## ***A Smooth Ride to the End***

(MEANING GRADUATION FROM HIGH SCHOOL!)

**B**y the age of 13, Dillon had a choice to make. His parents, frustrated with his negative behavior, lying, cheating and trouble at school, narrowed down his options. He could either try to get accepted at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch or they would ship him out of state to a reform school.

The shock of his options got Dillon's attention. The idea of being so far away from home did not impress him, so he chose the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

The Youth Ranch is a residential education program for teens between the ages of 8-18. There is a school on campus to help those who are behind and trained staff available 24/7 to help angry teens work through their problems. It is voluntary and youth have to WANT to be there and make a commitment to work on improving themselves and their behavior.

When a youth enters the Ranch, a youth growth plan is established with goals in a variety of areas: physical, emotional,



vocational, academic, spiritual, and recreational. This helps identify challenges and provides a sense of measured accomplishment as the youth progresses at the Ranch. For Dillon, he needed help with anger control, appropriate behavior and school work.

Dillon's original plan was first written four years ago. It has been revised and refocused over the years but Dillon, now 17, can proudly say, "I have achieved every goal I have set, especially in school. I was able to gain two grades in one calendar year. I will be a senior next year and currently have a 2.8 GPA. I am back on track and plan to have a 'smooth ride until the end!'" (meaning graduation from high school!)

me I am not acting my age and can make better choices – it settles me down. I am trying not to "talk back" to others. I am learning to accept and follow through on instructions and see things through to the end... doing a job right makes all the difference in the world!"

Dillon has lived with us long enough to recognize that much of what the Ranch offers has been provided through the generosity of donors. "I appreciate them so much. This place wouldn't be here without

"Now my goals include improving the relationship with my parents and working on my independent living skills. I want to live on my own and that means I have to cook, clean, pay bills and pay taxes. I am going to be a good man!"

Dillon is also working to obtain his driver's license. "First, you need to get learner's permit. Here at the Ranch, I know we have to do the right thing the right way," he said with confidence.

"I am trying to be a leader on campus...I even have received some compliments from my teacher Mr. Sinibaldi. He encourages us to try our hardest every day!

My Cottage Pops, and other staff like Mr. Dean, Mr. John and Mr. D all help keep me on the right path. When I begin to stray, they use a code word which reminds

