President's Perspective

**“Everyone has a story.”
– Neil N. LaBute**

People have told me that I am a good storyteller. I do enjoy telling stories, especially stories that have some significant meaning to me personally or to someone I know. Those are the stories that seem to make the most impact with the listener, because the emotion that accompanies the story is genuine as it is being told. Of course, a good story needs great material.

In my 31 years with the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, I have been blessed because I have been privy to so many great stories of life-changing events. These events were moments when something occurred with a child or staff member that caused them to see the world differently, such as the realization that the people cheering you forward as you walk toward the podium to receive your high school diploma really *do* care! Or when your cottage mom or pop stayed up with you, talking late into the night while you were so angry, because they see you as their own and not just a child living at the Ranch. My favorite stories are from staff when they realize that working for the Ranches is not a job, but a calling, a mission.

In my time with the Ranches, I have witnessed so much. I have come to realize that, in every story, there are always two sides. Like the mother who told us her son was a violent child and a trouble-maker. Only later did we find out that, yes, there was violence and the son did make trouble – but did so in trying to protect his younger sibling from her abusive boyfriend. Or the father who called in the middle of the December holidays, asking us to come get his daughter because the home visit was not working out. We later discovered that the stepmother simply did not like the attention the daughter was receiving from all the family members. She felt left out and gave her husband an ultimatum: “Either the daughter goes or I go.”

Sometimes there are issues behind children's behavior that parents aren't aware of. We have

learned of undisclosed abuse or bullying that parents had no idea was happening. At times, overwhelming lack of self-esteem or confidence can be the culprit driving a child's behavior.

Over time, we are able to discover the underlying causes of the behaviors of our boys and girls. Every story has two sides and you have to be willing to look and listen to both. That is what we do here at the Youth Ranches: We look at and listen to both sides.

Each child comes to us with a story. If we were to believe only what a child, parent, guardian or teacher tells us, we would only have part of the story. However, we do listen to all involved and then we open our eyes and see the truth for ourselves. This is the reason we have so many successful outcomes. Not because we have a magic solution or a perfect system, but because we take the time to hear the story. This is the reason you will read so many stories in this issue about our graduating seniors. Each one had a story, and it needed to be told and received with open hearts and minds.

We all have stories. Some are humorous and bring about smiles, and others are tragic and bring forth tears, but they are all stories with two sides. We began as a dream of a few Sheriffs back in 1957, but our story only begins there – the ending to our story has not yet been told! I pray that, as long as there are children in need of a helping hand, our story will continue to be told and heard.

Our story also has two sides. One side is about you – our donors, Sheriffs, advocates and others who support us – and the other side is about the children we save through your generosity.


Thank you for playing such an important role in the story of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. Our story of changing and saving children's lives would never be told if it were not for you!

