# **President's** Perspective

In my last President's Perspective in the summer issue of THE RANCHER magazine, I wrote about the impact of the economic recession on the Youth Ranches. Since that time, we have moved ahead with the temporary closure of five of our 19 cottages which has reduced the number of children served in residential care by 50. Although this has been one of the more difficult decisions we have had to make, the process went smoothly and we are all more motivated than ever to make the most of a tough situation.

One of the things I have learned in my career is when things get tough and the challenges are great, people step up. At the Youth Ranches, I am seeing a wave of creativity and innovative thinking as staff generate ideas on how to do more with less, how to be as efficient as possible and how to raise more money to support the children in our care. Some of these ideas have already led to a way we can reopen a cottage at the Youth Villa in Bartow and serve ten additional girls.

At our camps, we also have put some creative programs in place. I had the privilege in June to attend "Operation Purple" at Caruth Camp. This is a week long summer camp for children of active duty military personnel who are either deployed oversees or just coming off deployment. It was a great group of boys and girls who attended and we had the chance to give them a fun week at camp while thanking them for their service to our country as military dependents.

I am so proud of the young people in our programs. This summer we had three of our boys working at the Grand Canyon and Bryce Canyon for an outfitter who provides mule tours to the bottom of the canyons. These young men were chosen for these jobs because of their horsemanship skills learned at the Boys Ranch, as well as their good character and responsibility. Some of our girls at the Youth Villa in Bartow are volunteering their time helping out with a riding academy for disabled children and adults. Other youngsters are working hard at getting caught up in school, learning new vocational skills or baling and putting up hay for our livestock. All in all, they are experiencing life and how to make a contribution to their communities.

Last but not least, I am so proud of our graduates who are serving our country in the United States Military. We have Alumni in all branches of the armed service and their service to our nation is outstanding.

In closing, I would like to thank all of our donor family who are remaining faithful through these difficult times. In the past months, we have received over \$100,000 through the "Champion for Children" campaign to reopen our closed cottages. Once this reaches the \$200,000 mark, we will be able to reopen a cottage and welcome ten additional children into our lives at the Ranch. Thank you! Thank you! Thank you!

# Proudly Wears a "Leadership" Hat




# "I love working on the farm," says Rancher Patrick.



It is hard, hot work but there is little complaining. Farm jobs pay a bit more than the other jobs on campus so their work does reap some additional rewards.

"I love working on the farm," says Patrick. "Eventually, I want to go to college and study agribusiness so it is important to learn everything I can." Patrick's remarkable claim to fame was to be the first young man at the Ranch to ride Jake the ox!

Taylor also works at the farm. He invested extra time in understanding the specific skills needed to care for the animals' feet. Farm Manager Jeff Parker taught them the anatomy of a horse's hoof and showed them the proper use of the ferrier tools. As Taylor and the other boys finished cleaning, clipping and shaping the hoofs, Mr. Jeff proudly told them their skills and effort can save the Boys Ranch about \$2,400 each year. Mr. Jeff laughed at his enthusiasm and then replied, "If you invest in some good equipment and do it well, you can use this skill to make a little extra money for years to come. Just make us proud!"



A ll of the kids who live at the Sheriffs Ranch need a helping hand. Some have been abused or neglected, others experience trouble at school or in the community, and some simply do not have a positive home situation and just need a safe place to live. Most find it very hard to believe that someone they have never met before actually wants to help them.

To accept the help of others can be a tough challenge for teens today. They are skeptical, full of pride and often very uneasy about trusting people to help them. Our kids struggle with these fears while facing many other changes in their young lives. Hopefully, along the way, they find a friendly face to encourage them as they accept the help that is offered and discover the sense of self confidence that comes with overcoming obstacles and conquering fears.

In partnership with TiAnViCa riding stables, several girls who live at the Youth

Villa have learned to accept help in their own lives by giving it to others in need.

Imagine if you had Cerebral Palsy, Autism, Downs Syndrome or maybe even had a traumatic brain injury from being shaken as a baby. Think about life with these challenges and then consider the exciting possibility of riding a horse. All you need is a little help!

Sarah, Makayla and several other girls have been given the chance to volunteer and guide these riders through a challenging and exhilarating experience. It has changed their perspective in so many ways. "People with disabilities should be treated with respect," proclaims Sarah, age 14. "They have some challenges, but with a little help they can do what we do."

Makayla quietly smiled and said, "We don't talk too much when they ride because they can get distracted and may lose their focus. We explain each step patiently so they know what to expect. I like to help them accomplish the ride successfully!"

"It takes a team of three volunteers to safely guide a rider through this experience," explains TiAnViCa Director Roger Meadows. They are responsible for themselves and for keeping the rider and animal safe. Working with kids with disabilities helps the Youth Villa girls see a different side of things. I sense they become more grateful for what they have and what they can do."

Sarah summed it up well when she said, "It feels good to help others! These kids are not much different that we are... we all just need a little help!"

He would be heading home soon and spending his senior year back at his old high school. 



# The Skills of Self Sufficiency

Boys Ranch Vocational Instructor Bob DeSantis has one overriding goal with every teaching interaction - build a sense of self-sufficiency! "I expect all of my boys will own a home one day. In my class, they will learn how to take care of it."

The main project last semester in Mr. Bob's shop class was to learn about "stickbuilt" construction so the boys literally built a small scale indoor wall of a home. We start with only four boys in a class because they have to do everything themselves. They learn about load bearing verses non-load bearing walls. They frame and square up the wall, and cut rough openings for the door and a window. Next, they installed the door and window complete with lock sets for both.

Moving to the electrical phase, the boys ran the wirings for a plug, light and switch. They hung the lamp and made sure everything met proper code and would pass inspection. The boys installed the dry wall with both screws and nails so they learned how to use both methods and finished it with mud, which was then sanded and painted.

To add style, the boys decided to install molding around the door and window frames and chose to finish the look by lightly burning the wood door with a propane torch to bring out the grain and then added a coat of polyurethane for protection. "Of all the classes who have tackled this project, these four boys have done the best job," said Mr. Bob. "I am very proud of them!"

Next year, we plan to expand the Vo-Tech program at the Boys Ranch. The building will be modified to include instructional settings for plumbing, air condition repair, minor electrical work, and a small engine/automotive care station. These will be added to the current woodworking and basic welding skills already incorporated into the Vo-Tech educational program.

We want our boys prepared for all aspects of their future. Some may use these experiences for future employment and others will be able to save money with a "do it yourself" sense of self-sufficiency! A s parents and grandparents, community leaders and concerned citizens, we often worry about what our children will face in the years ahead. We see changes on the horizon and realize we only have the power to influence a very small part of the world at large.

But, there is something we can do about those around us!

So many young boys and girls don't have anyone to teach them about life... or prepare them for a healthy and happy future. They need the structure, guidance and love of good Cottage Parents who can raise them to become