So far so good, everything seemed to be fairly

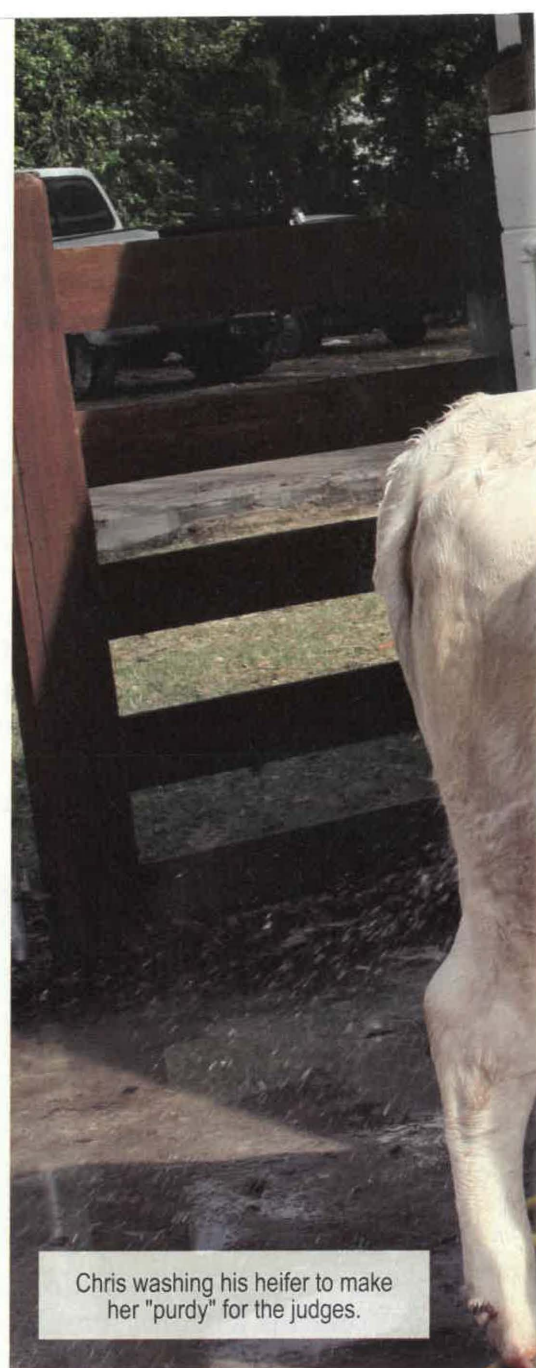

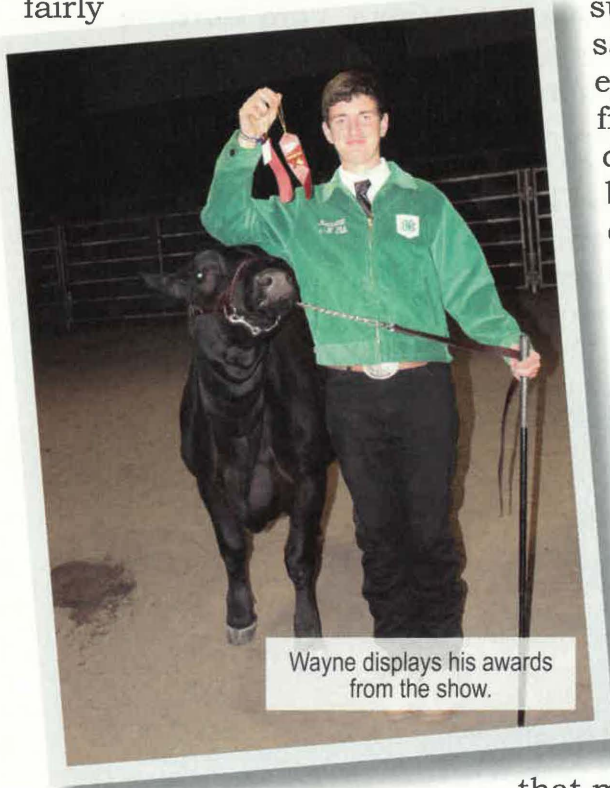

Chris washing his heifer to make her "purdy" for the judges.

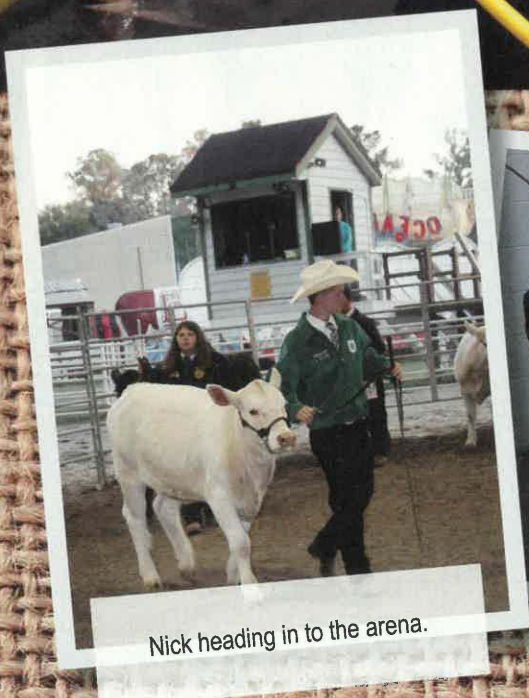


Wayne displays his awards from the show.

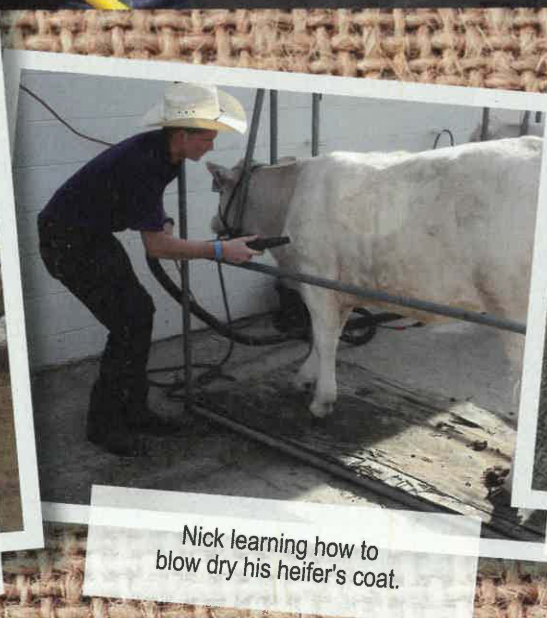
standard behavior, proper progression toward the big show. But then one day Assistant Farm Manager

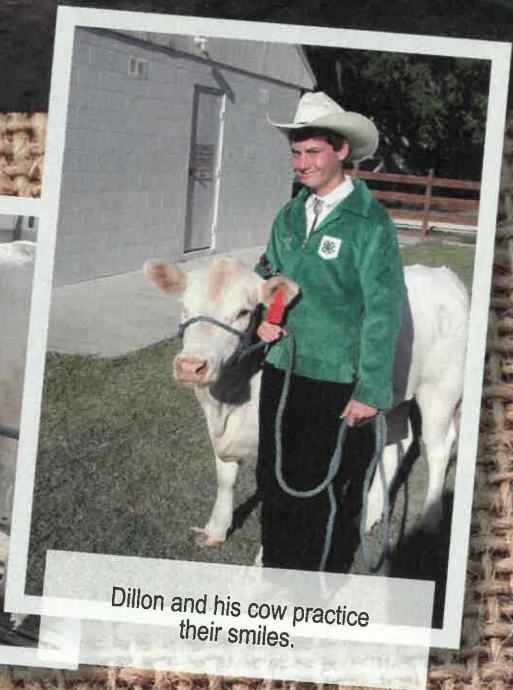




Nick heading in to the arena.

