*Finally, we continue to provide innovative and exciting short term camping programs for children around the state. Last year, 6,600 younger boys and girls benefited from these educational and uplifting activities and with your help, we will press on to serve even more kids this summer!*

*As we move forward, none of us knows what to expect from the economy. Times are tough all over and nonprofit organizations like the Youth Ranches continue to feel the pinch. My pledge to each of you is that we will be an agency of action rather than inaction. 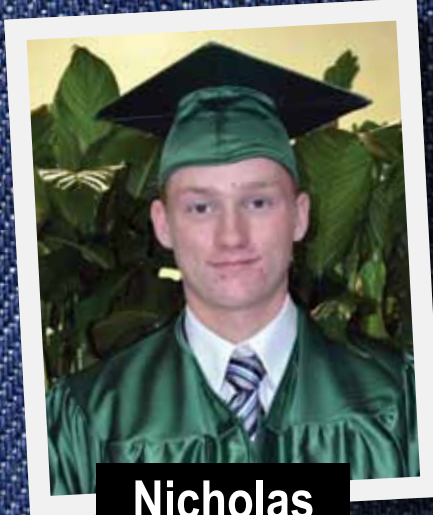

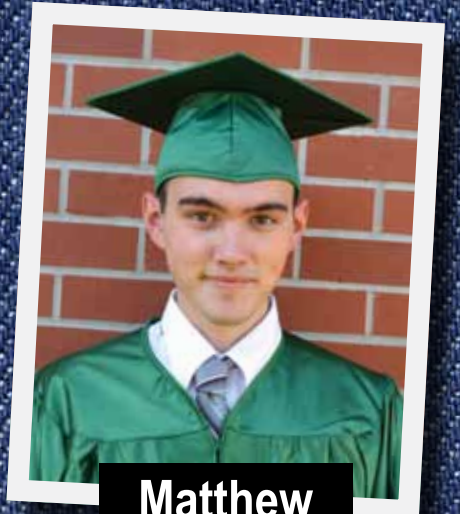

# Fantastic Friends, Fabulous Futures

Imagine you have just turned 15, things at home and school are unraveling and you feel quite alone in the world. Nobody understands you, nobody cares, and there is nobody else like you in the world! Running away seemed like a good option at the time, but landed you at a local shelter. Everyone around you comes and goes, you feel adrift and alone...nothing seems permanent or right in your life.

That described Katie and Alexis perfectly, both had struggles at home and their grades were low, both made poor choices – and both ended up in the same shelter. Ironically, they never met until they arrived at the Youth Ranch in Safety Harbor three days apart.

The two roommates became instant friends, each listening to the others story which sounded so familiar. Suddenly neither felt so alone, so adrift. Now a year and a half later, Katie and Alexis shine!

Both girls have improved academically and are in



the middle of their junior year in high school. Katie has gone from a 1.5 to a 3.5 GPA. Alexis is taking honors classes and excitedly proclaimed, “I never thought I would do that!”

Katie enjoys spending time in a small garden on campus. “I like watering the plants and watching them grow. The garden is a peaceful place where I can think.”

Alexis has played the clarinet for six years and has joined the high school marching band. She also

loves to read, “I have plenty of hardbacks in my bookcase but would like to try a Kindle one day. Reading relaxes me.”

At 17, these girls have mastered the available jobs on campus, worked at the Youth Ranches Thrift Store in Dunedin and now have part time jobs at the local movie theater. “A job helps you build responsibility, but also gives you some spending money,” offers Katie. When asked how they spend their money, the girls look at each other and grin!

Katie continues, “We put some in our savings account and the cottage kitty for group outings, shopping, and of course ‘our phones,’” they say in unison.

“As teenagers, we wanted to have a phone but it was against the current Ranch rules. Together, we decided to challenge this. So we wrote up a request which included who could earn this privilege, how and when it could be used, what behavior and grades would jeopardize the privilege and how we would pay for it. Then we set an appointment to talk to Mr. Halbach. We were so nervous but we went in together and explained our position properly. You can imagine how thrilled we were when it passed! Now all the Ranchers on Ranch Council have this opportunity!”

These young ladies have come so far in just 18 months. While they

share many experiences, each has a different vision for her future.

Katie is fairly certain she wants to become a nurse. “Back in the shelter, I knew a 1.5 GPA would not get me to that goal. When I heard about the Ranch, I knew it

could give me the opportunity I needed to change things for the better.”

