# Hearing the Laughter

I was thinking about summer camp a while back and one particular incident arose to the top of my thoughts and has stayed with me now for weeks. The more I thought about it, the more I wanted to share it, so I hope you enjoy this very true story.

In 1989, I was promoted from Family Social Worker to the position of Summer Camp Director. My duties included many things, such as overseeing Youth Camp where our summer programs were held and recruiting staff and volunteer Deputies. In the off-season, I helped with building maintenance, upkeep of the grounds, purchasing supplies and developing new curriculum. I also spent time learning new camp songs and camp jokes, because everyone knows that summer camp is simply not camp without songs, stories and jokes!

It was in my second year that I began telling the story of the “Wide-Mouth Toad.” It was actually more of a joke that I had heard before from one of our previous summer camp counselors. Since he was no longer with us at camp, I thought I would give it a try. Now, to tell this joke, you had to be able to open your mouth really wide; I mean really, *really* wide—kind of like when the dentist tells you to “open wide” but wider. Before telling the joke, I began loosening my jaws by slowly opening and closing my mouth, getting a little wider each time, until I was loose enough to say the words with my mouth wide open.

Now I am not going to tell you the full joke; just a portion of it, with the punch line at the end. It goes like this;

Once upon a time there was a little wide-mouth toad and she was a new momma. Being a new

momma, she did not know what to feed her babies, so she thought she would ask the other animals. First she went to the momma cow and said (and this is where you open your mouth really wide), “Momaaaaaaa Cowwww, what do you feed your babies?” The momma cow says (in a regular way), “Why, I feed my babies fresh milk.” The little wide-mouth toad with a very wide mouth says, “Thank you very, very much!” She then goes to a horse, a bird and a hippopotamus asking them all the same question with her mouth open very, very wide.

Finally she thinks she heard enough, but, on her way back to her babies, she comes across a momma snake, so she asks once again with her very big wide mouth what the momma snake feeds her babies. The reply is, “Why, I feed my babies little wide-mouth toads!” Upon hearing this, the little toad clenches her lips closed, says, “Thank you very, very much” and hops quickly away.

While the joke is just a silly little story, it is the reaction you get from the kids as you open your mouth really wide to say the words of the little “wide-mouth toad”.

After telling the joke for the first time, I was approached by a Deputy who also happened to be one of my very best friends. David came over to my office and, with a very serious look on his face and with concern in his voice, said to me, “Bill, you do realize that the kids were laughing *at* you and not with you.” My reply was a simple yes. He then asked with sincerity, “Why would you want someone laughing at you?” Here is my reply.

“David, I want you to think about something—take some time and really think about it. The children who are often here at our summer camp come from some of the most devastating backgrounds you can imagine. Some are from very poor families, some have been abandoned and are living with a relative, a few have recently lost a parent, and some have been abused. This, in many ways, will be the only opportunity they have to escape

the realities that face them every day in their young lives. While some might have the opportunity to come live at one of our residential programs, many will simply return to a home in turmoil and poverty.” I went on to say that I did not care if they laughed with me or at me; I just wanted them to laugh!

As I write this down, tears are streaming down my face. The memories of summer camp are all too clear. The tears are not from sadness, but from the memories of hearing the laughter of children and the joy it still brings me.

You see, each year, we get the chance to give children in need the opportunity to be children, to help with creation of positive memories that we hope will carry them through when life gets too difficult and they need a brief escape. Maybe they will remember a Summer Camp Director telling a silly joke and how funny he looked when telling it. If they do, I hope it makes them smile and remember the good times they had during their week at camp.

Each year, we help thousands of children obtain something that, for many, would simply be unattainable: a week at one of our camping programs where they learn new games, canoe, swim, work on arts and crafts, and much more. Songs are sung, stories and jokes are told, and laughter is constant. They come to realize that our counselors and volunteer deputies really care and many, for the first time, are able to form a connection, a bond with an adult.

All of this happens because our donor family provides the resources to give children the chance to come to camp.

Thank you for giving so many children the opportunity to experience joy and laughter this summer!

