Thank you for caring . . .

In the Spring issue of *The Rancher*, we talked about our charitable gift annuity program. I asked that you study the program and contact us with any questions or request for calculations. I am pleased to say your response has been gratifying.

Not only have you contacted us about charitable gift annuities, but planned giving in general.

Your interest in wills, trusts, endowment funds, pooled income funds, and other methods of gift giving is appreciated.

The present and future boys and girls entrusted to our care will be the beneficiaries of your kindness and generosity.

Our gift annuity program is addressed again in this issue of *The Rancher* on page 19. Ihope you will take another look at the information and get in touch with us with any questions you might have.

Recently, a 79-year-old member of our donor family entered into a single life \$5,000 gift annuity agreement. The result is an irrevocable yearly income for life in the amount of \$470 or a quarterly annuity payment of \$117.50, based upon the annuity rate of 9.4%. The immediate tax deduction benefit is \$259.25. Of the yearly payment, \$245.34 is tax deductible until the year 2001.

You are reminded that a gift annuity can be written on two lives: for example, a husband and wife.

Opening day for Summer Camp is just a few short weeks away. On June 12, the first of five Youth Ranches camp sessions will begin at our site near Barberville. And, with your help, we'll serve nearly 500 boys and girls this year.

The theme of the camp is "Law officers are your friends." Deputies from throughout the state - many of them school resource officers - offer their time to build friendships and provide special help for youngsters who need guidance and extra attention. The staff also include teachers and mature college students serving as counselors and instructors.

Most of the boys and girls who attend camp are on the Youth Ranches "request for service" list. This means a family social worker from our staff is already involved with the family, trying to resolve problems so the youngster can remain in the home.

Some are on waiting lists to get into one of our four year-round residential programs.

Other children come from inner city backgrounds or other deprived situations which distort values, destroy



personal confidence, and rob a youngster of a productive future. Summer Camp provides a short-term, intensive opportunity to help a young person focus on his or her problems and build a positive attitude.

But, from a kid's point of view, Summer Camp is just plain fun. Ten full days of hiking, swimming, canoeing, archery, good food, arts and crafts, making new friends, climbing "the wall," campfires, ghost stories, and special law enforcement demonstrations.

McCune Maintenance Building dedicated at Caruth Camp



INGLIS/YANKEETOWN — The Frank and Mae McCune Maintenance/Vocational Center at Caruth Camp was dedicated March 10 with more than 250 friends, supporters, staff, and campers in attendance.

The dedication ceremony was held inside the building where large green, gold and white Youth Ranchesbanners decorated the walls. Lively special music was provided by the Caruth Camp youngsters. They were accompanied on guitar by Caruth Camp staff.

Immediately following the dedication, a ribboncutting ceremony featuring the McCunes signified the official opening of the center.

Guests were invited to enjoy refreshments before taking guided tours of the grounds.

The McCunes provided funds for construction of the metal building and outfitted it. It contains offices, two repair bays with a hoist and hydraulic lift, rest rooms, abundant storage and a woodworking area.

Mr. McCune is a retired executive who was formerly with General Electric, having held various positions in the engineering and atomic energy fields. Immediately prior to retirement, he oversaw some 13,500 GE employees as vice president of engineering.

Mrs. McCune, a native of Scotland, was an executive secretary with GE before being named executive secretary to GE's chairman of the board. The couple moved to Florida in 1969.

ARTOW — IMC Fertilizer Inc., a phosphate mining firm, recently donated a 3,600-square-foot house valued at \$100,000 to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa, and it is currently being renovated for future use.

The house was originally located on nearby land acquired by IMC Fertilizer, Inc., and the firm wanted to get it off the property in order to prepare for phosphate mining.

Youth Ranches Regional Director Bill Biebuyck, who is headquartered at the Villa, heard about the expendable dwelling and worked out a deal with William P. "Paddy" Rice, manager of land acquisition for IMC, to move it to the Villa.

Early in February it was moved 1 1/4 miles along an abandoned railroad right-of-way to an attractive lakefront setting on the Villa campus. Also moved as a bonus gift was a three-car garage that matches the house in architectural design.

