Building trust, promoting teamwork, minimizing violence, teaching respect in an effort to build safer schools and communities, living together -

In Harmon

First piloted in the fall of 1994 to improve student relations within the public school system, **Project Harmony**, at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp in Barberville, is now a collaborative effort between the Volusia County School System, Stetson University, the Volusia County Sheriff's Office, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, and the West Volusia Police Athletic League.

Project Harmony is a 5-day, 24-hour leadership retreat designed for Volusia County students who undergo intensive training in conflict resolution, cultural diversity, environmental awareness, and group-building exercises. After classwork has been completed, students participate in typical camp activities, such as challenge course, canoeing, arts and crafts, recreation, nature hikes, and swimming.

Students are handpicked to attend **Project Harmony** based on their positive or negative leadership qualities by school administrators, guidance counselors, and teachers. It is essential that groups are as culturally diverse and balanced as possible.

The primary goal of **Project Harmony** is to teach problem-solving skills while addressing racial tension and conflicts within the schools. Positive leaders, negative leaders, and youth from different ethnic backgrounds build their leadership skills and learn to work together.


"The intention of **Project Harmony**..." states project co-founder



and Director of Stetson University's Multicultural Education Institute Dr. Patrick Coggins, "... is to combine the responsibilities of daily classroom activities with the therapeutic, esteem-building activities of camp, coupled with special 'Harmony' classes to promote racial and ethnic diversities."

For their classroom requirement, students are allotted two hours daily to complete any work assigned by teachers from their schools. Participants are also expected to keep journals covering topics such as, "What do you expect to learn from **Project Harmony**?" and "How can you apply what you have learned to make your community and school a safer place?"

During each camp-related activity, students develop various skills, either by working as individuals or as team members. With camp activities like hiking, canoeing, recreation, and the Challenge



Course, students learn they must work together to overcome obstacles, accomplish goals, develop teamwork and trust, while building communication skills, self-confidence, and self-esteem.

"A lot of what we do out here at the camp is allow kids to be kids,"says Youth Camp Coordinator Phil Shults. "So many of them have never had the opportunity to do that; to make lasting friendships and meaningful memories."


One of **Project Harmony's** premiere activities is a 2-hour presentation and workshop on cultural diversity instructed by Dr. Coggins. During the presentation, he uses a variety of methods to help students develop a multi-cultural awareness of other groups within their communities and schools. During the remainder of the week, students are exposed to other discussions regarding conflict resolution, as well as presentations in the area of law enforcement by school resource officers.

The approximately 1,200 students (40 each session) who attend **Project Harmony** every school year, are designated Volusia County "Harmony Leaders" and are expected to practice the skills


they have learned in their schools and communities. These youth are encouraged to participate in community service projects and extracurricular school activities, as well as share the "Harmony" message with their peers.



A Message from Youth Ranches Vice President Financial Development William W. Yarick

On my drive to and from the Boys Ranch, I pass a local recycling operation. It consists of a rather large outdoor storage area, a huge piece of machinery capable of crushing automobiles, and several other compacting units. For literally tons of metal, this is one stop as their usefulness is "recycled." Perhaps you have seen a similar sight and wondered where all of the metal ultimately ends up.

In some ways, recycling is like economic theory. When a dollar is spent in a community, it circulates or is recycled many times over. The economic impact of the dollar is much more than just the dollar itself.

How true it is in the lives of boys and girls. What will a dollar invested in a young life reproduce? What will the economic impact of a turned-around life be? How much more is the life of a boy or girl measured beyond economic value?

Recycling is good stewardship. Recycling reuses that which is useful and reduces the cost of finding new resources. In a sense, it is getting more than one use out of a particular resource.

Our work in Financial Development is much like that, too, particularly when it relates to arranging retained life income gifts. The resources are extended to provide more than just one use. In the case of

these gifts, not only does the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches benefit, but the donor benefits, usually by increasing income for themselves and reducing or eliminating unnecessary taxes.