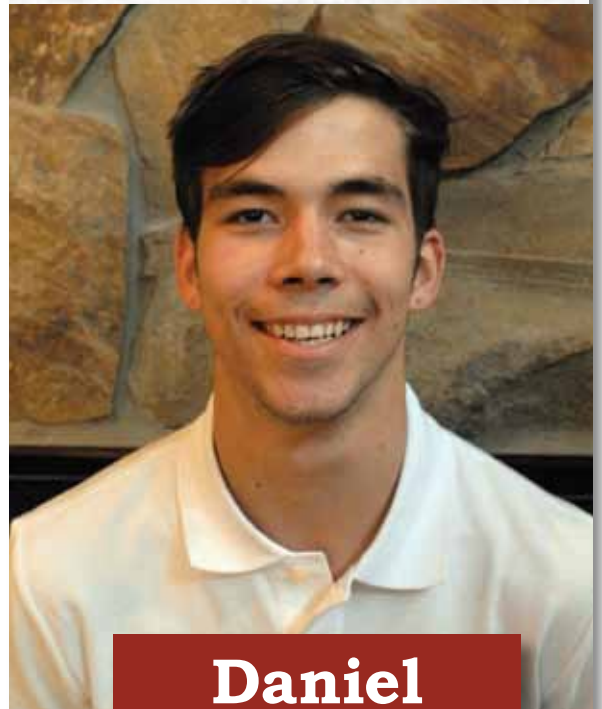

# Becoming Makenzie

**Makenzie was the featured Rancher speaker at this year's Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch Bradenton - Sarasota Open House. Makenzie courageously spoke about her life at the Ranch. This is her story.**

Hello, and welcome to the lovely place I call home, the Youth Ranch. My name is Makenzie and I am 13. I have lived at the Ranch for seven months. I go to a community school and I am in the seventh grade.

This program has had a positive impact on me and my three siblings, Jaxon, Serenity and Trinity. Eight months ago, when I lived with my mom, I was playing the role my mom should've been doing.

When I got into the "system," as they call it, I was at a group home in St. Petersburg. Unlike here, they didn't help me resist the urge to parent my siblings. With the help of our amazing staff, Ms. Jenna, Mr. Javony, Ms. Iris, Mr. Jason, our cottage parents Mr. and Mrs. Brewer, our therapist Mr. Mark, and Mr. Doug, I am slowly becoming just their older sister.

I have also conquered, with staff help, upsetting stages of being a 13 year-old in foster care, but the moments I share with everyone are memories I keep and will always keep in my heart. My first connections with staff; my tantrums and how even after they still forgive me; how anytime I need someone to cry to, I know that they are there. There will never be one memory forgotten, even embarrassing moments, scary moments and upsetting moments. Not even any tantrum I've thrown about little things like chores.

Another thing they help me with is school. I have become a more successful student since being in the program. I know I have plenty of people there to help me with school-work.



The Ranches are healthy environments for children. Long after I leave, long after I've gone to college, I'll remember how the Ranches showed me how to be a child.

I plan to conquer school, crush college and, since I'm inspired so much by staff, apply for a job that deals with kids. I don't know if I will or not, but I do know that 20 years from now, I'll remember my experience at the Youth Ranches. I'll remember how generous people that worked here are. This was a life-changing experience and I thank you for your contribution. ★

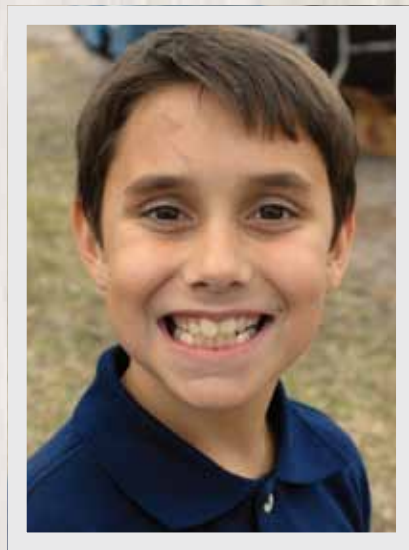
The rain did not scare away these brave souls! A driving tour of the camp was still in order even though the rain came.

# Clay – Overcoming Hurt to Gain Healing

**T**he middle-school years of a young person's life are sometimes difficult. The combination of growing up and wanting more freedom and responsibility, but still needing to learn, more often puts parents and children at odds. Families find that how they have functioned for years all of a sudden isn't working. Clay's family found themselves in that position.

Clay's parents had been divorced for years. He lived with his dad and step-mom, whom he loved, but those challenging middle-school years came and the relationship changed.

Clay began rebelling at school. He challenged authority and had a chip on his shoulder. His dad traveled a lot for work. This left a growing young man who needed his father's guidance in a position of struggle. It began to affect his relationship with his step-mom. Clay and his dad were at odds when his dad was at home.

Living in Pinellas County, the Wick family knew about the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. Their Sheriff was very active with the organization and suggested to Clay's dad that maybe they needed a break from each other. Clay and his dad were encouraged to explore the Boys Ranch.

