



Who wins the great battle?



PUTTING THE PIECES TOGETHER -A YOUTH GROWTH PLAN



ach child that enters one of our residential programs comes with a unique combination of challenges. Oftentimes, these enormous obstacles overlap into many areas of their lives. For example, a boy who does not know how to accept responsibility or adult supervision may, consequently, experience problems in school that will hinder his educational growth.

The Youth Ranches uses a multifaceted approach to help youngsters identify areas of concern where they need to concentrate their efforts. This Youth Growth Plan targets desirable components or categories that promote overall wellness and the healthy development of an individual. Specific issues of concern, identified by a group that includes the youth, the family, and the Youth Ranches Social Worker, are documented as areas that need improvement. Measurable, attainable goals are set, with quarterly reviews to evaluate and celebrate the youth's personal achievements. Successful growth helps turn a troubled youth into a productive, law-abiding member of our community.

- 1. Physical Growth: Nutrition, hygiene, clothing, fitness, substance abuse prevention...
- 2. Social Growth: Accepting responsibility, resolving conflict, maintaining desirable relationships with adults, peers, and authority figures, developing respect for others and self...
- 3. Emotional Growth: Sense of self-worth and belonging, awareness of personal and cultural heritage, identifying with the program, community, and country, handling anger and disappointment appropriately...



- 4. Moral/Spiritual Growth: Sense of right and wrong, development of healthy conscience, respect for God, personal spirituality, respect for the beliefs of others, forgiveness toward others for wrongdoing....
- 5. Educational/Vocational Growth: Good study skills and habits, organizes and completes assignments, appropriate school behavior, positive extra curricular activities, passing school grades, vocational testing and work readiness skills....
- 6. Work/Career Skills: Successful performance of work tasks, punctuality, dependability, accepts supervision, money management, personal skills and marketing of self...
- 7. Leisure Time Activities: Learning of lifetime recreation skills, development of healthy hobbies, participation in group activities, good sportsmanship and team skills...
- 8. Planning for the Future: Setting realistic goals; teaching the ability to evaluate progress and modify actions to succeed.

Every piece of the pie is important to the healthy development and growth of a child. This comprehensive plan enables our youth to face and conquer problems that have suffocated their lives for so long. Their achievements serve as a constant reminder of where they have been, how they are doing, and, most importantly, where they can go in the future.

Poor school performance, truancy, and a lack of supervision were just a few of the troubles faced by this twelve year old youngster. 


David and the other boys at the Ranch quickly learned that school was a major priority. Each day, with backpacks full of books, they headed off to class.

A Message from Youth Ranches **Vice President Financial Development**

Recently, during one of the closing segments for 60 Minutes, Andy Rooney described the routines some men go through at the beginning of their day. In his usual humorous way, he covered the process of getting up, shaving, showering, and getting dressed for work.

For most of us, a large portion of our adult life is spent going to work. Along the way we plan for retirement. We save some extra money when we can and maybe invest some in stocks, bonds or real estate. Hopefully, the investments do well and the proverbial nest egg grows to a rather substantial

While we have sacrificed to save and taken the risk for the reward, we realize a silent partner wants to share in our good fortune. However, all is not lost, for the hand that taketh, also giveth! Uncle Sam and the IRS still appreciate the value of charities and charitable work.

In May, Congress passed major changes in the tax law and the President signed the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001 or 2001 Tax Act, for short. This legislation is very broad and incorporates many changes in income, estate and gift taxes.

The 2001 Tax Act did not make provisions to include deductions for charitable gifts made by non-itemizers as many

of us hoped. However, overall, income taxes will be significantly reduced for taxpayers and rate reductions are immediate with additional reductions forth coming.

The estate tax will be phased out beginning January 1, 2002. Total repeal will occur in 2010. However, Congress must act before year-end 2010 to continue provisions of the Act. Otherwise, it will 'sunset' and estate taxes may be 'in' again.

Needless to say, those of us who have certain desires and plans for the disposition of our assets will need to become informed as to how the 2001 Tax Act, and all of its ramifications, will affect our future plans.

The value of using certain charitable vehicles, such as charitable trusts, will continue to be important and may be ever more beneficial to you now. This is especially important for those who have been concerned with distributions from qualified retirement plans such as IRAs, 401(k)s and other similar arrangements.



Harmony In The Streets:

Day Camp that makes a Difference

Harmony in the Streets is a unique day camp program offered by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches to help disadvantaged or at-risk youth within the local community. Each summer the Youth Ranches collaborates with the Sheriff and other key leaders to provide this dynamic and interactive weeklong event at no cost to the children.

"We go directly into some of the most challeng-

ing areas and try to reach the kids who have little chance for healthy outdoor activities," said Director of Camping Services Phil Shults. "Our goal is to teach these youngsters to get along with each other and develop positive relationships with law enforcement officers."

The "Harmony in the Streets" message helps children learn new ways to resolve conflict, reduce violence, and renew a strong sense of respect for each other as well as the local community.

So many boys and girls end up in trouble during the summer months because they are left unsupervised or their peers tempt them to participate in delinquent behavior. The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches has developed this innovative program to help fulfill it's mission to prevent juvenile delinquency and develop productive, law abiding members of the community.

Arts and Crafts can stimulate a child's imagination and creativity. In the corner of the room, this Counselor prepares the simple supplies needed to weave a friendship bracelet. As she works, she talks with the children about the meaning of friendship and how they can help keep their friends safe by encouraging them to "Just Say No" to drugs and alcohol.





Organized games at a nearby park keep the kids busy throughout the day. Teamwork, communication and sportsmanship can be taught as they play wholesome, healthy activities together. This game blends aspects of kickball, softball and football all into one game. When a child is "up" he or she throws, kicks, or sends multiple balls into the playing field. The opposite team cannot touch the items until the last ball is put into play. Then, as the "batter" runs to the base, the other "team" must work together to gather the objects and get them back to the box at home base. If the runner is off a base when the last item reaches home, he or she is out.