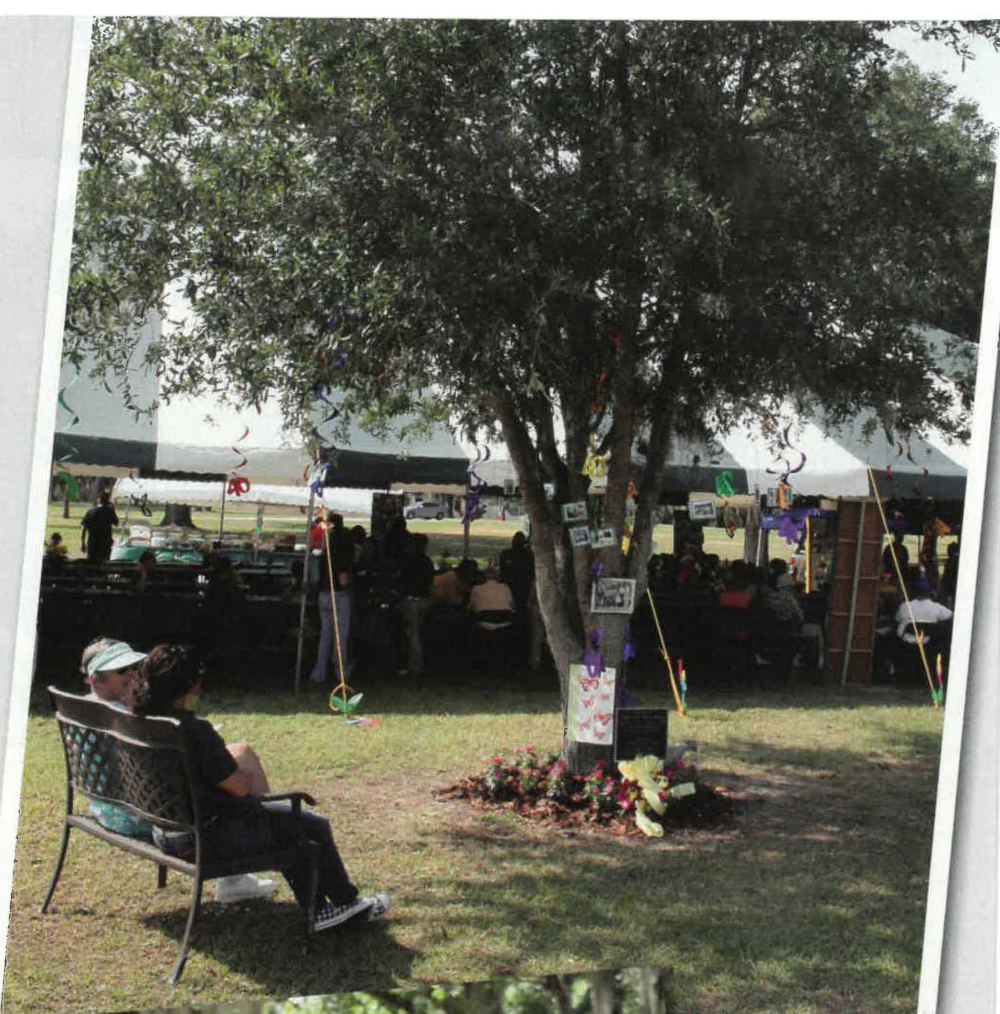

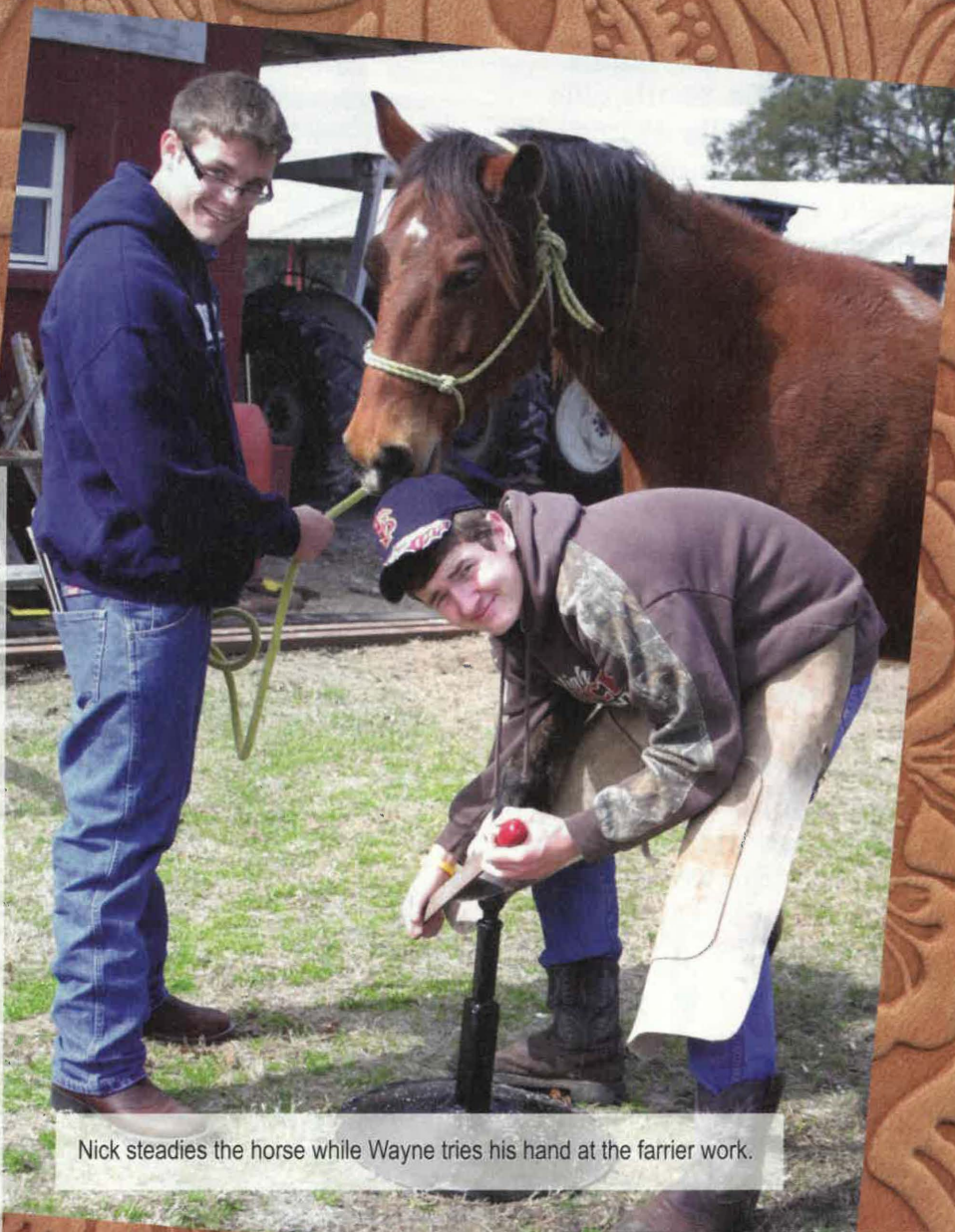


# Working Hard, Saving Money!

RANCHERS LEARN VALUABLE SKILLS FROM EXPERIENCED FARRIERS.

Recently the Van Ness Farm at the Boys Ranch held a farrier clinic to teach the boys how to trim and maintain the horses' hooves. The day began in the classroom as the boys learned about the anatomy and structure of a horse's leg and hoof. Discussions included the concept of how the animal travels and why a trimmed foot can enhance comfort and performance.

