My phone rings at 10 p.m. on a Friday night. Having just pulled into my driveway, I get out of my car, answer the phone and hear, “Mr. Frye, I need help!” Another phone call, it’s the middle of the day and this time on the other end is someone I have never met but still a request: “Is this Mr. Frye?” the caller asks. When I say “Yes,” he goes on to tell me that he is a friend of a former Rancher who had just passed. A visit to my office, a young man and his fiancée dropping by to say thank you for giving him the opportunity to have a life! A wedding announcement and invitation arrives at my home from a young lady who is ready to begin a wonderful new chapter in her life. I remember her as a young girl, hurting from the abuse she endured from people who had no business raising a child. A husband and wife come to visit and with them a beautiful baby boy. With flashing blue lights behind me on the highway, I pull over wondering what I might have done wrong. A law enforcement officer gets out of his car, walks up to me and asks, “Do you work for the Youth Ranches?” A gathering of adults on a Sunday afternoon at the Youth Camp in Barberville, Florida, sharing stories, laughing and even shedding a few tears.

I recently celebrated 34 years as an employee of the Youth Ranches and the incidents listed above are just a few of the memories I hold dear to my heart. The phone call on that Friday night was a cry for help from a former rancher, a man married with three children who had recently fallen upon

hard times. With the electricity turned off and an eviction notice in hand, he reached out to the only family he truly ever had and that was the Youth Ranches where he lived for over seven years. By the following Monday, his electricity was restored, his back rent paid and soon he would be back on his feet with his family intact.

The Rancher who had passed had nothing left at the time of his death. You see, his wife had passed a year earlier from a long battle with cancer and their life savings had been spent on her treatments and burial. The Rancher was a former soldier who had served his country in the Vietnam War. Friends had all chipped in for a service but it was not enough, so one friend called the place where his friend had reached out to his home and asked if we could help. Of course we helped — he was our child and while we had lost contact, family is family! He was buried in Georgia in a national cemetery.

When Mike walked into my office with his fiancée, we hugged and then sat down and talked for quite a while. During the conversation, I asked Mike if there was something he was in need of and he simply looked at me and said, “I just wanted you to know how thankful I am for everything the Ranch did for me. I would not have made it without you.” Mike continues to be

successful and as I think of him, it always brings a smile to my face.

The young lady and her fiancé were married; they remain together to this day and their lives have taken on a new meaning. They have a bright future and like many of our former Ranchers, I see great things ahead for them.

There is nothing like seeing the joy and transparent love of new parents. When it comes from a former Rancher who calls the Ranch his home and the employees his family, it becomes extra special. So many of our former Ranchers bring their children, grandchildren and even great-grandchildren to visit the campuses where they grew up. They show them cottages where they lived and share the stories of their Ranch brothers and sisters who grew up with them. When they bring their children out, you know we are much more than a program or agency — we are indeed a family!

The flashing blue lights were a way to get me to pull over, but what occurred afterward was a handshake and a thank you. The officer had grown up at the Boys Ranch and told me that whenever he sees one of our agency vehicles, he pulls them over and says, “Thank you for all that you do. Because of others like you, I had a

On the Fast Track to a Bright Future

Before he arrived at the Boys Ranch in 2015, Evan took it as fact that there were some things he just couldn't do: "If I didn't know how to do something, I would just say I couldn't do it." Since being on the Ranch, he has developed confidence and ambition that are laying the groundwork for a promising career post-graduation.

Beginning at the Arts and Crafts building, Evan worked at many job sites around the Ranch. He settled down at the farm for two years. Now he has shifted gears and is learning new skills at the maintenance shop. "I just felt like I needed a change," Evan said about leaving work on the farm. "I'm trying to learn more skills so I can save myself money on home repairs in the future."

He explained how a challenging home life became so overwhelming that a counselor recommended that his family look to the Boys Ranch for help. The structure of the Ranch made sense to him, and he quickly fell into a comfortable routine. "Life is very nice for me here. After

being here for around four years, I've sort of worked my way up."

Living on the Ranch also gave Evan time to figure out what he wanted his life to look like.

"I'm here to make a difference in the world. I believe my calling from God is to go out and help as many people as I can."

Helping others is one thing; learning to ask for help was another. "I didn't walk in here perfect,"

Evan said. “I didn’t walk in here with no problems.” When his cottage parent, Craig Story, thought about his first impression of Evan compared to now, he laughed. “It’s like night and day. He’s more mature and more willing to accept help.” Evan himself admitted that life at the Ranch has taught him many important lessons. “The Ranch has helped me work on a lot of different things as far as building up my work ethic, building up my faith. Just building a strong character in general.”

