

Where We've Been:

Ranch should have failed — but didn't

Twenty-three years ago Florida's Sheriffs plunged recklessly into the risky business of helping needy, neglected and homeless youngsters. They created the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch in 1957; added the Florida Sheriffs Girls Villa in 1970; and founded the Florida Sheriff Youth Ranch in 1976. One year later, they merged all three institutions into the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund.

This is the bare bones history of a bold venture that should have failed, but didn't. In 50 words or less, this is the skeleton profile of a warmly human adventure that started with a dream, threatened to become a nightmare, and eventually blossomed into an amazing success story.

Old timers who have been on board since the beginning find it hard to believe the present Youth Fund, with its state-wide child care program and facilities representing millions of dollars, actually originated from the kindly, but somewhat impractical, impulses of a group of Sheriffs more than two decades ago.

And, looking back, they can suggest a number of reasons why the Boys Ranch should have been a disaster. The Sheriffs who founded the Ranch had no professional qualifications for child care work. All they knew about raising youngsters had come from their own experiences as fathers.

They were almost totally unprepared for the physical and psychological problems they encountered once they took over the raising of youngsters who often were emotionally disturbed, frightened, insecure, starved for affection, unaccustomed to any kind of discipline, woefully behind in their school work, and desperately in need of medical and dental care.

Financially, the founders were in pitiful shape. They started out with \$5,000 in the bank, but this soon evaporated, and they blithely borrowed \$26,000 to buy some land which, added to donated acres on the Suwannee River, gave them a 722-acre site.

They were determined to make a go of it without government handouts, and, although they had no expe-

rience in raising charitable funds, they decided to finance the project entirely with voluntary contributions. For a while problems with staff, children and finances seemed to develop at an accelerating rate, and, at one point, the Sheriffs were talking about turning the Ranch over to some private or government agency.

Those early days were no piece of cake, and discouragement was a nagging threat, but the Sheriffs had one important thing going for them. They had a strong desire to help unfortunate youngsters who were in danger of drifting into delinquency, and that proved to be enough to pull them through.

The bad days seemed to bottom out after Harry Weaver, a former federal parole officer, was placed in charge. The hiring of Weaver in 1961 turned out to be the first of a series of favorable events that rekindled the optimism of Ranch officials.

In 1962 the Ranch received its first large bequest — a gift of \$28,441 from the estate of a onetime Polish immigrant who had died childless. In 1963, the Ranch became debt-free, and the applause triggered by a mortgage-burning ceremony soon gave way to the sounds of workmen constructing a \$90,000 cafetorium.

By 1967, when the Ranch celebrated it 10th anniversary, the campus included five residence cottages, a chapel, a cafetorium, an olympic-size swimming pool, a warehouse, a laundry and supply storage building, farm buildings and five staff residences. Land and facilities

were valued at over \$1 million and success had become a sure thing.

Ten years later, the Ranch celebrated its 20th Anniversary, and by this time the Girls Villa, Youth Ranch and Youth Fund had also come into existence. Over 2,000 visitors came by to view the progress that had been made, to eat Suwannee River barbecue, and to listen to an anniversary address by State Rep. Ed Blackburn, Jr., a former Sheriff who had served as the first Executive Director of the Ranch.

Introduced as one of the founders of the Ranch, Blackburn seemed to hit the nail on the head when he said, "What we celebrate here today is the anniversary of a miracle."

Where We Are:

Helping homeless, neglected and needy youngsters is our business — and our business has been booming. During 1979 we built new facilities, extended our outreach, improved our services, and touched the lives of more people than ever before.

It was a vintage year which — if distilled into a symphony — would have to be liberally peppered with the raucous sounds of hammers, saws and heavy construction equipment. Summing up — we grew some.

We dedicated a handsome new administration building, completed our second residence cottage, and began an extensive road construction project at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch, near Clearwater.

We also began construction of a new residence cottage at the Boys Ranch, which is located near Live Oak; and we established a new regional office in southeast Florida. This new office, located at Deerfield Beach, will put us closer to the youngsters and families we are serving in that area and enable us to help them more effectively. We hope it will also enable us to repeat the pattern of progress we developed a few years ago after we selected Clearwater as the location of our regional office on the west coast of Florida.

That Youth Fund outpost, under the supervision of Youth Fund Vice President Don Genung, accelerated creation of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch, our third child care institution.

