ach year, our donor family gives nearly 900 boys and girls a chance to attend the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches Summer Camp. Many of these youngsters would not have the opportunity to be a part of this dynamic program without the sponsorship of some very special donors. In many ways, our donors provide and care for our kids much like a loving grandparent or close family member.


I decided to write you head directors and say thanks for all the opportunities you've given me and other kids. Again, thank you!!! -"Tommy"

Teaching the "Four R's" of Good Behavior

"Harmony In The Streets" Site Director Nikkia Clark calls the children together for "Morning Congress". They scurry under the pavilion from the various field games, craft projects, and other activities that have kept them busy for the last hour. Nearly 60 boys and girls from all walks of life have come to this free day camp led by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

This is day three of a five-day session sponsored by the local Sheriff to help bring positive values and healthy activities into the lives of children who have few alternatives for summer fun. Quickly, Ms. Clark has their attention! The youngsters giggle and laugh as they sing silly camp songs full of active motion and funny faces.

As the Marion County Deputy Sheriffs help serve the kids a healthy breakfast snack, Ms. Clark reviews the lessons of yesterday. "Who can tell me one of the Four R's of Good Behavior?" An arm shoots straight up in the air. "Yes, Thomas." "RESPECT YOURSELF!" he proclaims with a toothless grin. "Super answer!" she said! "But what does that mean?" One child offers a suggestion, "Don't hurt yourself." "Only do things you can be proud of," replied another.

The lesson continues as the children recall the remaining answers and offer their interpretation of the rules:

RESPECT OTHERS

"Keep your hands to yourself."

"Don't say bad things about someone else."

"Be friendly, not mean."

"Pick up trash."


"Don't write on the tables."

One cares too much about the past, another is only concerned with the present, and finally, the triumphant son is the one who has his eye on the future and genuinely strives to reach his goal. The moral of the story is cleverly woven together to encourage the children to excel in school and keep their eye on their future goals!





The Way It Use To Be







Help our boys and girls work, study, pray and play growing up the American way!

Over the years, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches has used the phrase "We work, study, pray and play...growing up the American way!" This message reflects some of the basic areas we strive to build within our boys and girls.

With this summer's challenge to the Pledge of Allegiance and other attacks on American traditions, we believe more than ever that a child's basic education should be strongly rooted in a firm foundation.

Many of the boys and girls who come to the Youth Ranches are behind in school. They see themselves as failures and usually "just quit" trying to succeed. If we do not restore the basic desire to learn and energize their selfesteem, our country could be facing a future generation of young adults who "give up" when the going gets tough.