Next the boys were given basic training in the types and use of the tools used in farrier and blacksmith work. Finally, the group went outside and received



Nick steadies the horse while Wayne tries his hand at the farrier work.

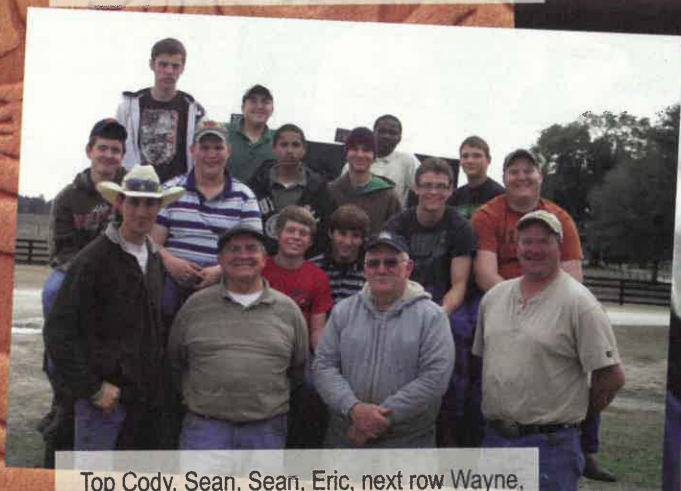
some hands on training and coaching from some experts. Rip Kennedy, a mentor of our Farm Manager Jeff Parker has been a farrier and horse trainer for over 50 years. Danny Terry of Pilot Park, TX is one of the top farriers in the nation and is often flown across the country to care for the special needs of a high valued horse. We were honored to have both men instruct our boys in this vocation.