We are hoping that the setting up of a southeast regional office, with Youth Fund Vice President Don

Hull in charge, will get similar results by leading to creation of our fourth child care institution, somewhere on the lower east coast.

Meanwhile, we have staffed the Deerfield Beach office with a community family worker and a secretary/bookkeeper, in addition to Vice President Hull, and the quality of services extended to needy youngsters in that area has greatly improved.

Formerly the community family worker (CFW) assigned to the lower east coast was based at the Girls Villa, near Bartow, which is well over 100 miles from the CFW's nearest assigned county. Now the CFW is based in the center of the region he serves, and his ability to provide counseling for families and intake processing

services for applicants seeking admission to the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa or Youth Ranch has been greatly enhanced.

Providing better and speedier service throughout the state has been one of our primary goals for many years. We made progress toward this objective in 1979, and we expect to continue to progress simply because we are more experienced, better equipped and better organized than ever before. As we get older, we get better.

Harry Weaver, president of the Youth Fund, recently described our present status this way: "We are doing more good and solving more problems with less money." And that's progress!

Colonel Pentland - "The Catalyst"

It's almost impossible to discuss "where we are" without mentioning the late Col. Robert Pentland, Miami businessman, CPA, sportsman and philanthropist.



He came to the rescue of the Boys Ranch many years ago when it was struggling for survival, and he became "the catalyst" whose generosity enabled us to reach our present pinnacle of achievement.

In 1962 he provided funds to build the Annie Barron Pentland Memorial Residence Cottage in memory of his mother, and his \$50,000 gift — the largest received up to that time — provided a "shot in the arm" that launched the Boys Ranch on the road to financial success.

He continued to give gifts to the Boys Ranch from time to time, and also encouraged his wealthy friends to do likewise. Late in 1962 he got together with some of them in Jacksonville and, in just 15 minutes, put together pledges totaling \$90,000 to finance the Boys Ranch cafetorium.

Four years later he gave the Ranch some stock valued at \$1,000 and said "don't sell it until I tell you to." One year later, in response to a message from him, the stock was sold for more than \$24,000.

At a conference of the Florida Sheriffs Association in January, 1977, he presented a gift of \$50,000 to be used to construct a chapel, in memory of his mother, at the Girls Villa.

Col. Pentland died in 1979 at the age of 80, but we will continue to remember him as a compulsive giver who was widely recognized for his charitable gifts and his interest in the welfare of needy youngsters.

The Boys Ranch was one of his favorite charities, and he always seemed to identify closely with the young ranchers whose lives were being reshaped there. He too had come up the hard way after losing his father at an early age.

Where We're Going:

"We will strive to do more good, and solve more problems, with less money."

Asked to describe the objectives of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund for the 1980s, President Harry Weaver said, "We will strive to do more good, and solve more problems with less money."

Then he went on to explain that Community Family Workers (CFWs) employed by the Youth Fund will be an important factor in achieving these objectives. These CFWs are social workers who go into homes to help families with their problems. Sometimes they arrange for children to be admitted to one of the Youth Fund's child care institutions — the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa or Youth Ranch — but they also try to solve a family's problems through professional counseling and the use of local resources.

Weaver said many youngsters referred to the Youth Fund do not need institutional care, and, when they receive help from the CFWs while remaining in their own home, the Youth Fund's group child care institutions can be used for youngsters with more serious and

complex problems. The net result is more youngsters being helped and more problems being solved.

Adoptions and foster care will receive increasing emphasis as alternatives to group child care, Weaver said, and, thus CFWs, working creatively and compassionately on a state-wide basis, will be able to deal more effectively with the special needs of needy, neglected and homeless children.

The CFWs will bring Youth Fund services closer to the children and families who need them, Weaver said, but this is not expected to diminish substantially the waiting list of youngsters who need the benefits of the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa and Youth Ranch, and therefore expanding and improving these facilities will continue to be a primary objective.

Weaver said the future needs of the Youth Fund institutions are extensive (see accompanying list) and they will be met as fast as financial resources permit.

YOUTH FUND NEEDS

Central Office

An enlarged warehouse for temporary storage of donated items awaiting sale and improved facilities for holding auction sales. Two sedans for use by Community Family Workers. A large van for transporting donated items.

Boys Ranch

An additional cottage for 12 boys and their group parents. A medium-sized bulldozer for land clearing operations. A Club Wagon for transporting boys. An irrigation system for the Learning Center's garden. Hand tools, power tools, lumber, lapidary equipment, etc., for Arts and Crafts. A tune-up analyzer, a tire changer, a wet/dry vacuum, and assorted hand tools for the Mechanic Shop.