This is not the first house donated to the Youth Ranches or one of its programs. In the 1960s a small pioneer-type house built for an Elvis Presley movie filmed in Levy County, Florida, was donated to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch by Presley and moved to the Ranch near Live Oak. It is presently the headquarters of the Boys Ranch Alumni Association.

In 1987 Dr. Alan H. Tralins told Youth Ranches officials they could have his \$180,000 house on Clearwater Beach, if they would move it. They accepted the offer, and \$25,000 that Dr. Tralins provided to help with moving expenses. The house was moved by barge and trailer to Caruth Camp near Inglis, and then renovated for use as the Camp's administration building. In 1988 it was dedicated as a memorial to Sonya Tralins, Dr. Tralins' mother.

PINE TREE PLANTING grows strong, healthy youngsters

Since its founding nearly 34 years ago, the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch has been big on trees. The original acreage on the Suwannee River had pines scattered throughout. Today, pines are big business for the Youth Ranches.

More than 1,800 of the 3,300 acres at the Boys Ranch are planted in Southern Slash pines. "We manage our trees using a written plan that is updated every five years," said Boys Ranch Farm Manager Anthony Adams. "We know where we are going to cut and when."


The Boys Ranch harvests its pines after about 30 years. "Maturity is determined by the growth of the pines," said Mr. Adams, who has an associate degree in forestry engineering technology. "Cutting is determined by use of the wood product."

Money received from the sale of timber goes into the general operating fund to help provide food, clothing, shelter, and other day-to-day needs of the boys and girls.

During the past two years, 125 acres of pines near the entrance of the Boys Ranch have been cut. "What we cut this year turned out to be pretty good timber and we got a good price for it," Mr. Adams remarked.

Generally the land is left unplanted for up to two years after harvesting, but because its near the entrance, the 70-acre tract was replanted this year. The seedlings are planted 800 to the acre and Ranchers often get a chance to try their hand at planting. Although it's still a bumpy ride, modern-day pine tree planters are used that place the young tree neatly in the ground. In the early days of the Boys Ranch, many of the trees were planted by hand. Harvesting

is contracted out because of the danger of youngsters getting cut by chain saws or hit by falling trees. However, many Ranchers have gained respect for hard work by assisting with the tree planting using a hand planter, riding a mechanical planter, or taking a turn in the root field clearing ground for the next planting.

Because the Youth Ranches believes in conservation, a program was started several years ago where the underbrush is cleared from beneath the trees to allow pine straw harvesting. It also fosters good tree growth. Keeping the pine forest clean reduces fire hazards, enhances the appearance of the stand of trees, and reduces the capital expense, Mr. Adams said.

The Boys Ranch is a certified Tree Farm and proudly boasts a sign to that effect at the front entrance.

Maintenance Men

YOUTH VILLA — In an imperfect world where something is always breaking down, clogging up or wearing out, maintenance men are absolutely indispensable.

But, because they go about their daily chores with modest, unpretentious competence, they are likely to be taken for granted.

Bill Biebuyck doesn't. Bill is the Regional Director at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa, near Bartow, and, if given the slightest opportunity, he will brag about his maintenance crew with unrestrained enthusiasm.

Well, why not?

These talented tool wielders recently converted 2,700 square feet of administration building storage space into eight offices, two small conference rooms, and a small kitchen.

When that was done, they built furniture for two of the offices, the kitchen and the conference rooms.

Villa Business Manager Tom Murphy is also an admirer of the maintenance shop Michelangelos. He pointed out that they have other claims to the handyman's hall of fame such as the thriving citrus grove they have established on Villa property with the help of Villa youths; and the work they are presently doing to renovate a 3600-square-foot dwelling donated to the Villa by IMC Fertilizer, Inc.

These major projects, said Murphy, are in addition to routine duties such as:

• Preventive maintenance for the Villa vehicle fleet of 16 cars and vans and three tractors. This includes tuneups, brake replacement, oil changes, lubes and tire repairs.

- Mowing approximately 113 acres of grass.
- Repairing, washing and painting the inside and outside of Villa buildings.
- Making minor electrical and plumbing repairs.
- Repairing furniture.
- Maintaining the swimming pool.
- Maintaining the sewer plant.

The maintenance crew roll call includes Howard Doty, Supervisor; Greg Gates, Michael Way, Bob Wells and Bill Barker. Their skills include carpentry, auto mechanics, welding and painting. They are also capable of making basic electrical, plumbing and air conditioning repairs.