By teaching the boys these skills and allowing them to help care for the herd of 50 horses at the Ranch, we believe we will save several thousand dollars in farrier fees. Working under the careful eye of our staff, these young men have the opportunity to help save the Ranch money and develop an experience base that could evolve into part time or full time work in the future.

A few years ago, things in Nick's life were going well. He was a young teenaged Motocross champion and loved to take risks. Nothing could stop him as he flew high over the hills on his motor cycle... until the crash. Then, the world as he knew it began to fall apart.

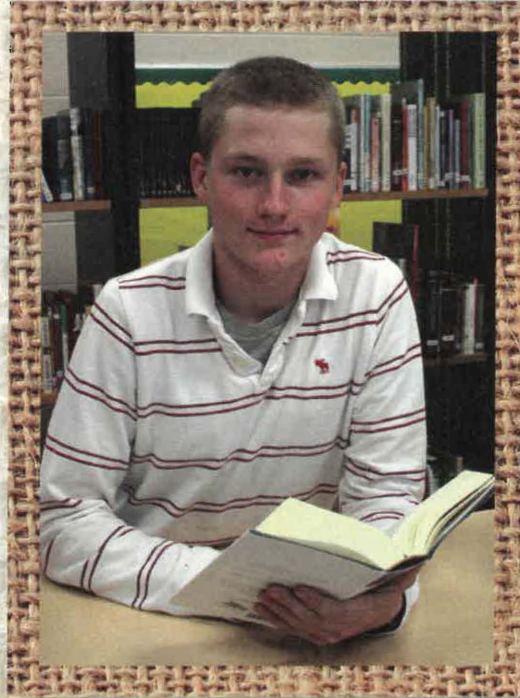
Three months in a wheelchair, his parents' divorce, a move to a new town, a blended family and many other challenges all contributed to the anger and frustration which boiled over in his world. Nothing was right anymore, the accident had changed everything!

Living with his father, the two began to butt heads. Nick's grades fell and his attitude reflected his unhappiness. His Dad made contact with the local Sheriff who recommended Nick to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch.

Nick was skeptical. He visited the ranch – saw the neatly mowed grass and fine brick houses. It seemed a little too perfect. Was it really as good as people said?

During the tour, Nick asked, "Who took care of mowing the grass?" And just where were the other boys who lived here? He quickly learned the answer. The boys mow the grass and help with the other chores around campus. If they do the job well, they often go off campus to the springs or other enjoyable Saturday afternoon activities. Nick saw the gym, swimming pool and farm. He thought living on the Ranch might just be a once in a lifetime opportunity.

"The Sheriffs Boys Ranch was a chance for me to sort some things out...get a hold

changes in my life," said Nick, now 16. "I have lived here for almost a year and for the most part, it is what it appeared to be... the chance to make a turn for the best!"

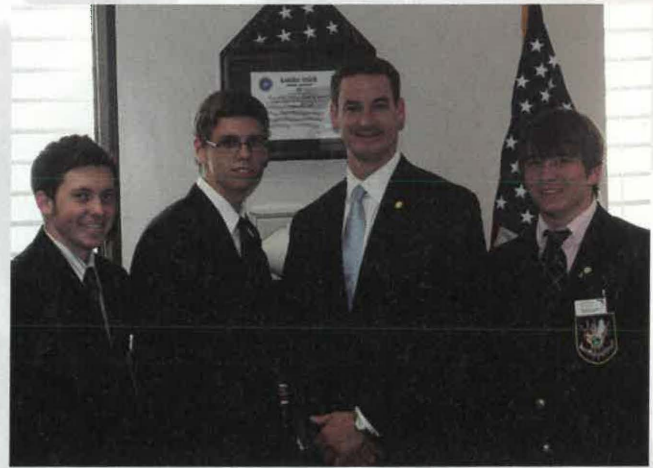
"Home is much better now. I have more respect for dad. We don't argue as much. I think my dad would say I have made 'gi-normous' progress."

Reflecting back, Nick realizes he use to just settle for things – bad grades, bad attitude...he was just a victim of what happened to him. The Boys Ranch staff showed him a new way of thinking. They encouraged him not to settle for less but to strive for more. "In school, C's and D's are not good enough when you can achieve A's and B's," Nick stated. At work, you don't just get the job done, you get it done right! The Boys Ranch has taught me so much and I am grateful for the chance to grow up here!"