When asked about his dream scenario for his future, Evan immediately listed off different licenses and certifications he would like to get. Each one represented a

different job opportunity that would open up for him. All of it was obviously well-researched and practical. However, Evan’s plan was leading up to one very important goal.

“My ultimate dream is to work for the railroads,” Evan said. “I want to be a part of the engineers. The people who operate and run the machinery that goes down the railroad tracks.”

His passion for the railroad is evident when you walk into his apartment. As a senior and young man who is on track with his goals, Evan is trying out independent living while still on the Boys Ranch campus. Here he is responsible for his daily schedule, transportation and meeting work requirements with staff oversight rather than the daily supervision of living in a cottage.

His apartment is lined with model trains. Each one has a history, and Evan

has memorized them all. It isn’t just the engineering that he appreciates. He talked about the beauty they create as they plow through fresh snow drifts or carefully navigate along the face of a cliff.

“The place that I want to go is in Colorado. It’s called the Durango and Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad. It’s so cool seeing photos of the big gorge drop to the river down below. That’s the prettiest railroad I’ve seen.”

Evan’s dreams are peppered with appreciation for these giant locomotives as well as the desire to make a difference in the world. His outlook has changed a lot since arriving at the Ranch. He has

excelled in school, receiving the award for highest GPA for four consecutive years. Evan is scheduled to graduate this spring.

He also began to understand that his dreams were not out of reach. The Ranch accomplished its goal with Evan: creating a well-rounded young man with the skills and drive to become a success in the community.

“Just having the willpower to say ‘I’ve got this,’” Evan explained. This shift in attitude is what propels him toward his future. “I may not get it the first time, but eventually I’m going to learn.” ★



NO MAGIC REQUIRED

Boys Ranch Basketball Team Credits Season's Success to Hard Work

“We got started late this season.”

What could have been an excuse from Coach Alan May for his Boys Ranch basketball team was actually the beginning of a triumphant recount of the season. Magic, the Boys Ranch team, began practicing just one week before their first game. Other teams had been practicing for close to two months. In addition to the late start, many of the boys and girls on the team had never played basketball or any other organized sport. The two-hour practices every night that week were more of a crash course in the rules of basketball than the cohesive drills of a seasoned team.

However, the power of teamwork became a supernatural force all its own. “The kids performed and played together like they had been playing with each other for a long

time,” Coach May marveled. “We won our first game and everyone was thrilled. The team became even more motivated to learn and work hard.”

Bright and early on a Saturday morning, Magic walked into the gym and started their warm-ups. This was their last game of the season, followed by the tournament and championship games. With their coach calling out code words from the sidelines, the team got into position and spent the next hour continuously moving down the court, sinking the ball into the basket over and over again. The roar of support from the bleachers after every point made the players turn their heads in surprise. “It means a lot to the kids when the staff from the Ranch come and watch them play,” Coach May said.

Three days later, with the sun already set and the bleachers packed with support for both teams, the Ranchers showed up again to play the tournament game. They huddled

around Coach May and talked strategy until the buzzer sounded. Once the ball was in play, Magic pulled ahead and kept their lead for the whole game.

Coming off the high of their latest win, the players recalled what they had learned over the past season that earned them their spot in the championship:

“To always hustle and keep good defense,” Khloe said.

“You hustle and don’t just think about yourself, you think about other people,”

Zane said.

“Doing a lot of hard work and letting other people play,” Zach said.

On Thursday the championship game was held at the Coliseum, a community gymnasium in

downtown Live Oak.

Spirits were down for the first two quarters as Magic trailed behind their opponents, but a quick pep talk from Coach May had the team shouting their chant — “1, 2, 3, MAGIC!” — and sprinting for the court. The numbers on the scoreboard were suddenly not that far apart.

Despite the burst of energy and continuous display of teamwork from Magic, their opponents, the Warriors, took first place in the championship with a final score of 32-29. Although noticeably disappointed, Magic gathered around to receive their trophies and pose for photos with the still-supportive Ranch staff that came to cheer them on. “The kids finished with class, respect, and a new appreciation for hard work and dedication,” Coach May said. “The sportsmanship they displayed was everything a coach could ask for.”

