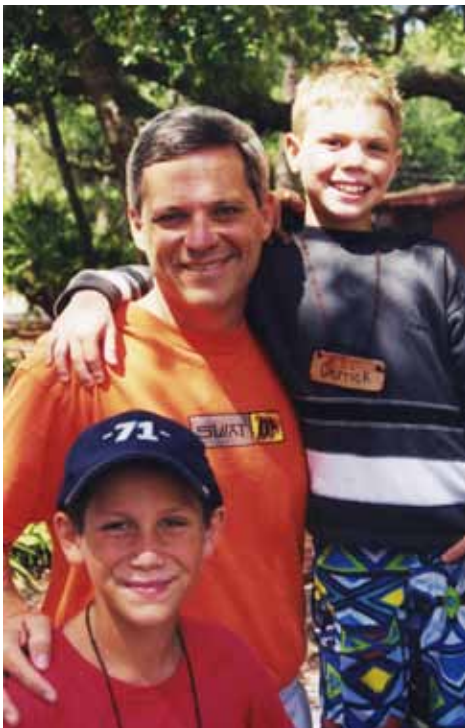

Changing Times

In mid December 1984, I arrived at the gates of the Boys Ranch for my first interview. I had responded to an ad for the position of Family Social Worker. After driving over from Jacksonville, Florida on what seemed to be long narrow country roads, I found myself gazing astonishingly at a place I would still be calling home after 29 years.

Throughout my years, I have been blessed to see so many changes with-

in the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. I have witnessed the accomplishments of children who were considered by many to be on the path of self-destruction. I have seen firsthand what it means to a child when they arrive at one of our residential communities and grasp that they are going to live in a family-like home - a home with house parents who love them, guide them and nurture them. They're amazed to have someone in their lives to cheer them onward and help them celebrate each small step forward. They are grateful when someone is there when they fail and helps them pick up the pieces as they start over.

Since I first arrived our agency has grown and developed in so many different ways, like the creation and expansion of our camping programs. In 1985, we were serving 500 boys and girls a year in our summer camp program. Today we regularly serve over 5,000 per year and not just in summer camp but in all types of camp programs designed to meet the immediate needs of so many children. While our camp programs may not be long term like our residential communities, they do provide long term benefits with personal

growth and development. As I have told new camp counselors for over 25 years, camp is a special place because the positive memories created will remain with these children throughout their lifetime.

There have been so many changes since I first arrived. Another major change will be taking place on September 30th with the retirement of our current President Roger Bouchard. Roger began his journey with the Youth Ranches 24 years ago when he was hired as the Resident Director of the Boys Ranch.

It was during our first encounter that he and I became friends. In fact I remember our first meeting as we decided to do something unconventional. Instead of sitting around an office we went outside for a long walk. In this first of many discussions we found many common bonds that helped to create our lifelong friendship.

During Roger's tenure as President he has remained in so many ways unconventional. He came into an agency with a top down management style which was so very common in that day and age. Roger changed that by implementing a culture of inclusion, where ideas were welcomed as long as you brought evidence to support your recommended changes.

He made it clear that risks were acceptable and a necessary part of growth and change. It was okay under Roger's leadership to fail and experience the accompanying discomfort when it occurred. He was always there to help pick up the pieces, offering advice to work through the process and begin again. In so many ways Roger embodies the role of the house parent or camp counselor who works daily with our children. Like them he has been there over the years with words of encouragement, wisdom and comfort when needed, but always driving us to succeed.

On October 1st, I will assume the role of President and in this new role I will face immense responsibilities. I am very blessed and I give thanks to God for having allowed me to not only work under Roger's leadership but for creating a lifelong friendship in

the process. You see, I am taking on a role in which I know there will be many challenges. Over the next several years our agency will face continual changes necessary for stability and long term growth. There is however, something already in place which significantly impacts long term planning. It is the positive culture of faith, open communication and trust that Roger instituted during his time as President. He built a leadership team that I am fortunate to inherit. Our team of people embraces change, promotes creativity and endures the daily challenges with the boldness of faith.

Times are changing and it can appear, more often than not, frightening. However change is always necessary. I for one am very excited about the possibilities that lay ahead for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. I know working together with our team of staff, donors, Sheriffs, board members, community partners, and alumni that we will succeed! As we teach our children daily, it is all about keeping our eyes on the ball and the goals we desire to achieve. I also believe what Roger has said for so many years to be true, "if we do the right things for the right reasons, God will bless us." We are indeed blessed!!

On Target to Have Fun!

Summer camp provides a wide variety of fun and memories. Every day is a new adventure and an opportunity to learn more about yourself. If you are lucky, you will learn more about someone else too!

Woven into the daily fun at camp are key skills we all need to be successful. Communication, Cooperation, Concentration and Commitment are regular-

ly used in our camp activities. Most of our campers do not know each other when they get to camp. Before we can expect them to use all of “the four C’s”, they have to build relationships.

Trust-building games are part of our camp experience. To conquer “the Swinging Log” the team must get all their members successfully down the log without falling off. Your group provides support by standing firmly

and putting out their hands for you to push against. You are depending on your group to be in the right place, doing their part, to help with your success.

“The Whale Watch” is just one example of an activity that incorporates “the four C’s.” The entire group must be on the platform and get it to balance. Most groups start standing up and talking loudly over each other trying to give di-



rections. In order to be successful they have to end up sitting down and giving quiet, strategic instructions. Everyone has to concentrate on the end goal, cooperate by adjusting their position for success, be committed to not give up and communicate their ideas respectfully.