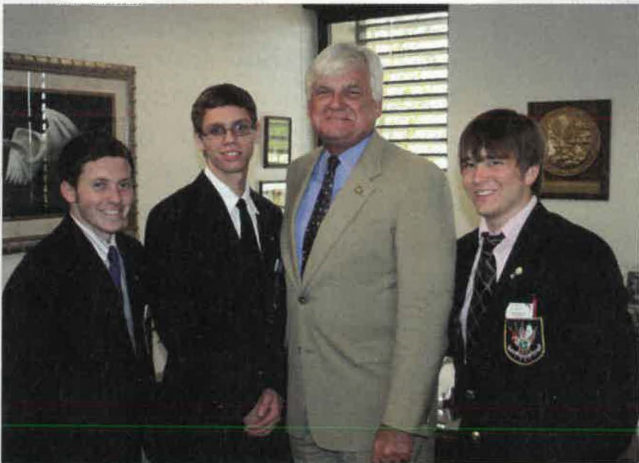

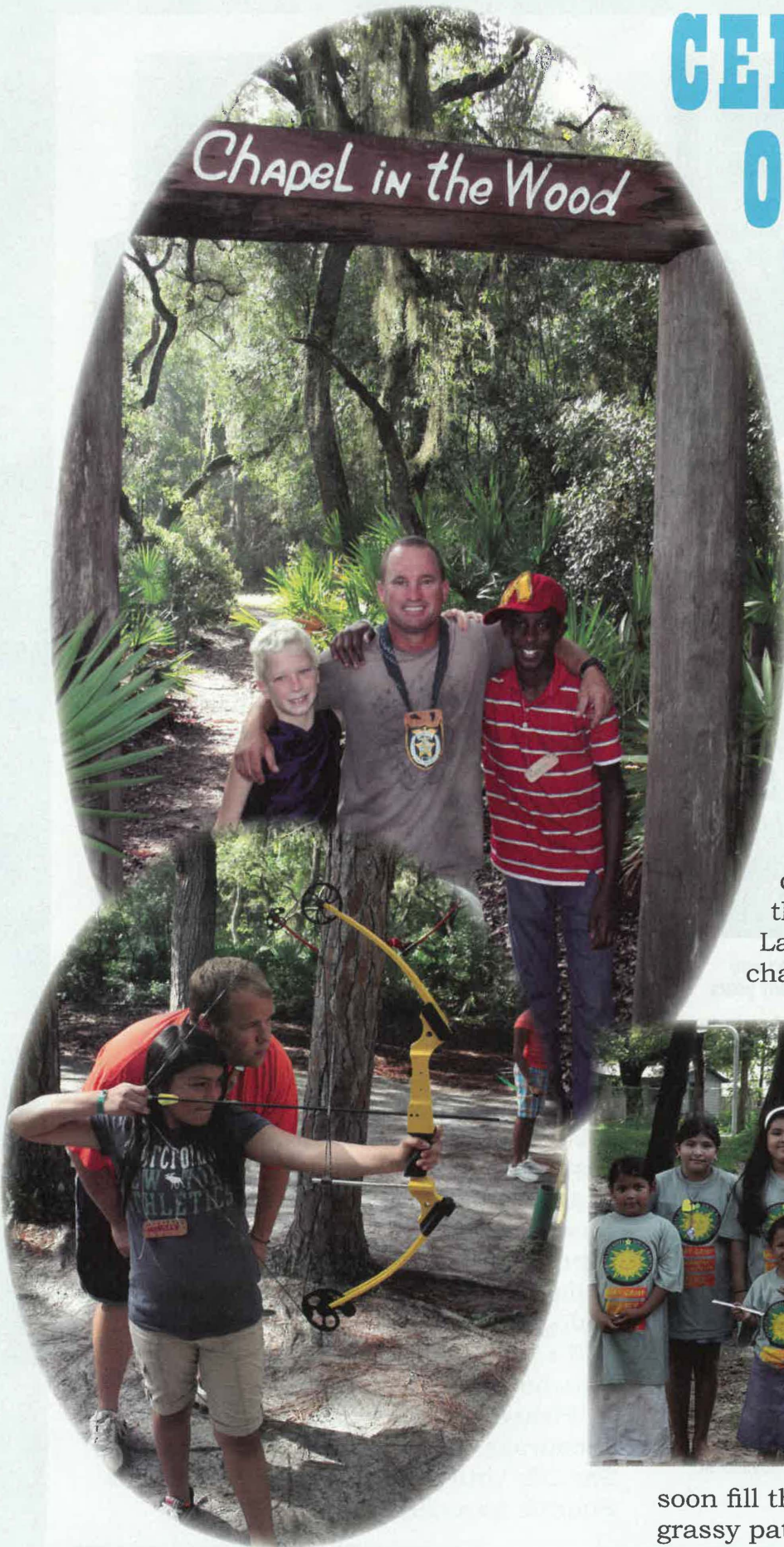


# CELEBRATING OUR CHILDREN!

It is summer... so the temperatures do rise, but a cool dip in the crystal clear pool, a run through the sprinkler or a canoe ride