Alexis is still considering her options. “Since being here, I have met so many people who want to help you do something positive with your life. I have talked to a few law enforcement officers. It was much less intimidating than I thought. They are really nice people who want to help you. It has made me begin thinking about becoming a cop because I DO really like helping people.”

Each girl realizes the Youth Ranch is here to help them but they have to want to change. “Miss Ann is our favorite staff member. She is always there to listen to you and feels like a second mom,” proclaims Katie as Alexis nods in agreement.

“People here believe in you and want to help you succeed. It feels more permanent, like a family.” Alexis adds, “We get that people donate to the Ranch and want to see us succeed. It’s pretty cool to know you have fans out



there, even though you might never meet them. We want to do well and make them happy, too!”

Katie and Alexis plan to continue living at the Youth Ranch until they graduate. The path for their future altered dramatically the day they came to live with us. With your help, we provide them with a safe and traditional home, supportive and loving adults who can coach them though the teenage years and help repair the strains of the past, give them educational and vocational opportunities and most of all, the chance to grow up and become a responsible, productive adult. # Just In Case You Were Wondering ...

**Y**ou might be surprised at how your generosity is being used! Let's walk through a day of school at the Boys Ranch.

Each morning, before the start of the school day, staff call each cottage for a morning report. This is the time the Cottage Parent will let the school know of any issues a child might be having. This helps the school staff be aware if a child is struggling with bad news from home, is not feeling well, is anxious about a doctor appointment, etc. This is possible because each child is in a safe home environment, with a loving "Mom and Pop" whose salary is paid with your generous donation.

**Thank you!**

At the beginning of the school day, each child places their right hand over their heart and recites the "Pledge of Allegiance." Each classroom displays a beautiful American flag, purchased with your generous donation.

At assembly each morning, our drama teacher reads a devotional and scripture verse.



The Donald Ralph Cooke School is an incredibly beautiful eight classroom facility located on the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch in Live Oak, Florida.

Sometimes the devotional is thought provoking, or sad, or enlightening, or exhilarating. At times the drama teacher gets spontaneous unanimous applause from the students, because she was able to bring the word of God to life for them. Our excellent teachers are recruited and retained with your generous donation. **Thank you!**

Many of our students are one, two, or three years behind in their appropriate grade level when they arrive at the Ranch. We have several options available to them for credit retrieval. They are excited to earn good grades and make up

their credits, and excel to new educational levels. They are able to do this in a state of the art computer lab, with the newest and best computer programs, purchased and maintained by your generous donation.

**Thank you!**

Some of our students have never had artistic quiet time. They ask for markers or crayons and pictures to color, or art books with which to be creative. They are proud of their creations, and inspire other students to do the same. When they are showing us their artwork, we ask them if they would like us to display it on our

little office refrigerator, and they just beam. Some pictures are hanging on our refrigerator right now. Your generous donation made possible this bright spot in their day. **Thank you!**

Good sportsmanship is essential for every successful young man. Our P.E. classes and special athletic events provide the opportunities for this skill to be perfected. During the school year we have at least four major "all day" sports events. They have bats and balls and gloves; a beautiful gymnasium; outdoor basketball courts; a baseball diamond and dug out; mats for wrestling; and a P.E. teacher that will blow the whistle when they need redirection. All these benefits can occur because of your generous donation.

Some of our older students participate in a vocational education program. During fourth block, the last class of the day, they learn an excellent work ethic by working at the farm, cafeteria, maintenance, mechanics, arts and crafts, or the school. Because we call this the "big boy class" the younger students strive to excel in behavior and grades so they will be selected for this program in the future. All the work sites encourage safety and productivity. The work supervisors share their knowledge and expertise in their particular field with

our eager students. Your generous donation provides the special equipment which is needed to assure safety. **Thank you!**

Our library is not just a library, but an exciting adventure. We try to order the most recent and most read series of books for our students. They have specific tastes, and certain requests. A lot of books are now in a series. We strive to collect the entire series so they can start reading from the first book and the momentum builds to the final book. We order books for the struggling

reader and for the advanced reader, because all our children have specific needs and abilities. We have giant chess

and checker sets set up to promote strategy and camaraderie. Often, when they read, it is because of your generous donation.

