President's Perspective

It is certainly not news to anyone reading this perspective that our nation is in the midst of the worst economic downturn

since the Great Depression. The collapse of banks and financial institutions, decline in the stock market and property values, and loss of over 8 million jobs have put a severe strain on everyone. Although there have been some hopeful signs on the horizon, it looks like we are facing a long recovery period.

The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches entered this recession in excellent financial shape. We were debt free and had diligently put money into savings during the good years when charitable giving was strong. Our conservative financial policies had allowed us to increase the number of children we were serving while keeping our expenses as low as possible.

As our donors began to suffer the effects of poor earnings on their investments and the fear which accompanied the economic crisis, the flow of charitable gifts to the Youth Ranches began to decline. During the past three years, gifts from individuals, corporations, foundations and special events have all seen major reductions. Along with this, we have also experienced a sharp decline in the number and value of gifts left to the Youth Ranches through our donor's estate plans.

Due to the fact we had built up some savings over the years, we were able to use these reserves to fill the gap between our revenue and expenses. This enabled us to keep all of our cottages open and other services to kids and families at full level. We felt this was important since the need for our services had increased dramatically as the economy worsened. In the past three years, we have used two-thirds of our savings and have realized these will be depleted soon if we do not make significant reductions in our expenses. We have also cut back expenses in many ways including all of our Youth Ranches employees (except Cottage Parents) taking a day off without pay each month since February of 2009.

In our projections for next fiscal year's budget which will begin October 1, we are projecting a \$2.2 million deficit between revenue and expenses. A special meeting of our Board of Directors was held to grapple with this problem and some agonizing decisions were made to reduce staff and services to youth and families. These reductions will include closing five

of our residential cottages, eliminating over 30 staff positions and putting a number of additional cuts in place to reduce the deficit and stretch our reserves for a longer period of time.

This temporary closing of five cottages includes two at the Boys Ranch in Live Oak and one each at our programs in Bradenton/Sarasota, Safety Harbor and Bartow. The impact of this will be 50 less beds available for boys and girls at a time when we have youngsters waiting for our help. Parents have already been contacted and informed it may be six months or longer before a bed is available for their child.

During the past few months, I have spoken to a number of our donors at various events around the state. The most common question I have heard is "What does it cost to keep a cottage open for a year?" That number is around \$200,000 which covers the cost of staff, food, utilities, clothing and the many other expenses needed to care for and educate ten boys or girls. There is no doubt that it is expensive to provide round-the-clock care, which includes counseling, education and training for young people, but we have always believed it is better to spend this when they are young rather than to spend it in the criminal justice system when they get older.

Our immediate goal is to provide high quality care and services to as many boys and girls as our finances allow. The next goal is to figure out a way to get those closed cottages open again so we can serve the 50 children who will not have this opportunity to get their lives going in the right direction without our help.

We have an incredibly faithful donor family who has stuck with us in good times and bad. I know each of you have been affected by this recession and have done what you can to help. For that, I am grateful. For the past few months I have been overwhelmed with the idea of trying to raise the \$2 million needed to balance the budget.

On an early morning drive across the state, I began to think that if many people all made an effort, we could accomplish great things. \$2 million is only 2,000 people giving \$1,000 over and above what they normally would give. It is 4,000 people giving \$500 or 8,000 people giving \$250. There are 18 million people in the state of Florida and I believe there are enough who care deeply about children and the work the Youth Ranches has done for the past 53 years to keep these cottages open and say "Yes" rather than "No" to these children waiting for a place to live.

In closing, I would ask each of you to consider an additional gift to the Youth Ranches above and beyond what you would normally give. As additional funding comes in, we will reopen closed cottages and begin once again saying "Yes" to children who need a home.

My name is Kyle. I am 17 and a junior at Suwannee High School. I am proud to say I have a 3.2 GPA. The Ranch has been my home for the past three years. Sometimes it has seemed to be three long years. The issues I came here with were many. The things I needed most were missing in my life...like supervision, direction and someone to hold me accountable for my mistakes and support the things that were positive in my life.

In hindsight, my first six months were less than positive. Going from "me, myself and I" now I had Cottage Parents, a Unit Director, a Therapist, Teachers and a Boss at work...all wanting me to succeed! The things I once lacked were now a part of my everyday life. Before coming to the Boys Ranch, I never had consistent direction. This was an eye opening experience to say the least! I

soon learned to make my bed, tuck in my shirt and follow directions...and that was just the start of the changes in my life!

As my time passes here at the Boys Ranch, I have just begun to realize the impact the Ranch has had on me. Where before I just acted regardless of the consequences, now I think about what I am doing before I act. For example, we were repairing a fence line at the farm and, to be honest, we were doing a half-hearted job and it showed. Mr. Jeff, the Farm Manager told us we would redo this fence until it was right. It took us pulling fenceposts out of the ground and redoing that fence five times, before we got it right. There are a lot of "do overs" at the Ranch because I can tell you I sure didn't arrive with that 3.2 GPA.

I have really progressed in school and now I have real direction. I want to go to college, and possibly become a Veterinarian. The farm program opened my eyes and gave me the opportunity to grow and find work I really enjoy. In 2009, I won the Tweed Horsemanship Trophy. I love breaking and training horses, working with cattle and team roping. I am going to be a senior next year and I am looking forward to graduation. One day, I want to own my own farm. It excites me to put my plans into action.


For Clint and his family, the frustration and anger was too much to handle. They needed help and the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches was there for them.

With the opportunity for a better life, Clint is eager to return home and begin his senior year back at his former high school. "I am ready for the challenge to prove myself and be a successful man!"







Bessie Ruth Calhoun Weil was born in Bradenton, FL in 1920. She was about nine years old when the Great Depression hit our country. Her childhood was not easy or carefree; she understood the word "struggle" far too early in her life.

In the 1940's, she joined the military and served as a First Class Petty Officer in the United States Coast Guard. She received the American Theater Medal and the Victory Medal for her commitment to our country during World War II.

Mrs. Weil earned her private pilot license in 1948 and loved to fly solo off the coast of St. Petersburg. She studied fervently and received a Master's Degree from the University of Florida. Professionally, Mrs. Weil handled editorial research for the St. Petersburg Times and taught high school history. She was quite an accomplished woman!

The lessons Mrs. Weil learned and the impact of the Great Depression during her childhood never left her memory. She was driven to achieve, worked diligently to protect her hard earned paycheck and preserve her assets. She also gave generously to those in need, especially young children who had it tougher than most... somehow, she understood their struggle and their pain.