Their hard work this season did not go unnoticed, and their ability to come together and work as a team has the Boys Ranch in high hopes for next year’s basketball

season. “It was a very close and tough-fought game and I am elated at how our team came together and played,” Coach May said. “They all finished the season with a better understanding of the game, an understanding of the commitment that is expected and needed from their teammates, and they each have shown remarkable growth as individuals.”

The benefits of organized sports are well known. Working as a team, cooperating, communicating, and having the confidence to succeed are necessary for success. Our boys and girls showed that they could overcome a lack of knowledge and quickly learn what was necessary to be successful as a team.

Recently one of our young people said, “You can’t fail at anything if you never try.” We are grateful our donor family helps make opportunities to succeed available to our boys and girls every day. ★

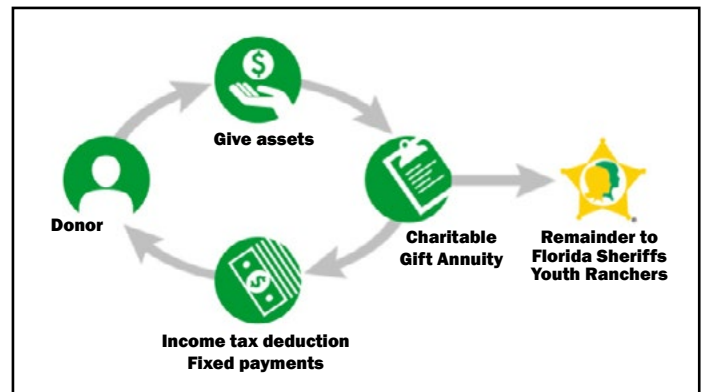

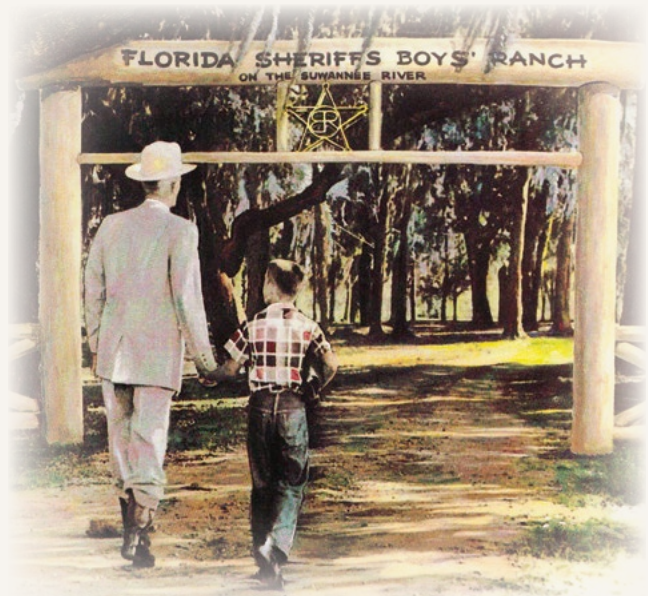

Here are a few of the more creative ideas we have seen in recent years:

A SEA CADET'S PERSPECTIVE ON PERSEVERANCE

Cheyenne is five feet of pure resolve. Everything she does is a purposeful step toward her ultimate goal: to graduate from high school and go into the Navy. This has been her plan since the eighth grade. “The physical fitness part of it is something that took my interest right away,” Cheyenne said, now 16 and in high school. “I’m one of those people who enjoy physical fitness. It’s something that gets my mind off of everything. When I have anything that can

draw my attention away from everything, it makes me happy.”

A tumultuous family life made her feel trapped. Acting out and running away in frustration concerned her family. They needed a safe place for Cheyenne to be while the family worked out their challenges.

Cheyenne enjoyed participating in JROTC at home. When she moved to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa and found out the Sea Cadets Chapter met on campus, she knew the Youth Villa was the right place for her.

“This just really clicked for her,” Mom Evans said. She and Pop Evans are the Cottage Parents at Dorista Cottage, Cheyenne’s home at the Youth Villa. When she first came to them, they were a bit worried about Cheyenne finding a place to fit in, but Sea Cadets was the perfect solution.

“Sea Cadets helps train you for what’s actually going to happen in the Navy,” Cheyenne explained. She talked about several of the drills her team would run, ultimately learning how to protect citizens in danger. “We also exercise, which helps us stay physically fit, and not only that, but to prove that we’re actually not going to give up. We push ourselves and show that we’re actually interested in the program and not going to quit.”

