



Although we offer care and services for thousands of children each year, we still are concerned with meeting the unique needs of each one as an individual. Many of these children come to us from abusive or neglectful home lives. Others have fallen seriously behind in their academics. Some have never learned the joy of being loved and accepted by a positive adult.

One of the most significant things we can do for a child is to let them know they are important. By giving them positive attention and praise for appropriate behavior, we let them know they can reach their goals and become positive members of our communities.

A great example of this is James who is a young man at the Boys Ranch in Live Oak. James came to the Youth Ranches with very low self esteem. and poor social skills. His cottage parents, teachers and other staff showed him respect, attention and worked with him to express himself in positive ways. Slowly, James began to come out of his shell and now he is the creator and editor of the Ranch Talk monthly newsletter for the Boys Ranch. He also wrote a book about his life which a staff member had published and bound for him.

James is a great example of how a little love and positive attention can help an insecure young person use their talents to express themselves in a productive and healthy way. Each person in our donor family can proudly share in James' success and in the success of so many Youth Ranches children. Remember when you used to poke around the garage or farm, finding a piece of this and a piece of that... suddenly, you get a GRAND IDEA and decide to take all these scraps and build something magnificent!

Siblings Sizzlin' Summer



Generations of Care ~ Youth Villa Alumna Serves As Hospice RN

In the early 70's, Liz and her two siblings learned their mother had cancer. As a single parent and a Registered Nurse, Mom recognized the need to find a good home for her children before the inevitable occurred.

Fortunately, a few years earlier, the Sheriffs of Florida and the Sunshine State Women's Chamber of Commerce had the vision to begin construction of the Florida Sheriffs Girls Villa. When Mom talked to

Pinellas County Sheriff Genung about her plight, he immediately knew what to do.

In August of 1972, Craig (15) was admitted to the Boys Ranch and the two girls, Liz (13) and Nancy (9) were enrolled as the second and third girls to ever live at the Girls Villa. "My mom was smart enough to get us to a safe place...a place where she wanted us to be before she died."

Now, over 30 years later, Liz reflects back on those days. "The Villa gave me the chance to build a good life. It is not about where you came from, but where you are going in life. You have to define your goals and what you expect of yourself...then, begin taking steps to achieve those goals."

Liz spent nearly three and a

half years at the Girls Villa. She and another girl were the first two to live independently on campus as an initial step to living on their own. "It's amazing when I look back and realize how much I learned about cooking, cleaning and taking care of myself during those years at the Villa."

After graduation, she got married and began a family. Later, as a single parent, Liz earned her LPN certification. Still, she yearned to do more so she put

herself through school again and accomplished the goal of becoming a Registered Nurse, just like her mother and grandmother.