Of course, each school must have a Director of Education, the Princi"PAL." But, our school has an open door policy to the Principal. Our Principal knows each student by name and personality. Each student has an educational plan developed specifically

for them, and modified continually to support their needs and celebrate their accomplishments. Each child's educational development is the result of a team effort. The team starts in their Cottage with their "Mom and Pop." As the team builds, it includes the Teachers and the Principal. The team continues growing bringing in the Unit Director, the Chaplain and the student's Clinical Therapist. The team is then enhanced even more fully with the addition of the Program Director, the Vice President and the



President, and includes the staff of all the team members. Each student feels this support, and when they excel, the team commends them. This year, we

have several Ranchers graduating from high school. They are so excited to reach this milestone in their lives. Of course, they are ordering Senior pictures, invitations, and caps and gowns. Without your generous support of a donation, none of this would be possible. **Thank you!**

## Young Eagles Ranchers Take to the Skies



The Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Young Eagles program was launched in 1992 to give interested young people, ages 8 - 17, an opportunity to go flying in a general aviation airplane. These flights are offered free of charge and are made possible through the generosity of EAA member volunteers.

Founded in the 50's the Experimental Aircraft Association began to attract pilots and aviation fans from all over the world. Over time, they have grown in scope and size and in 1992 began reaching out to young people to educate them about the joy of flying.

Volunteer pilots bring their expertise and airplanes to a nearby airport and take kids on a unique and exciting experience free of charge! Young Eagles recently came to the Live Oak Airport and gave 18 Ranchers a very special trip into the skies.

First, the boys spent time inside the terminal learning some basic educational information about airplanes, flying, and possible careers in aviation. Then, they went outside to the plane and learned some safety factors including respect for the aircraft and observations of the weather and tarmac conditions as they prepared for flight. After being carefully strapped in, the boys each had a 15-20 minute flight where they could experience the magic and majesty as only seen from above. Back on the ground,



there was more time for questions and answers about the plane, the pilots' career and flying in general. Finally, each Young Eagle received a personal logbook signed by the pilot and joined over 1.6 million other youth who have had this fabulous experience!

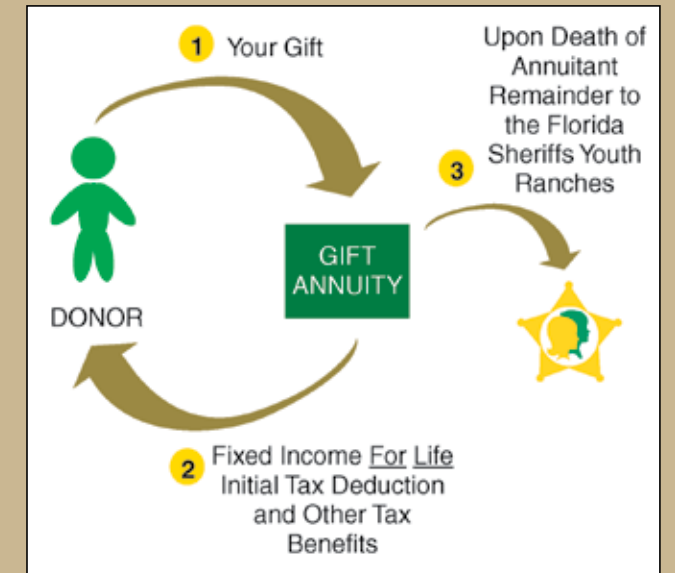

Mr. Patrick brought out his paints while the girls explored their imaginations. Soon these drab drawers became a starlit night, a ribbon of hope, a seascape with dolphins or an abstract work of art.

We are trying something new in 2012! The Youth Ranch in Safety Harbor is our only residential campus with both boys and girls. It was purposely built that way to help keep siblings together as they go through various degrees of childhood trauma. The new challenge we face is that the children in crisis are getting younger and younger.

Our Board of Directors recognized the need and challenged the Youth Ranches to use our expertise in family based residential care to explore providing a safe, nurturing home for brothers and sisters between the ages of

3-12. Within two months, we transitioned our teens living in Noel Cottage to other cottages and welcomed the youngest Ranchers ever.

"It is incredibly traumatic for a little one to be moved into a new home due to problems and challenges he can't even understand. Think about how much worse it would be if his older brother or sister is placed somewhere else. Here we can keep the children together while the adults work out their problems. I know we provide some of the best residential care for children aged 8-18 in the nation. This is a chance for us to extend our care to the

most vulnerable among us," stated Youth Ranches President Roger Bouchard.