Girls Villa

Two cottages (called Villas) each to accommodate 12 girls and their group parents. Two barbecue grills, a vacuum cleaner and electric can opener. A dining room table with 10 chairs. A record player for the Education Center. Dart boards, horse shoes, parallel bars, and basketball jerseys.

Youth Ranch

An activities center (including a chapel, educational center, and recreation area). An additional cottage to accommodate 12 children and their group parents. Stables for horses. A pickup truck. An economy station wagon for the new cottage.

All Programs

In almost constant need for the children's cottages in all three programs are furniture, large and small appliances, linens, dishes, eating utensils, pots and pans.

The dictionary said HULLO was pronounced "wholow" and it could be used instead of HELLO, so I went around saying "who-low, how do you dew-low" to the other girls.


They picked it up and started inventing words like "pee-low" for pillow, and "skoo-low" for school, and it went on and on until we kind of wore it out. Enough silliness.



One of the most important functions of the Youth Fund is the raising, receiving, budgeting and disbursing of funds for its programs. Gifts and bequests can be made to the Youth Fund for the exclusive benefit of any single youth program, such as the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, or Youth Ranch. They can also be made to the Youth Fund, without restriction, to be distributed among existing programs where they are most needed or to be used for the development of new programs at the discretion of the Governing Board.

BOYS RANCH

IS a home for dependent, neglected and homeless boys sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association and operated under the management of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund, Inc. It is not an institution for delinquents.

The Boys Ranch was founded in 1957 and is located nine miles north of Live Oak, Florida. It has approximately 100 boys in care at any given time, and it is supported almost entirely by voluntary gifts through the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund, Inc.

GIRLS VILLA

IS • • • a similar institution for needy and worthy girls located near Bartow, Florida. It was founded in 1970. The first buildings were completed in July, 1972, and the first girls were admitted in August, 1972. Current enrollment is 24 girls.

Mailing address and phone number for the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa and Youth Ranch are the same as for the Youth Fund.



YOUTH RANCH

IS.... the newest group child care facility sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association. It was founded in 1976, and is located near Clearwater, Florida. The first youngsters were admitted in August, 1978. The Youth Ranch provides a homelike environment for brothers and sisters who are dependent, neglected or homeless.



David Stone has returned to the Youth Ranch after taking a five-month cruise to Maine and back on the square-rigged sailing ship, Unicorn, and he's not the same David we knew last year.

When he left us, he was a typical teen-ager who didn't know what he wanted to do with his life. When he came

back, he was a self-assured young man who had found peace, maturity, a love of the sea and a blueprint for his future. Somewhere out there on the ocean, the mystique of wind and waves and vast open spaces captured his imagination, and he decided he was cut out to be a mariner.

Now he's planning to enroll in a diesel mechanics course, qualify as a ship's engineer, and eventually sign up with a ship's crew. Later, after he has saved up some money — in fact, quite a bit of money — he plans to buy a 51-foot sailboat and live on it.

We are urging him to go for it! And, we have been assuring him that the dreams of youth do not always get swallowed up in the sad regrets of old men. They do sometimes come true. The cruise he took proved that. It was the kind men and boys of all ages dream about, and it gave David experiences he is likely to remember for a lifetime. He was taught seamanship, navigation and nautical sciences but, as a working member of the crew, he also did his share of swabbing decks, scraping paint, wielding a paint brush, and standing watch. He worked as a cabin boy and deck hand and was allowed to take the helm.

Unicorn cruises are organized as "Outward Bound"type educational programs to bring out "unexpected qualities and hidden strengths" in young people who face "an exacting challenge as a member of a team."

Sailing the Unicorn seems to fit that description. It is an authentic 136-foot square-rigger measuring 81 feet from the water line to the top of its two masts. Built in Finland in 1948, it sailed the seas as a cargo vessel for many years, was refitted as a millionaire's yacht, and has been used in several films, including the TV film "Roots."

We are sincerely grateful to the Unicorn Maritime Institute, of Tampa, owners of the picturesque sailing ship, for providing David's cruise free of charge. He estimates it would have cost him between \$5,000 and \$6,000 if he had been paying his own way.

It's impossible to estimate the benefits David has received, but the brochure he read before he boarded the Unicorn gave one clue. It said: "You will learn a great deal about yourself and your shipmates," and that seems to be exactly what happened.