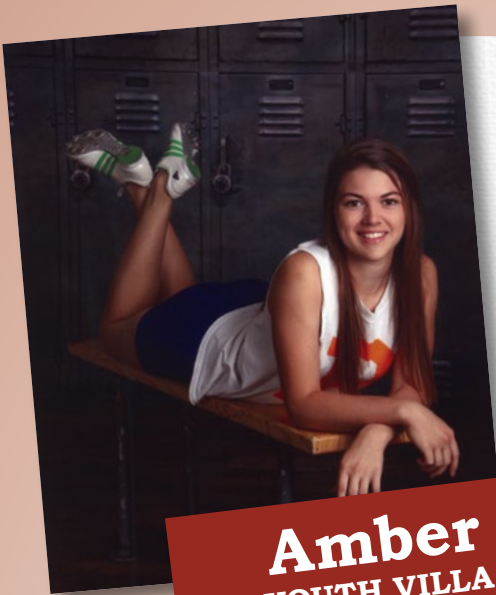

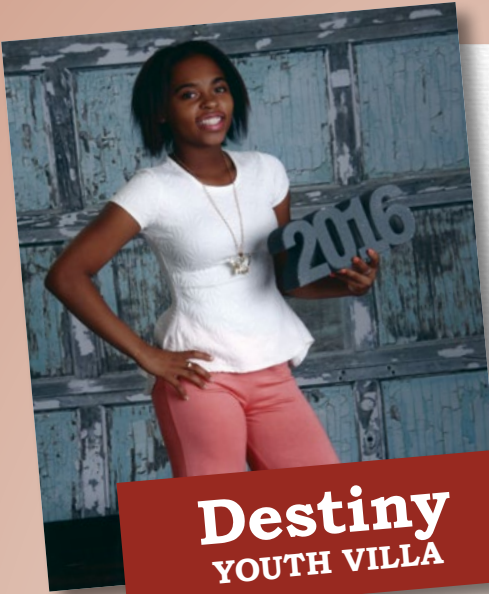

Summer Camp Builds Leaders

Leadership is not bestowed but learned. Who better to understand this concept than one of our esteemed Florida legislators? Senator Chris Smith represents District 31 in Broward County. He recently shared his story of how summer camp played a role in shaping his future.



Senator Smith smiles and his eyes twinkle when he talks about his summer camp experiences at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp in Pierson. “I won the archery award and the canoeing award. It was a big deal to me because I had never experienced either activity before going to camp,” he says. Senator Smith grew up in Broward County. His opportunities were limited at home and summer camp opened his eyes to a whole new world. “Just having the opportunity to explore and be adventurous in a safe environment opened up the out-of-doors to me. I also gained confidence to try new things.”

When talking about his experiences at summer camp, Senator Smith shared two personal observations that impact his life even today. “Firstly, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp really personalized law enforcement to me. These people are wearing shorts and playing games with us all week. Just like the camp staff. As a kid, I realized the deputies were regular people just like me. It really affected my perspective of law enforcement as I grew up,” said Senator Smith.

The Youth Ranches are proud of the deputies who volunteer their time and make

an effort to show kids that law enforcement officers are their friends. For the senator to make this observation as a child, and relate to it as an adult, is a testimony to the work of our law enforcement volunteers. It also indicates that this kind of relationship building was valuable to him.

Teamwork, communication and cooperation are cornerstones of our camping programs. Senator Smith’s second observation was related to these important components of our programs. “I did not have a diverse community at home,” he said. “At camp, I was camping, eating,

playing games and working as a team with a far more diverse group of kids and adults than I had at home. It was a new experience for me."

Did he know that this experience was giving him building blocks for his future career? "I didn't even think about how what I was learning at camp would help me in the future," said Senator Smith. But Senator Smith's mom said that after summer camp he began to engage in community activities. "He came out of his shell and really began to look for opportunities in our community," she said, "his initiative just exploded."

Today, Senator Smith still enjoys activities he first experienced at camp. He shares his love of fishing, canoeing and boating with his children. "My boys are quick to remind me if we haven't been on the water lately," he says with a chuckle.

Senator Smith finds ample opportunities to put the leadership skills he learned at summer camp into action as he works for quality legislation in Tallahassee. His communication skills and team work help him get the job done. With a smile, Senator Smith said, "I loved summer camp! I am so glad the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches donors made it possible for me to attend camp as a child. Thank you to everyone who helps kids have the same opportunity today!"

Over the course of ten weeks students at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches (FSYR) worked under the guidance of local artists to discover, refine, or develop their own artistic vision in the E.W. Bert and Barbara Smith Classroom at the Museum of Fine Arts, St. Petersburg. The project was conceived by Thomas Ris of ArtRtainment Productions and brought together the FSYR students with artists: James Olsen, Derek Donnelly, Aaron Wintrich, John Alison, Richard Seidel, Gina Milinovich, Mitiz Gordon, Carrie Jadous, and Saori Murphy. The exhibition opening reception was sponsored by Dave and Carol Kaminski. Articles Art Gallery & Custom Framing provided framing of the final projects for the exhibition.

An Exploration of Art

On Thomas Ris's first visit to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch in Safety Harbor, he made a decision that would have an impact on many young lives. As the founder of ArtRtainment in St. Petersburg, Thomas has many local art connections. Within minutes of stepping on campus, Thomas began to formulate a plan for bringing artists and our boys and girls together to create beautiful art.

As the plan came together, Thomas acquired an unexpected partner in the enterprise – the St. Petersburg Museum of Fine Arts. As the program came together, museum representatives offered to share the E.W. Bert and Barbara Smith Classroom at the Museum of Fine Arts with the artists and our children.

Thomas brought together a number of Tampa Bay's celebrated artists to build a series of art classes. The classes exposed our students to many art techniques and materials, such as paint, ink, markers, découpage and lino blocks. Every other week, new teachers taught them how to use different materials and techniques.

