?"

And so began Thaddeus' new life, filled with the

emerging responsibility as a positive role model and talented leader for youngsters in need. "I want to take the gifts God has given me and use them to help other people," said Bullard. "At the Ranch, I learned how powerful you can be, especially as a positive influence on the lives of others."

Growing up with Thaddeus at the Boys Ranch was almost like having a celebrity on campus. Every boy felt the excitement as the rumor turned into reality . . . ESPN is coming here – to the Boys Ranch! They want to interview Thaddeus! "Hey Thad? Wanna play ball? Maybe they can get a shot of you and me playin' ball...Hey Thad? How 'bout it? Here...toss me the ball!" And Thaddeus just smiles, "O.K. sport! Let's throw a few, but when the camera crew gets here, I've got to go inside and follow their lead."

Knowing when to follow and when to lead has made Thaddeus a great team player. In his freshman year at UF, just before the season began, the NCAA declared him ineligible to play ball due to typographical error in his high school transcript. While most would have become discouraged and cried foul, Thaddeus set the record straight. He worked two jobs, took 18 hours of classes, paid for his own apartment, and successfully improved his score on the ACT to verify and regain his eligibility.

Perhaps the toughest part of this setback was watching his team (the team he should have been on) win the National Championship that year. Bullard recalled, "While

they were at the Sugar Bowl, I was still working proving myself on paper to the NCAA. But through this struggle, I learned 'tough times never last, but tough people do.' I give all the credit for where I am today to God. He helped me get through it."

Thaddeus' determination and hard work paid off as he regained his eligibility the following year and earned the privilege of wearing Coach Steve Spurrier's college jersey number 11. "It was a bit unusual to see a Defensive End wearing such a low number but Coach told me if I passed the 18 hours and got eligible...I could wear his jersey. I learned you can earn respect by how you handle adversity and challenges both on and off the field."

In addition to the glamour as a collegiate football player, Thaddeus has excelled in many other areas. He has consistently maintained a "B" average, joined a campus fraternity, welcomed new students as a "Goodwill Gator" and was inducted into Florida Blue Key, a prestigious honor society.

Most recently, Thaddeus was elected Vice President of the University of Florida Student Government Association. He will be representing over 42,000 peers and is very excited about this unique opportunity. "I believe I can and will make an impact on these students. Our goal is to bring the diverse individuals on our campus together. We want to understand and appreciate the specific talents, strengths and differences each person has to

And Thaddeus is always willing to speak on behalf of the Youth Ranches. "The Boys Ranch taught me so many valuable lessons. They helped bring out the best in me. I always said if I get in a position to help someone else, I would. This is what I want to do with the rest of my life...help people, especially kids."

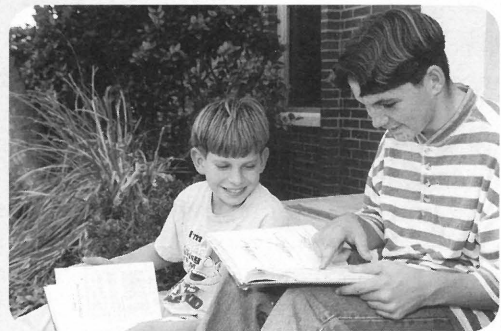
Our supporters know the Youth Ranches is meeting a very real and important need for many of today's youth. They have recognized how they can

So today, as he prepared to honor her memory and cut the ribbon on the newly constructed Hilda Flink Cottage, he would finally be able to give her the public applause she deserved. Ben would be sure to tell others about her huge, loving spirit that touched and helped so many people throughout her lifetime. Yes, today is indeed, a very special day!



A Life Well Spent

In today's culture, some tend to measure a man's wealth by the number of his possessions. But, Frank McCune measured his differently. Mr. McCune's success was evident by his commitment to the core values of a self made man. His life was measured through his generosity and his devotion to helping children in need.

Frank and his wife, Mae, joined the Youth Ranches family in 1989. They had been looking for an honest charity, one with a soul which embraced the needs of deserving boys and girls. And, in 1991 after much scrutiny and deliberation, they generously provided the funds for a Maintenance/Vocational building at the Florida Sheriffs Caruth Camp. Just a few years later, the McCunes helped build a similar building at the Youth Ranch-Bradenton/Sarasota. The McCunes believed that every youngster had potential and should be given an opportunity to succeed. "I think working with your hands should be part of every youngsters life," Mr. McCune once said. "Getting your mind and body working together to produce something you can take pride in building, fixing or painting is important."

But, the McCunes' interest in the Youth Ranches was never just financially based. The couple regularly visited Youth Ranches residential sites around the state and even corresponded with many of the children over the years. "Building a child's self-esteem is the most important thing we can do for these children," McCune said. "We want to give boys and girls the tools to succeed." Mr. McCune felt so strongly about providing this opportunity, he even donated his personal tool and woodworking equipment to the boys in our care.

Born in Santa Barbara, California, Frank McCune attended the University of California and graduated with a degree in Electrical Engineering. Shortly after graduating in 1928, he joined General Electric. And although he

retired in 1967, it's Mr. McCunes' relationship with GE that opened up a new avenue of financial support for Youth Ranches children through the GE retirees Elfun Matching Gift program.

Mr. McCune once said, "If in our lifetime we can help just one child . . . we'll consider our lives well spent." The Youth Ranches thanks Mr. McCune for choosing to spend his life well; for dedicating it to deserving boys and girls who need a helping hand.

authentic Brazilian dishes. The girls sampled mixtures of chicken and pork, hearts of palm, and cheese wrapped in dough then baked; Guarana soda from the Amazon jungle; and delicious hand-dipped chocolate bon-bons.

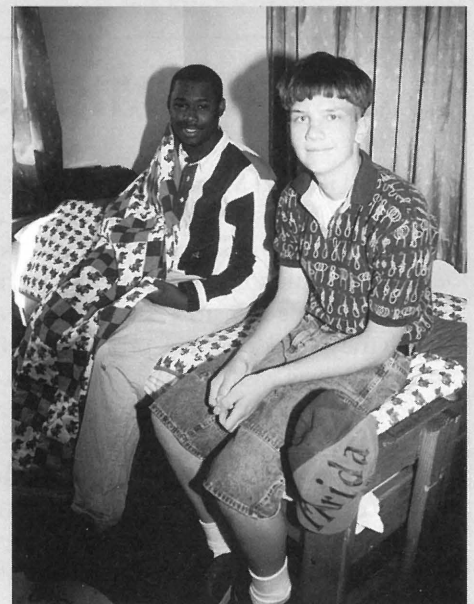
But, the highlight of the "festival" was the Sorgers' extensive display of artifacts and photographs that they have collected over many years of travels. From handmade dolls to tribal masks, ceremonial weapons, head-dresses and ornaments, this rare collection provided the girls with an invaluable lesson about foreign cultures. Learning about other cultures and customs helps teach tolerance and understanding.