Clay brought his hurts with him. He felt like he was being abandoned at a time when he needed his dad the most. He couldn't see that his behavior was damaging his future and his father was trying to save that future.

Clay made it to the Boys Ranch in Live Oak and did not expect the life he found there. The expectations for working, performing in school, having fun and attending chapel were laid out before him. "The daily structure set the tone for how life should be," Clay said.

Before Clay realized it, he found himself on grade

level with better-than-average grades. He was a member of the football team that won the state play-offs the three years he was at the Boys Ranch. Clay also wrestled and the team won the state cup.

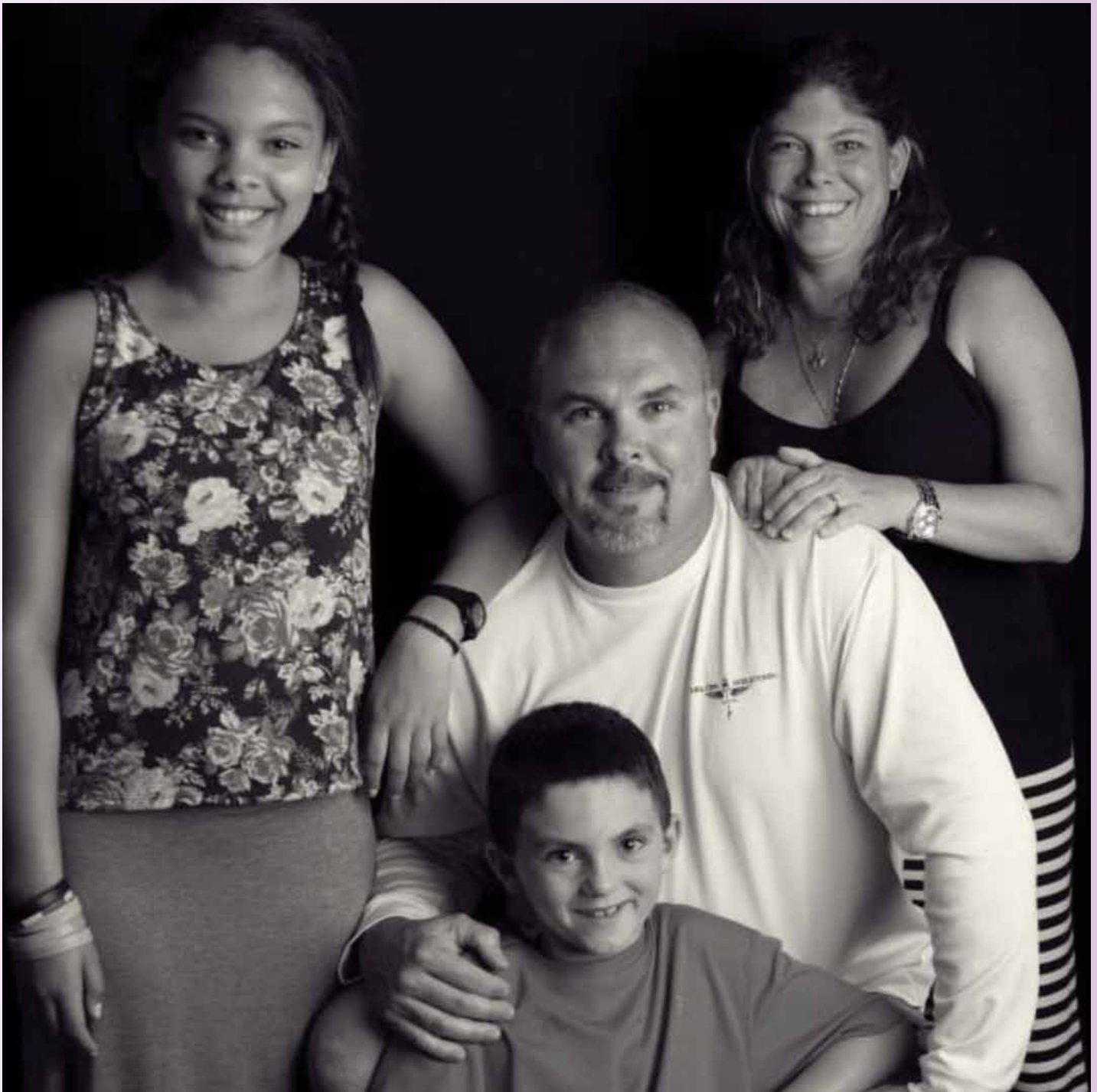
Soon, Clay began to think of the Boys Ranch as home. The relationships he built on campus showed him could rebuild relationships with his family.