Carrie our Aquarist

Carrie is usually shy and quiet but, when she walks into the lobby and sees the fish tank, her eyes light up. Actually, everyone's eyes light up when they see the fish tank—the colors are astounding and the fish are beautiful. The fish tank was a gift from Cottage Parents Dave and Mary Egan. Carrie has adopted the fish tank as her own.

Pop Egan is passionate about the tank. He hoped it would bring some joy and understanding of aquaculture to the kids at the Ranches. The day the Egans and their kids relocated the tank from their home to the campus, he found a sidekick in Carrie. Little did he know that Carrie would develop a passion for the tank to rival his own enthusiasm. She asked questions and began a fish journal, taking notes as they worked on setting up the tank. She joined Pop Egan each day as he tended the tank.

He gave her some recommended reading and she read everything straight through.

Most days, Carrie has visited the tank before Mr. Egan. She is usually ready with thoughts and comments about the care of the tank and the fish. When he took some time off, Mr. Egan knew the tank would be in good hands with Carrie.

When she arrives home each day, Carrie tends to the tank. “You have to feed (the fish) kelp so they keep their color. It also has a lot of vitamins, which keep them healthy,”

she says. Carrie points out the sea anemone and living corals that live in the tank. She explains the symbiotic relationship between clown fish and sea anemone. “The sea anemone captures fish in its tentacles to eat them,” she says. “It poisons them. The clown fish has a protective slime that keeps the anemone from poisoning it. The anemone protects the clown fish from predators. The clown fish provides the anemone with a food source.”

Pop Egan is so proud of Carrie. “She has a notebook where she makes notes and journals about the fish,” he said. “Carrie is very in tune with the tank and what is happening in it. She has named all the fish. The other kids on campus know the names of the fish and ask her questions about them. Just last week, I brought a new anemone and told her we would work on its tank acclimation when I finished a project. When I returned, Carrie had everything set up to begin the anemone acclimation process. She is so smart and inquisitive. You couldn’t ask for a better sidekick.”

Carrie’s knowledge of the fish, their environment and what is best for them is amazing. She hopes to be a veterinarian one day. Her compassion becomes even more apparent when she talks about Hopper, the trigger fish. “He is very shy,” she says. “When we first put him in the tank, he went into the rocks and wouldn’t

come out. He almost died. I would come to the tank every day and try and get him to come out and eat. Eventually he did. Now he recognizes me and he comes to the side of the tank to see me.” Her entire face lights up with a smile as she continues, “It is like

watching a flower grow and bloom because you have taken care of it.”

Just like Carrie’s care and compassion allowed Hopper the trigger fish to bloom, our staff are excited to see the same kinds of growth in the boys and girls we serve. 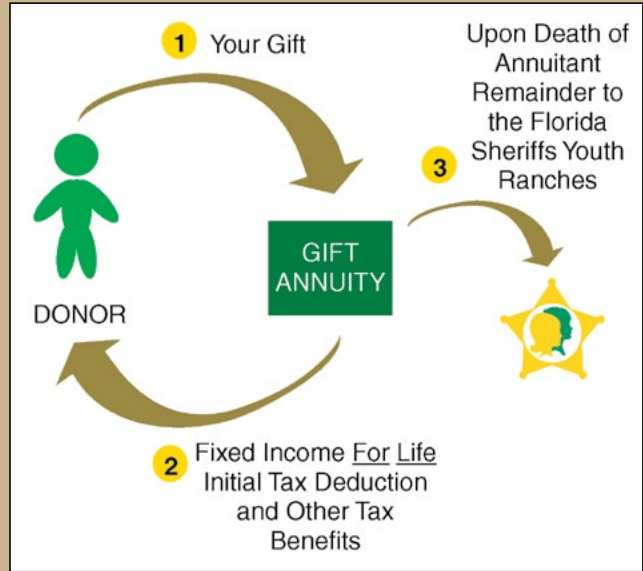