Board Chairman and Sumter County Sheriff Bill Farmer agrees, "As Sheriff, I have seen some of the most heart-wrenching situations when children have to be removed from their natural family. We must keep the interest of the children foremost in our minds and the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches will provide them with exceptional loving care!"

Of course with any significant change in the ages of our children, we must adapt. "There are a few adjustments," Bouchard adds with a smile. "We have never had to buy car seats and booster chairs before!" Our greatest initial need will be adding a playground to Youth Ranch in Safety Harbor. As a grandparent of two and a half year old Mae, he can put things in perfect perspective. "Mae helps me see things, understand the needs of children at this age... and a play ground is high on the list!"

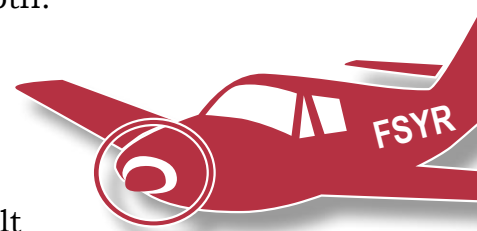
# Air Fest

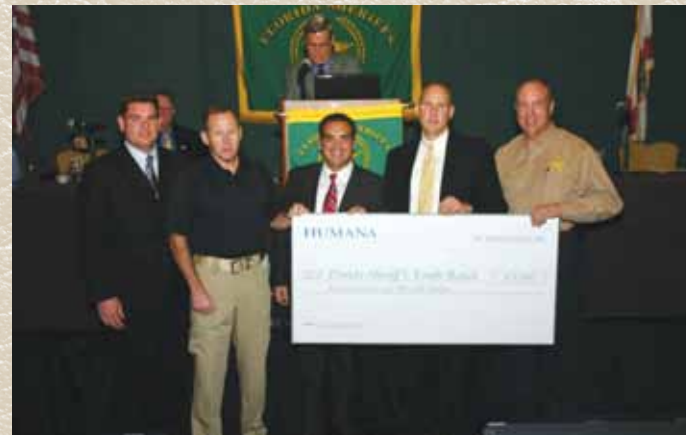

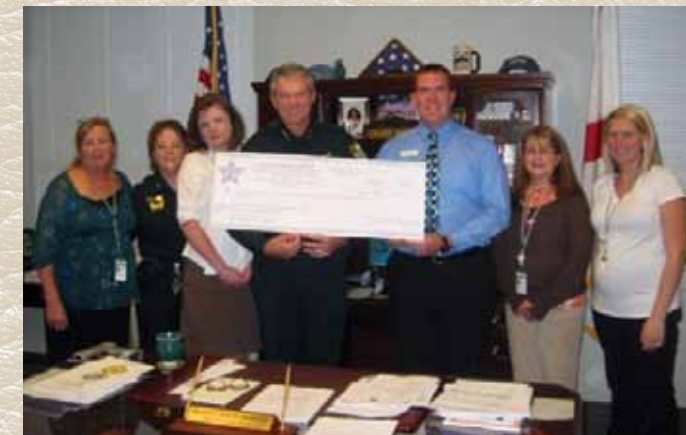

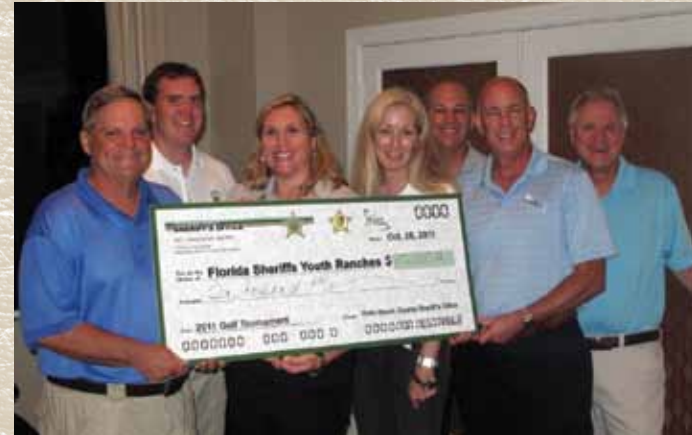