Perhaps the Gift Annuity illustration on page 18 helps demonstrate this point best. Note the initial charitable deduction available and the tax-free portion of income received for life on an annual basis.

Seizing the Opportunity to Recycle

In a brand new initiative taking place at the Youth Ranches Live Oak Opportunity Store, recycling is not only helping needy kids, but protecting Mother Earth as well!

ver 300,000 lbs. of excess clothing is recycled at the Youth Ranches Live Oak Opportunity Store each year alone. "Clothing that cannot be used by youth in our programs is either sold at one of our five Opportunity Stores around the state, or baled so that it can be resold," says Live Oak Opportunity Store Manager Loyd Hall, an early advocate and staunch supporter of the recycling program. "Nothing is thrown away; everything is utilized."

Thanks to these positive efforts, local community members have also begun pitching in their own time and energy to help the recycling program. "Years ago, I put a sign up in the store, 'Donations of bags needed,' "says Mr. Hall. "Thanks to the tremendous response, I haven't bought shopping bags in over four years."

Metal and cardboard are also salvaged, thankfully delaying their disposal into overflowing dumping sites. "We have two main priorities for

Sun Sets on Generous and Loyal **Youth Ranches Supporters**

The Sunshine State Women's Chamber of Commerce (SSWCC) of Pinellas County, because of their dedication and foresight, believed troubled girls deserved the same attention and care as the at-risk boys of the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch. The Girls Villa (now Youth Villa) in Bartow was established in 1972 to help troubled young girls build self-esteem, self-confidence, and selfreliance.

Thanks to the Chamber's persistence and determination, thousands of youngsters and their families have benefitted from years of nurturing and guidance while building on that original dream. In 1972, the Sunshine Villa was dedicated, in honor of SSWCC, and within the year was nearly filled to capacity. Three years later, Dorista Villa was established with portions of a bequest through the estate of former SSWCC Member Esther Mowry to serve more needy children.

With generous gifts throughout the years from the Sunshine State Women's Chamber of Commerce totalling approximately \$2 million, numerous exciting developments improved life at the Villa. Due, in part, to the Chamber, its members, and friends' enormous generosity, the Youth Villa now has an on-campus learning center, barn and stables, pastures in which to practice horsemanship, and a boat dock for inspirational canoes around the campus lake.








On a journey to plant a tree or sow a summer garden, would you not bring a shovel for digging?



Mr. Kiel, revealing his own lifelong obstacles, offered advice on overcoming adversities. "It took me 17 years










Graduation Day







ow, more than ever, youngsters around the nation are taking advantage of their high school Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) programs.



Willie. "I have a better understanding and respect for everyone and everything."




"Pop (Maddox) taught me how to take control of my life, to do things for myself," says Willie smiling. "I don't wait for things to happen anymore; I make them happen."

The charitable gift annuity allows you to give to our troubled boys and girls and also provides you and/or someone you designate with a reliable income for life.

A sizeable portion of your gift (cash, stocks, bonds, or mutual funds) is immediately tax deductible and a portion of the annuity income is tax-free during normal life expectancy. The agreement is irrevocable and is supported by the assets of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc.

The amount of the annuity income is based on the

amount of the gift and the age of the annuitant. Typically, the older you are, the greater the amount you receive.

Organizations permitted to issue gift annuity agreements are required by state law to meet stringent financial standards. The Youth Ranches was the first organization in the state of Florida to receive a permit number, which is DAAP-74-1.

The American Council on Gift Annuities meets every three years to establish the uniform gift annuity rates. The Youth Ranches is a sponsoring organization of this group.

This became necessary after we learned that certain organizations of questionable legitimacy were adding our donors to their mailing lists. As long as the home towns are not revealed, this will be extremely difficult to do. We want our donors to know that we have never permitted other organizations to use our lists of supporters, and we will continue to do everything possible to preserve their privacy.

This Honor Roll gives special recognition to generous supporters of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches and its six child-care programs: the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, Youth Villa, Youth Ranch/Safety Harbor, Youth Ranch-Bradenton/Sarasota, Youth Camp, and Caruth Camp. 