Linda's Leaving:

She sampled independent living; now she's facing the real thing

YOUTH VILLA — What will happen to Linda Riegel? Will she get the job she needs to survive? Will she have enough gumption and grit to hold down a full-time job and take college courses in her spare time? Will she get the college degree she has targeted as one of her goals? Will she make the right choices at a time when so many young people are making wrong, totally disastrous choices?

Linda is leaving after spending 27 months in the sheltered, secure environment provided by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa. Watching her pack her suitcase is like watching a circus trapeze artist preparing to swing out into space.

Will she make it on her own?

Villa Resident Director Ed Freddo thinks she will. "The odds are good for her survival," he said recently, and Freddo is a child care veteran who doesn't make statements like that without just cause.


Since 1988 he has watched Linda progress from an immature teen-ager with a poor scholastic record to a confident young woman with a high school diploma, work experience in various off-campus jobs, and a more mature outlook.

In 1990, with Freddo's approval, she was allowed to transfer to Dorista Cottage, a "transitional living unit" where young people are given an opportunity to experience the freedoms, as well as the serious responsibilities, that accompany independent living.

In this special environment, she has learned many things that will be useful out in "the real world" — basic things like buying clothes and groceries on a budget, preparing nutritious meals, and doing laundry without getting into a quandary — also practical things like how to get and hold a job, or how to operate a car without breaking your budget.

The confusing maze of wires and pipes and "stuff" under the hood of a car holds no mysteries for this young lady. While living at the Villa, she completed a course in auto mechanics, and is capable of doing minor repairs and servicing.

Young people frequently get financially "strapped" by car payments, but that won't happen to Linda. She recently paid cash for a used car by dipping into savings she had accumulated over a period of years from various

jobs, as well as birthday and Christmas gifts. She got a "good buy," Villa staff members say, and she is still holding on to some savings bonds.

Somewhere along the way, in her troubled, problempitted past, Linda became convinced that it was nifty to be thrifty, and her gift for thrift will be one of the things Villa friends will remember about her. They will recall particularly how she hunted for bargains at flea markets and other discount emporia.

"You can ask anyone about me and money, and they'll just tell you," she said recently, "I worry about not having enough, getting in debt, and being poor the rest of my life."

Out there in the sometimes cruel and always

competitive world, Linda will find many kindred souls who share her worries, and, fortunately, since she is returning to the Live Oak area from whence she came, she will have strong moral support from friends who are waiting to welcome her.

Meanwhile, she's very grateful for the benefits she has received from her Youth Villa sojourn. "It has prepared me for the realities of life, and it has been a great experience," she said. "If I had not learned what I have learned here, there would be no way I could make it on my own."



"Our agency is delighted to be able to help such a worthwhile project as the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches," Gillum responded. "Their work could very well prevent a young person from following a trail that would end up in a cell in this very jail."

"Lockdowns" in new jails across Florida have become almost a tradition in the last several years. They allow Sheriffs' offices to raise money to help Youth Ranches boys and girls while testing the physical operation of new jails. It's also a way for the general public to have fun while learning what it's like to be incarcerated.





Gift Annuity ... A Gift That Gives and Provides Payments For Life



What is a charitable gift annuity?

A charitable gift annuity is a gift to help troubled boys and girls in Florida while providing a guaranteed lifetime income for the donor.

It is an irrevocable agreement by which you make a gift to a qualified charitable organization and receive fixed payments for life. It is also a gift since part of the payment is given for a non-profit cause. Charitable gift annuities are recognized by state and federal authorities as a way to make a gift, and they have been around for many, many years.

The amount of income one receives is based upon the amount of the gift and the age of the donor. The older the donor, the higher the gift annuity rate.

A portion of the gift is immediately tax deductible as is a portion of the income.

Organizations issuing gift annuities are required by Florida law to meet precise financial standards and be registered. The Youth Ranches was the first organization in Florida to be issued a permit to write charitable gift annuities. The Youth Ranches permit number is DAAP-74-1. The Committee on Gift Annuities meets every three years to set the uniform annuity rates and the Youth Ranches is a sponsoring organization of this group.