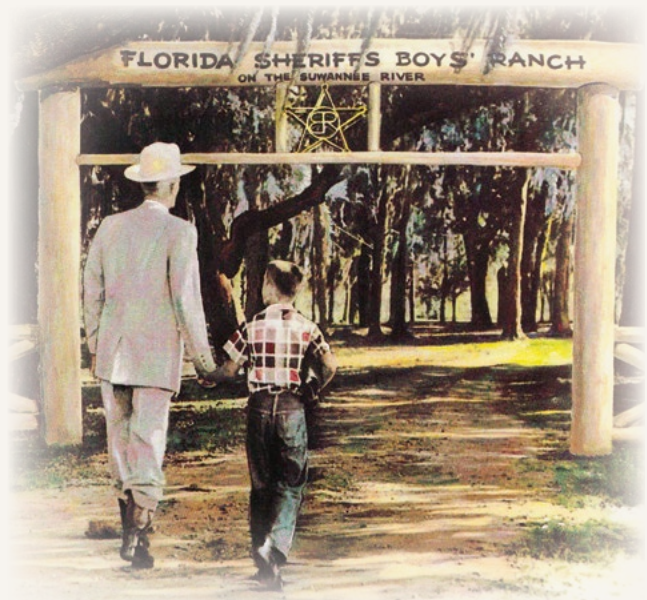
HELPING HAND SOCIETY

Others have made specific plans to ensure their charitable wishes are followed.

Here are a few of the more creative ideas we have seen in recent years:

- Naming the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy, retirement account or bank account
- Specifying a particular percentage of your estate for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches OR the opposite, specifying a particular percentage or piece of property for your heirs and leaving the remainder of your estate to the Youth Ranches
- Investing in a charitable gift annuity where the remainder after death goes to the Youth Ranches
- Making a cash gift of \$1,000 or more to the Youth Ranches in honor of a family member and request they be made a Lifetime Honorary Member of the Florida Sheriffs Association

- Establishing a Charitable Lead Trust where a distribution (% or set amount) is made to the Youth Ranches for a period of 10 or 20 years, then the balance is distributed to your heirs when they are older and better prepared to receive these funds

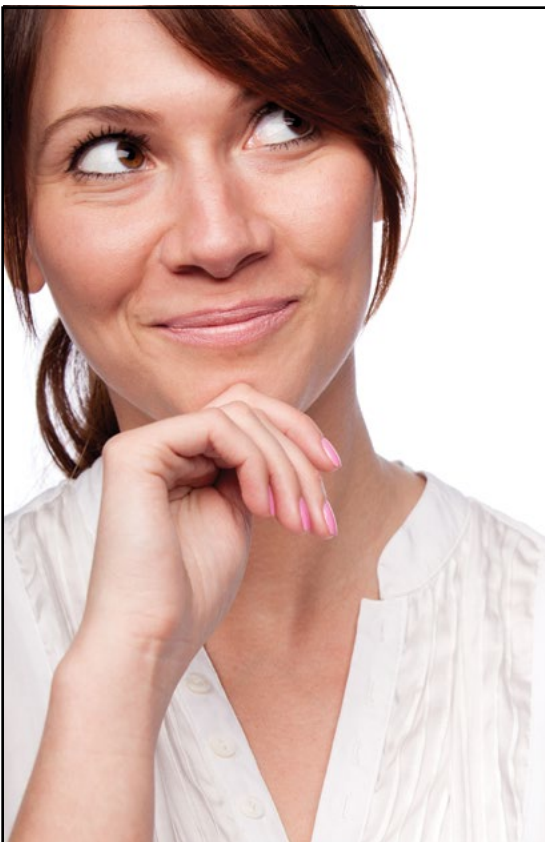

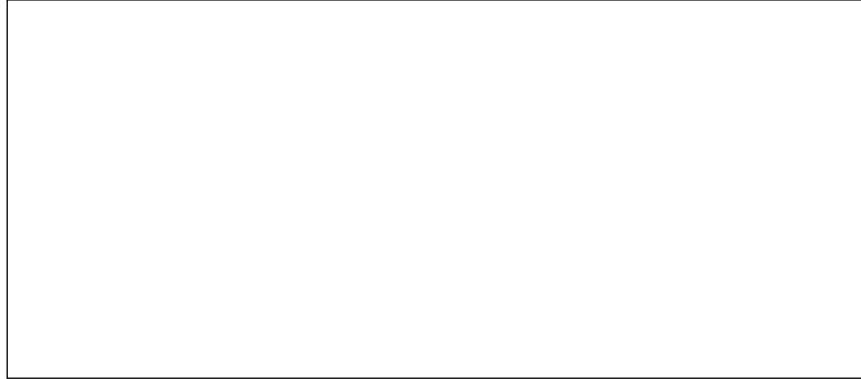