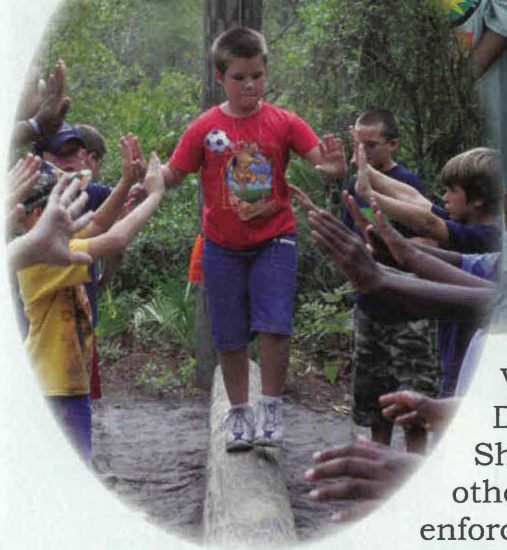


on the lake always adds to the fun and excitement of summer camp.

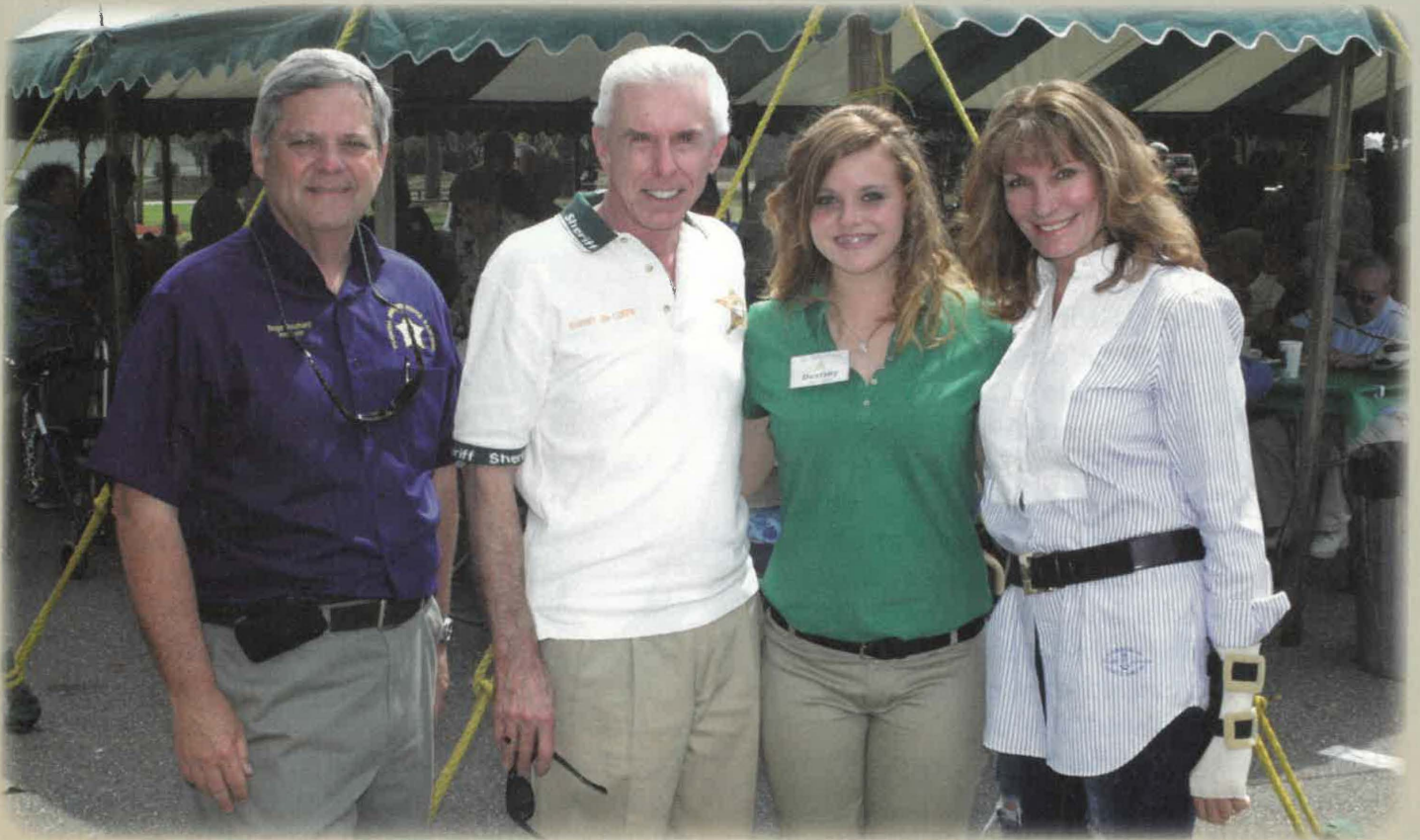

She took to gardening, horseback riding, sports and even school. Moving from B's and C's, she focused on her grades and recently made the A honor roll!

Jennifer really admires Ms. Wiggins, one of her teachers at the Youth Villa school. "She supported me when things got tough and she opened my eyes in so many ways. Until I came here, I never knew there was a