Besides running drills and physical training, which is challenging in and of itself, Cheyenne explained that the Sea Cadet program prides itself in training its members to be passionate, honorable individuals. “You have to be 100%. And yeah, sometimes I may feel like I don’t want to do it, but you have to be the most full-force, honest, loyal, committed person you can be,” Cheyenne said.

Some of the Sea Cadet program’s character-building lessons had a ring of familiarity for Cheyenne: “Teamwork is a very big rule in the Sea Cadets and at the Ranch. You have to earn trust and respect from everyone.” She explained that having people around you who support you is what makes life worth living. This parallels one of the most important lessons she has learned in Sea Cadets: Never leave

your post. “Because you don’t know what’s going to happen or what you could cause,” Cheyenne said. “And if you do leave your post, you have to make sure someone is available to take your spot until you get back.”

Stay at your post, get help when you need it, support your team, and never give up. These seem to be the pillars of Cheyenne’s life, and they continued to cycle back around in the conversation.

“Life is difficult, yes, but even if you only have one person in your life, do it for that one person. If you have no one, do it for yourself.”

Cheyenne explained that after she leaves the Navy, she wants to pursue law enforcement and become a Deputy Sheriff. She recalled a time when she was ready to drop out of school and give up. But had she followed through with that plan, the Navy wouldn’t have been an option.

Now Cheyenne is on a path toward success, guided by her chiefs in the Sea Cadet program and her family at the Youth Villa. And she has no plans to slow down.

“If you open up your eyes and say ‘That’s it, I’m doing this, you better step up to the plate and show them what you’ve got.’ ★

Jacob came to the Boys Ranch angry and disappointed. He was angry with his parents for taking a stance regarding his disrespectful and self-destructive behavior.

At the time, he didn't see himself the same way his parents did. He was just having fun and hanging out with his friends. His

parents worked all the time, and he needed someone to spend time with. He started

spending time with these friends all hours of the day and neglecting his education. Soon he was significantly behind in school.

His parents were worried about his decisions and how they would impact his future. A negative encounter with law enforcement was the last straw. They needed help and contacted the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. Jacob was disappointed that his parents felt the need to send him away and angry to be sent to the Boys Ranch in "the middle of nowhere."

"It took some time for me to settle in," says Jacob. However, for staff, it was amazing how fast his attitude changed. Finally experiencing success in school, Jacob was quick to assess his options and start making plans for his future. We offer

students who are significantly behind in school an online educational opportunity that includes career-building courses.

Jacob opted to take security courses and



decided law enforcement was the career for him.

While Jacob was working hard in school, he was also working hard at his job at the Boys Ranch. His great attitude and his work

ethic earned him a regular full-time job with Aramark Food Service at our summer camp. Jacob worked hard and saved his money for a car.

Jacob graduated in 2017. He was recognized by the Director of Education

That summer, he shared his goals and dreams with the Sheriffs of Florida at their annual summer conference. This fall, Jacob completed his goal of becoming a member of law enforcement. He completed law enforcement certification and is currently employed as an Escambia County Corrections Officer.

“Looking back, I know my parents made the right decision in sending me to the Boys Ranch. The support and encouragement I received there helped me to see what my future could really look like.” With a new job and a young family, Jacob is a great example of what the right

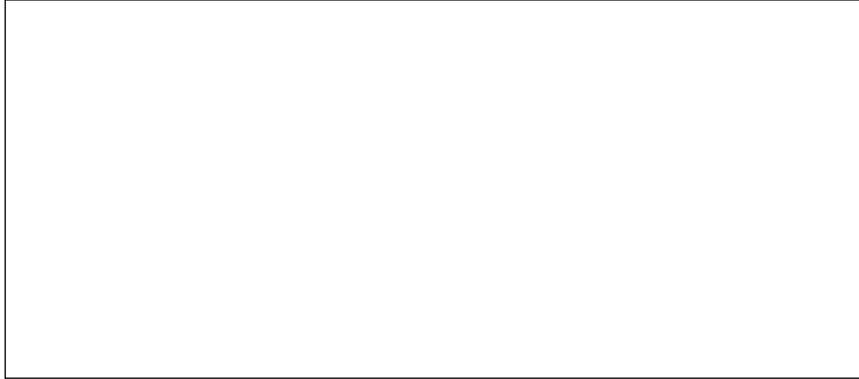
