> ody is a rambunctious 14 year old with oodles of extra energy. He moved to the Boys Ranch from Winter Haven about six months ago and is making the most of the opportunities given to him. "Yes, Ma'am, it's true." he says solemnly. "I've had a rocky past, but now," as a smile crosses his face, "I have an excellent future!"

What makes Cody think 'the Ranch is perfect for me?' "Everything, especially the farm," he claims. "I love the farm...the animals...the work...even the smell! It's a great place to be!"

Cody decided right away that he wanted to be involved with everything the farm program offers to the boys at the Ranch. He joined 4-H and made a commitment to show a heifer at the county fair.

Initially, he tried to work with a smaller calf. "It takes awhile for them to get used to you and my calf kept going in between other cows...I got my toes stepped on a few times so Mr. Dustin introduced me to a new cow that was a bit calmer.

Right away, I knew we would get along great! I called her Daisy because she had a big spot on her head," Cody claimed.

"As we work with cows for the fair, we want to get them on a halter then teach them to walk with you on a lead line. I got to the point where I could walk out into the field to get Daisy, put on the halter and lead her back up to the pen where we could practice showmanship.

Taking care of Daisy is a big responsibility. You have to feed, wash, groom and clip her to get ready for the show. At the fair, you have to keep your cow's area clean and scoop up any mess right away – even if it's not from your cow!!! If you have a shovel nearby, you are responsible for cleaning it up."

While Cody enjoys his time at the farm, he knows it is just one part of life at the Ranch. He is also working to improve his behavior. "I know I must be obedient...do everything I am told to do and not mess with anybody or pick any fights. I also have to get good grades in school. That part is easy!" And, Cody thought the fair was an exciting, "pretty cool" experience. He and Daisy won a 5th place ribbon! He enjoyed the experience so much that he plans on entering the Columbia County Fair next fall.







Rodeo Tickets for the Ranch

Several thousand dollars was raised to help them continue their journey of success. With YOUR HELP Aurora Cottage is Ready to GO!

Aurora Cottage at the Youth Ranch in Bradenton/Sarasota was built in 1990 through the generosity of the Aurora Foundation. Typically, eight to ten youngsters have lived in the cottage with cottage parents and supportive staff over the past 15 years. With an average stay of about one year, over 150 boys have called Aurora their home.

With the help of some very generous donors, we enclosed the porch to create an office, recreation room and foyer; re-worked the duct work and installed a new air conditioning system; remodeled all bathrooms, added tile; built a special utility room to securely store chemicals and cleaning supplies; adjusted staff accommodations; added another pantry; expanded several bedrooms (turning single rooms into double occupancy and made room for one more bed overall) and replaced dry plaster walls with more durable plywood walls.

Sometimes, it doesn't seem like much, but these renovations make a huge difference in the day to day living at Aurora Cottage. Several special donors stepped up to help us fund this major renovation project. On behalf of the boys who now call Aurora their home, we express special appreciation to:



What a great feeling...to know you are expected, needed and welcome. This is the joy we want every child to experience when they arrive at camp. It is a great feeling


to be accepted, wanted and loved.



Would You Like to Help Support the Children in Our Care? Consider donating your vehicle to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches!

What will the Youth Ranches do with the vehicle I donate?

If the vehicle is in very good to excellent condition and it is suitable for use in the program, it may be assigned to the Ranch for use. Otherwise, vehicles are sold at public auction. Proceeds from auctions provide operational funds for services for needy boys and girls.

Can you pick up the vehicle or do I need to bring it to you?

We will be happy to arrange a convenient time to pickup the vehicle wherever located in the state of Florida.

What requirements must be met to donate my vehicle?

- A signed Donor Information Form returned to us (Form is mailed to you after phone contact)
- Must have a clear title in donor's name
- Vehicles in fair to excellent condition are accepted. Due to the cost involved for pickup and disposal, vehicles that do not have a fair market value of at least \$500 or that are in poor condition are not accepted.
- Unless the car is a collectible or is in excellent condition, cars older than 1985 model year are not acceptable.

How much of a charitable contribution deduction will I receive for my donation?

The American Jobs Creation Act of 2004 changed the regulations surrounding tax deductibility of donations of motor vehicles, boats and airplanes. To take a charitable contribution deduction for the gift of your vehicle, you must itemize your deductions on Schedule A of your Form 1040. For vehicles which are used in program, the "fair market value" which takes into consideration the condition and mileage of the vehicle may be taken as a deduction. For vehicles that are sold, the deduction is limited to the greater of \$500 or the gross sales proceeds.

If the car is sold, the Youth Ranches will notify the donor of the gross sales proceeds within 30 days of the sale of the vehicle. The written acknowledgement, or in some cases Form 1098 C, is required by IRS and may need to be included with the donor's tax return. In addition, the charitable contribution deduction is taken in the year in which the vehicle is donated, even if it is sold in a later year.

How do I notify you that I want to donate my vehicle?

Please note: The American Jobs Creation Act of 2004 contains new rules pertaining to the charitable deduction allowed for vehicles donated to a qualified charity after December 31, 2004. Basically, this law limits the donor's tax deduction to \$500, <u>or</u> the gross proceeds from the sale of the vehicle, if over \$500. We recognize that each individual's tax situation is different and the impact of any charitable deduction is based on a variety of circumstances. You are strongly encouraged to consult with your independent tax advisor.