public library. All those books...free, just for me! It was like I found a whole new world. I checked out some books on drawing, read them and tried it. Now, nearly two years after her move, Jennifer is a happy, well adjusted young teen. "I am much calmer now. I understand why my dad has to be away and I look forward to the visits with my grandparents. For now, the Youth Villa is home."

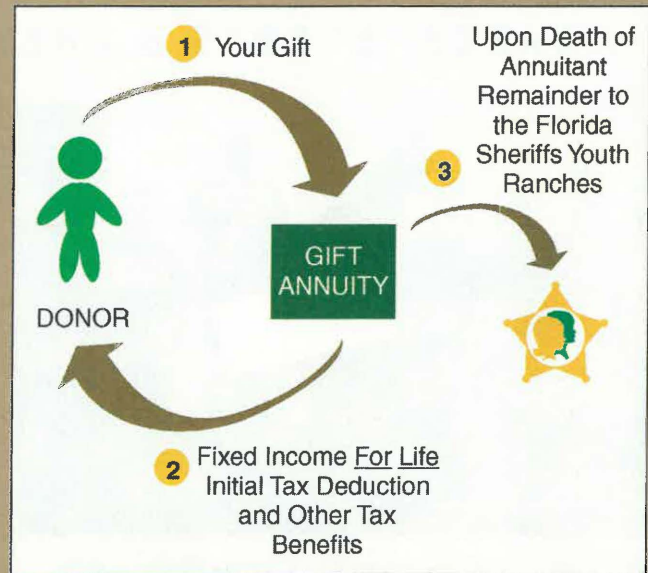

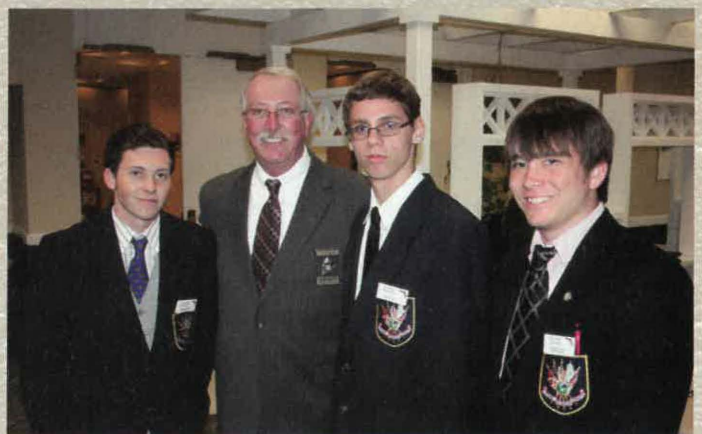

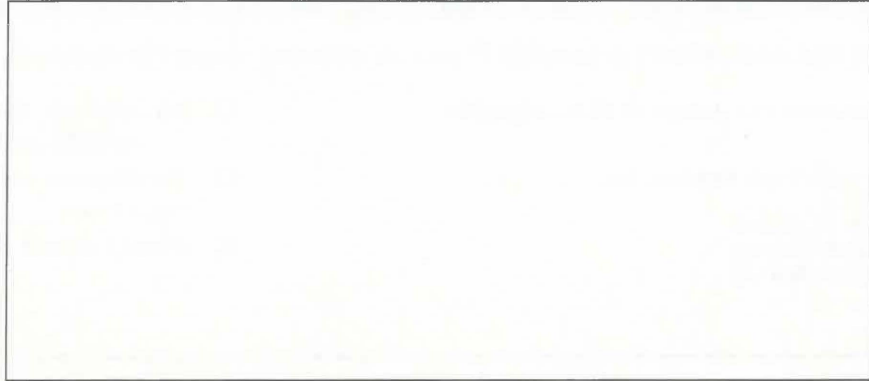
