

That was in 1998 and Mike had just turned 14 years old.

Today, Mike is 18 and will soon graduate from Suwannee High School. With a 2.5 grade point average, Mike has made the most of his high school years. Like any busy teenager, Mike has participated in Future Farmers of America showing animals at the fair and attending the national FFA conference; played on the school


baseball team - meeting Atlanta Braves superstar Chipper Jones; held a job in town - saving money to buy his own pick up truck (and pay for the insurance); and attending the prom with his beautiful girlfriend Hitomi.

At the Boys Ranch, Mike has grown up to become a responsible, mature young man who is ready to move on to the next stage in his life...college! Mike has always had an interest in the firefighting profession. Long before September 11th, he wanted to be a member of the New York Fire Department.

With a slight smile he says, "Most kids here think I want to do this because of 9/11...it's just not true! In fact, just ask my cottage parents...you see when I was in the 10th grade, I sorta got in trouble because I printed out a complete list of every fire department in New York City on the computer...it was 119 pages long. September 11th just intensified my desire to serve in the city."

Given Mike has an aunt that lives in Pennsylvania, he has enrolled in Philadelphia Community College with plans to transfer to Penn State in two years. "They have a good two year fire science program there, and I really like the area."

When asked about his life at the Boys Ranch, Mike takes a moment to think, then responds "I had a lot of opportunities to do many things here. This



Youth Villa Classic



In the early 70's, the Sheriffs of Florida began searching for the right place to begin a sister two g program to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch. They recognized abused, neglected and troubled girls needed the same guidance and care as the boys served at the Boys Ranch.

With the support of key individuals in the Polk County area, the County

With the support of key individuals in the Polk County area, the County Commissioners and the Mobil Corporation agreed to a 99 year lease on a large track of beautiful land located just outside the city of Bartow. Local community leaders immediately stepped forward and embraced the Florida Sheriffs Girls Villa, now known as the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa.

At that time, a fledgling Chamber of Commerce event called the Bartow Classic had evolved into a week-long festival that included two golf tournaments, a barbecue, dinner/dance, and a civic luncheon. The business community felt it would be wise to adopt a charitable

beneficiary and naturally selected the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa.

Now, decades later, the event is still going strong and the money raised still supports the girls who live at the Youth Villa. This past year, a \$20,000 check was presented to the Youth Ranches representing the proceeds from this event.



Given the hot summer nights, the hike back to the bunks might lead to a clammy, restless night of sleep. Thanks to the generous men and women of the Moose, it is now just a short walk to the closest facility.

In the early 80's, the Officers of the Florida Bermuda Moose Association were seeking a Civic Affairs Program that would be worthy of their collective and individual support. Then State Director Cecil Webster contacted Don Genung, former Sheriff of Pinellas County. Genung convinced Director Webster the Florida Sheriffs

A Generous Heart!

Life was tough for Doug Lamoureaux as he grew up in a single-parent home during the 40's and 50's in New York. He was bored in school, dropped out after the 8th grade. He managed to make a pretty good living as the owner of two service stations and the first coined-operated car wash in the area. His good fortune was increased in 1952 when he married his childhood sweetheart Margery, a girl he met in Central Park when she was just 10 and he was 11.

When Doug was 34, he was injured in an accident, and part of the settlement would pay for some post-high school education. But, he had to finish high school first! So, he completed the GED,

and then scored high enough on the college entrance exam to be awarded a scholarship to the State University of New York. He made the Dean's List during his freshman year and graduated with a Bachelors Degree in Engineering two years later! He initially took a job as an engineer with the U.S. Government Department of Energy and later worked for Exxon.

In 2000, Doug and Margery retired and moved to Hernando County where he first learned about the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. He remembered his own difficult childhood and wanted to make things better for the children at the Ranch. One thing he possessed that had some monetary and personal value was a Gibson guitar. With help from the Hernando County Sheriff's Office, he contacted the Youth Ranches and donated this valuable instrument. The Ranch sold the Gibson guitar and bought several Fender guitars and other equipment so more Ranchers could benefit from Doug's gift of music.

After that initial connection with the Youth

Ranches, Doug decided to save coins throughout the year. Last year his savings amounted to around \$60; this year he brought in over \$75. The year-long process of collecting coins keeps his mind and heart on these deserving boys and girls.

Sadly, Doug's beloved wife of 50 years died in August of 2002, but his children are nearby. Douglas, Jr. owns an engineering firm in Pasco County, and daughter Michelle lives with her husband and son in Ft. Walton.

Building a Strong Work Ethic

At the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, we believe it is good for a child to display a positive attitude as they develop good work habits.

any of the children living at the Ranch have never been taught some of the basic Lvalues that relate to their future ability to earn a living. No matter what our minds can achieve, we must all learn to respect authority as we

work for a supervisor, cooperate with a positive attitude as we work with others and perform with quality as we do a good job at the task we have been given. These basic concepts are woven into the work program at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

We believe work is different than chores. Everyone in the cottage must share the chores (making the bed, helping in the kitchen, cleaning the bathroom, etc.) that will ensure the home runs smoothly. These are a daily part of life and there is no allowance given to do what is expected of everyone.

A job or work program is a bit different. As each child participates in the work program, they begin to demonstrate responsibility and explore opportunities to earn a wage. Initially, a youngster starts off on the "Cottage Crew." Typically, these are

youth who have just come to the Ranch or are in need of direct supervision. The Cottage Parents assign them duties in and around the cottage such as mowing the lawn or cleaning windows. The base salary for these jobs is 75 cents per hour.

Once a child has proven he or she can report to work on time, handle basic instructions and do a quality job, the youngster is eligible to apply for other jobs on campus. These may involve working in the office, with the maintenance staff, at the farm or at



other on-campus work sites that interest the child. They must complete a job application and go for an interview, just like a "real" job.

Youngsters receive performance evaluations and feedback on their work habits and skills. During these formal meetings, they are eligible to receive a promotion for a job well done. Of course, like all real jobs - if performance is poor or tardiness is a problem, they may also experience a demotion, reduction in pay or even be "fired" and have to return to the Cottage Crew.

Ultimately, as a teenager grows up at the Ranch, we want them to get a job in town. They are constantly preparing for a future of self sufficiency and productivity.


We also believe in teaching good money management habits that will hopefully establish a foundation for future fiscal responsibility. As each teenager earns a paycheck, ten percent of the money is set aside in a savings account in their name. Another portion is given to the youngster with an emphasis on tithing, and some is pure old "pocket change."

Amanda is working on a project and enjoys working indoors.

Each spending opportunity is an opportunity to teach our children about priorities. For instance, if a child wants to go to the local high school football game, he must know the admission fee and plan accordingly. Or if a particular pair of new shoes has caught the eye of a young lady, she must save her money to buy the special item.

As we help these youngsters become productive members of our community, the traditional value of "a days work for a days pay" is a vital part of our program. Each and every day, we seek ways to teach these boys and girls the value of a good day at work.







Reaching Out to Lend a Helping Hand




Willing Hands and Hearts

Great Fellowship and Fun