Our campers are learning more about themselves, their bunk mates and their deputies! Our volunteer deputies help teach and care for our youth each summer. They play games

and sing songs. The campers see their deputies as regular people and learn

about how they keep them and their community safe.

The most challenging activity at camp is the high ropes course. It is 25 feet in the air. This activity is last, as it takes the entire team to support each camper through the course. You have to trust your counselors, deputies and camp

mates to help and encourage you through! For many youngsters, conquering the high ropes course means conquering

their fears, low self-esteem and low self-confidence.

Young lives are changed every day at summer camp! Our youngsters are the leaders of tomorrow. Thank you for helping to shape young lives through your support of summer camp. ★

A Life Changing Decision

Although the Youth Ranches is not a religious or denominational children's home, we have found and truly believe that life is not complete without a spiritual base. Each

resident of our programs attend religious services weekly. Prayers are said at each meal and regular

devotions are held in the cottages.

It is our belief that young people need to know there is a God who cares deeply about them and has a plan for their lives. As youth attend church or chapel services and learn more, they are encouraged to commit their lives to God and allow Him to guide them as they grow and mature. Some of our youngsters make that commitment and decide to participate in a water baptism.

This summer thirteen young men participated in the baptism service. Kyle shared his story of why he made this decision.

"I would come to chapel each week and feel like the Chaplain was talking directly to me. I thought it was weird. Week, after week, his words spoke directly to me; I started to feel like God was using the Chaplain to get my attention. I have made some very bad choices. It took some time before I believed I could change my future. Believing you can be different than the environment you came from is hard. I have made some great changes in my life this year. I have a great support system at the Ranch but sometimes you need someone else – God is that someone else. When I graduate my relationship with God will help me as I continue on this path of positive change for my life. He will be with me wherever I am." ★

WORK:

Everyone must learn the value of work if they are to be successful in life.

We believe a strong work ethic is learned through having regular chores as well as various jobs while growing up. Each Youth Ranches child is expected to keep their room clean, do their own laundry and help with chores around the cottage. They are not paid for these chores but expected to do them as a part of the cottage family.

Along with their chores, each child has a specific job on campus. In order to get a job, they must fill out an application and interview with their potential boss. Through their efforts our boys and girls can be receive raises, promotions, demotions. On occasion they may be fired. Jobs are located at a variety of worksites around campus but can include farm work, maintenance, food services, grounds keeping, mechanics or office work. Different jobs require special skills and they may have to show proficiency through a test to use tools or equipment.

In their job, youth earn spending money which enables us to teach financial responsibility. More importantly, they learn work skills and how to work with a boss and co-workers.

Tyler has shown characteristics in his approach to his work that all employers desire. He handles his job and responsibilities as if it is his own enterprise he is running. In Tyler's job at the Van Ness farm he has earned great responsibility. The Van Ness farm is a working ranch and it provides revenue to help run our campus. Tyler treats the equipment and each animal as if they are his very own. His is responsible in his tasks. Farm Manager Jeff Parker says, "Tyler is trustworthy and responsible. He works well independently and with others. He can be given any task and complete it quickly and correctly."

Tyler has lived at the Boys Ranch for four years. He has won awards related to general work, cattle, character and leadership. Tyler is a great example of a young man who has applied the principle of work to his life. "I love working at the farm," says Tyler. "It helps me achieve goals and provides me the encouragement to keep moving in the right direction." ★

A Forever Friend

In 1957 a United States Marshal named Loren Wideman attended the semi-annual Florida Sheriffs Association Conference held



in that year in the Florida Keys. This was a pivotal moment for the children of the state of Florida. The

Sheriffs had decided to support the creation of the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch. Immediately the fundraising began. Loren made his first gift that day. It was then that he became a “forever friend” to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

Loren Wideman was born and raised in Polk County. He began his career in the US



Marine Corps. Like most Marines he spent time at sea and did a stint at Guantanamo Bay. When he was stationed in Washington D.C he met the love of his life, Anne. Anne was the daughter of Ukrainian immigrants and was

raised in Brooklyn. She worked as an accountant in civil service.

After his discharge from the Marines, Loren joined the Department of Justice. Upon his appointment to US Marshal for the Southeast District, he and Anne moved to Miami. They became regular donors to

the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. However, their involvement with the Youth Ranches increased after he retired and they moved to Winter Haven, near the Youth Villa. Loren and Anne regularly sponsored the holiday event at the Villa. Not having children of their own, he and Anne enjoyed spending their time with the girls.

In their later years, Loren and Anne loved to travel the United States by car. They collected items from all around the country. They particularly enjoyed the southwestern US and the Native American culture.

Traveling by car gave Anne plenty of opportunity to work on her needlepoint art. She was known for creating the most beautiful pieces of art. The detail and intricacy of each piece is incredible. The Youth Ranches is fortunate to have been gifted



several pieces and have them on display.

These two incredibly caring people were also best friends.

Anne had poor health in her final years. Loren cared for her with tenderness and loving care until her passing.

Loren and Anne had specific plans to help care for the boys and girls of the Youth Ranches. As life changes, so do personal needs. When Loren made changes to his life style he donated his home and his car to support the ongoing programs of the Youth Ranches.