After he graduated, Clay became a firefighter, but found his true calling in the building/site development industry. Clay is a project manager for a high end residential construction company serving the entire state of Florida.

Clay and his wife, Keri, have two beautiful children. Clay and his parents continue to work on their relationship and it is better than it has been in years.

As an adult, Clay reflects on his time at the Boys Ranch. "I learned to take care of the people who take care of you," he says. "We all need a sounding board. Teenagers need to find that person and build a relationship to help them through the tough times with their parents."

The Youth Ranches philosophy was



embedded in Clay. “I definitely developed a solid work ethic and appreciate hard work. I do find myself having to balance work and home.” His wife, Keri, agrees with Clay’s statement.

When Keri is asked what impact in his life she sees from his time at the Boys Ranch she says, “Clay is very family-oriented, and meals together are extremely important to him.”

As the conversation comes to an end,

Clay gets a wistful look on his face. “If it wasn’t for the Ranch, I wouldn’t be in the position I am in today. It was a big help to my life.”

Clay is one example of a life changed. His beautiful family and career are a testament to the ideals taught at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. Thank you to each and every one of you who helped ensure Clay had hope for his future! ★

# Changing Programs, Changing Lives

Since 1957, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches has run very successful residential care homes. Starting in 1982, the Youth Ranches has run overwhelmingly popular summer camps. We have now developed a hybrid of these two successful programs! The Youth Ranch Bradenton-Sarasota is a full-time residential campus. This year, we added elements to enable us to host summer day camps for the community.

We find that challenge courses are an integral part of the camping experience. They provide robust opportunities to learn

communication, cooperation, and how to trust others. We are grateful to the Linnie Dalbeck Foundation for making these additions to the campus possible.

The Foundation funded these elements in memory of Mrs. Dalbeck and Mr. Craig Morrison.

One of Mrs. Dalbeck's first gifts to the Youth Ranches was in honor of her father, Mr. Frank Ellis. She wished her donation to be used to purchase books for the Boys Ranch Library because her father established the first library in Beachmont, MA at the Bradstreet Avenue School. Over

the years, her generosity and dedication has helped the Youth Ranches to flourish.

Thanks to the generosity of the Linnie E. Dalbeck Memorial Foundation, on April 20, 2002, we dedicated the pool and bathhouse at the Bradenton/Sarasota campus. Mrs. Dalbeck wished for her gifts to “be used for something that will add to the pleasures of the Bradenton boys at the Ranch.”

Over the past 16 years, the Linnie E. Dalbeck Memorial Foundation has continued to support the mission of the Youth Ranches. We are honored to recognize her generous spirit with the addition of the Edventure Course named in her honor.

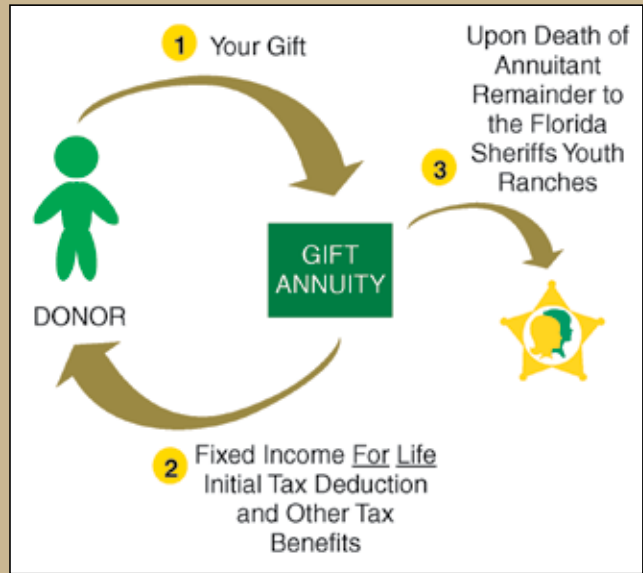

# Family Legacies Come in Many Forms

Visiting with different donors, we get ideas about how they want their family to be remembered. Some chose to leave all their money and property directly to their family, hoping they will continue to support favorite charities. Others have made specific plans to ensure their charitable wishes are followed.

