

Each youngster can be hired, fired, promoted, demoted and given raises. This element of our programs teaches them what to expect when they go to work in the community.

In additon to working on campus, several youngsters decided to apply for jobs off campus. Lashawnda is planning for her future now. Her desire to work with children led her to an unexpected place – Lego Land! However, as a new employee, you have to start at the parking lot. She helps

people park their vehicles and find their way into Lego Land. Every day Lashawnda meets hundreds of people! She enjoys the job and the company. "This job isn't working one on one with children, but it is






In 2005, Debbie Crowder, wife of Martin County Sheriff Bob Crowder, retired and decided to fulfill a lifelong dream. She set a goal of hiking the entire 2,181 miles of the Appalachian Trail, straight through from Maine to Georgia. Deb knew there would be challenging moments so she added some extra pressure...every step she would take would help a child in need! Debbie sought out friends and sponsors who made encouraging gifts to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches in honor of her effort.

The first leg of her trip was shortened due to a serious fall and subsequent injury. She healed up and has returned to the trail every year since, slowly but surely knocking off different segments of the hike. "It may not have turned out as I planned, but I am still determined to meet my goal and fulfill my commitment to these kids."

This summer Debbie completed the trail. She ended this spectacular acheivement with the most difficult part of the trail. The final week of her hike was 26 miles from Crawford Notch to Pinkham Notch in New Hampshire. This section included Mt. Washington, the hightest point in North America east of the Mississippi and north of the Carolinas. It is 6.000 feet high and known for its fickle, unpredictable weather, including some of the highest recorded wind speeds in the world. Needless to sav. hikers have lost their lives on this mountain.

Debbie finished the hike on a cold, wet, windy and foggy morning. She was met at the finish by her husband, re-

tired Martin County Sheriff Bob Crowder. They celebrated and Sheriff Crowder quickly



dashed off a message that she had completed the trail!