Here are a few of the more creative ideas we have seen in recent years:

- Naming the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy, retirement account or bank account
- Specifying a particular percentage of your estate for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches OR the opposite, specifying a particular percentage or piece of property for your heirs and leaving the remainder of your estate to the Youth Ranches
- Investing in a charitable gift annuity where the remainder after death goes to the Youth Ranches
- Making a cash gift of \$1,000 or more to the Youth Ranches in honor of a family member and request they be made a Lifetime Honorary Member of the Florida Sheriffs Association
- Contributing a minimum of \$10,000 and creating a family named endowment fund at the Ranch



- Establishing a Charitable Remainder Trust where distributions (set amount or %) are made to family members for a period of years and once complete, the balance is donated to the Youth Ranches
- Establishing a Charitable Lead Trust where a distribution (% or set amount) is made to the Youth Ranches for a period of 10 or 20 years, then the balance is distributed to your heirs when they are older and better prepared to receive these funds

These are just a few options to consider. As always, we encourage you to discuss this with your personal attorney or advisors to chart the best course for your future and remember to update your will annually as things and people in your life change!

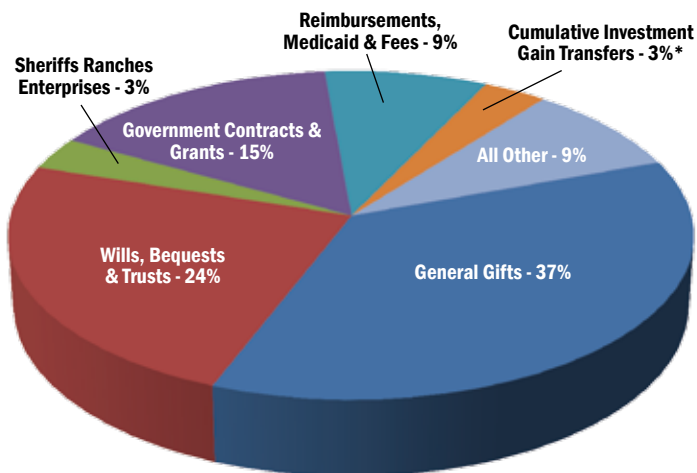

## Expenditures 2014 - 2015

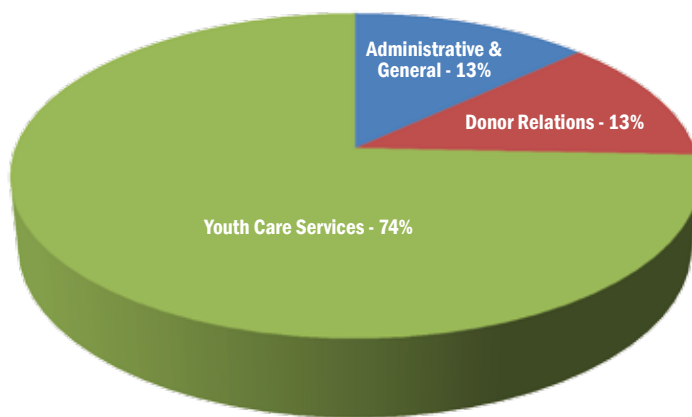

**Harmony in the Streets®** is a mobile camping program that brings the four “R’s” directly into local communities that may be socially and/or economically challenged. Our staff and law officer volunteers teach children to Respect Themselves, Respect Others, Respect their Community and Respect the Environment.

**Harmony in the Schools** is much like our Harmony in the Streets mobile camping program in that it brings the leadership, cultural understanding and team - building skills directly into the schools. It encourages building relationships between students and peers, as well as with school staff.

**Summer Camp** includes many therapeutic camping activities. Canoeing, archery, swimming, arts and crafts and other activities allow youth the opportunity to build basic teamwork and peer communication skills. 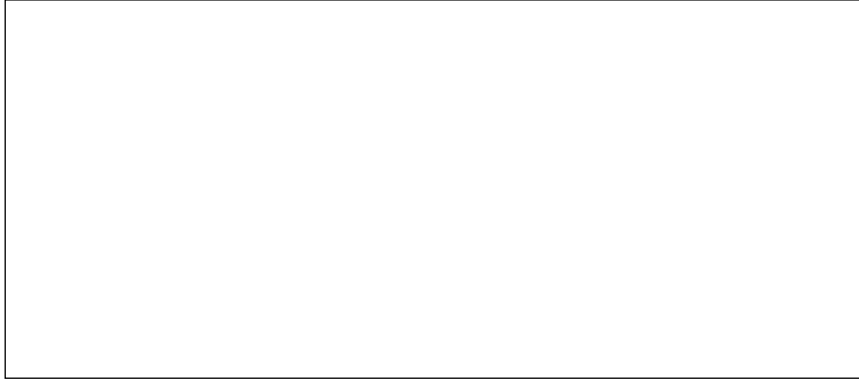
