


## While Celebrating Our Big 24th We Began Planning a Bigger 25th

he 24th Anniversary celebration at the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, October 2, 3, and 4, was a big success. Over 2,000 people came by to join in the fun and games. They broke all previous attendance records, but next year's party — our Silver Anniversary — is expected to be even bigger and better.

It ought to be. We actually began making preparations for it before the 1981 party was over, which puts us about eight months ahead of our usual schedule.

On Saturday morning, when the 1981 horse show was just getting into full swing, a camera crew was hard at work nearby filming some Ranchers and a 25th Anniversary cake that will be featured in television commercials during 1982.

Later in the weekend other symptoms of anniversary fever cropped up. Names of prospective speakers were tossed around; special events were suggested; and preliminary plans were made for a commemorative edition of THE RANCHER.


Clearly a gala celebration is being shaped up, and it will certainly have to be a super shindig to top this year's successful party.

The 1981 anniversary celebration began Friday night, October 2, when arriving guests gathered around big cast iron pots to partake of the traditional Boys Ranch welcome — a chicken pilau supper prepared over open campfires.

Guests bivouacked in motor homes, trailers and tents scattered around our pine shaded campground. They brought with them some 400 horses for various riding events scheduled in the arena.

A practice event was held Friday evening under the lights, and the horse show officially began Saturday morning, continuing through Sunday. Other anniversary events included a Suwannee River barbecue at noon on Saturday; tours of Boys Ranch facilities Saturday afternoon; the awarding of the Carleton F. Tweed Memorial Horsemanship Trophy to Rancher Bobby Vicenzi; and an outdoor worship service in the arena Sunday morning.

Good weather prevailed once again, as it has for all of the 24 years the Boys Ranch has been celebrating anniversaries.

The View from the Villa:

## Abby did it, Aloft and Alone!

We are proud of Abby Villanueva, the first Girls Villa girl to solo in an airplane. She did it on August 27, the day after her 16th birthday. Her next goal is to get a private pilot's license when she becomes eligible at 17.

Abby is one of 246 youngsters from the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa and Youth Ranch who have signed up for a flying scholarship program founded three years ago by Gerald Stevens, a Boca Raton man who is a member of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund Board of Directors.

All of the youngsters have been taken aloft for orientation flights, which is phase one of the scholarship program. Sixteen have entered phase two, which is ground school, but only two have soloed. Jeff Miller, who formerly lived at the Boys Ranch, was the first to solo.

Now that Abby has proven her ability to fly whithout an instructor aboard, she will be eligible for two hours of flight practice per week until she qualifies for her private pilot's license. If she continues her training beyond a private license, she will have to "work her way" by sharing in the cost.

Abby's solo is the top of the news from the Villa, but we also have other items of interest to report.

In September six girls and two staff members completed a water safety and basic rescue course presented at the Villa pool by the American Red Cross. Not a bad idea at all, considering how many times we go on camping trips or to beaches.

Classes at the Villa learning center seem to be getting progressively more interesting — especially now that we have some new audio-visual equipment and some attractive new books for our library.

Visitors in recent months included some people from Sheriffs' Departments who were involved in an orientation seminar. They wanted to become familiar with the operation of the Villa so they could answer inquiries from prospective donors.

Many visitors have commented about how pretty our campus looks. One reason it's looking so good is that we have a new tractor and mower, and five of the older girls have been trained to operate them. Suddenly our grounds maintenance crew has expanded, and the results are quite obvious.

## A Classic Example: Sports Event Has Raised Over \$130,000 For Villa

In 1963 some golfing buddies put together a modest little golf tournament at Bartow's Peace River Country Club to inject some zip into the Labor Day weekend.

Simultaneously, about 200 miles to the north, Sheriffs were struggling along in their efforts to help needy and worthy youngsters. They had established the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch on the banks of the Suwannee River, near Live Oak, and they were being urged to create a similar institution for girls.

Back there in 1963 the Sheriffs and golfers had absolutely nothing in common, but the vagaries of passing time were destined to eventually merge their schemes and dreams in a way that has been beneficial to all concerned.

By 1970 the Boys Ranch was prospering so well that the Sheriffs decided to move ahead with their plans to create a comparable home for girls. And, as luck would have it, they selected a site near Bartow, just two miles from the Peace River Country Club. They decided to call their new venture the Florida Sheriffs Girls Villa.

Meanwhile, the modest Bartow golf tournament of 1963 vintage had been prospering too. Aided by the sponsorship of Armour Agricultural Chemical Co., the event created mostly for home folks had begun to attract entries from throughout Florida and beyond. A tennis tournament and a junior golf tournament had been added. A press golf tournament and dinner had been created to draw media attention.

As the event expanded it outgrew the ability of a single sponsor to foot the bill. Other supporters were added until eventually seven sponsors and numerous patrons were sharing the financial burden.

The tournament was doing well financially, and with the advent of the Girls Villa as a new down-the-road neighbor, a decision was made to earmark a portion of the proceeds for the new institution. Thus, in 1970, the Bartow sportsfest became the Bartow Girls Villa Classic, and Sheriffs and golfers began to share a concern for the needs of unfortunate youngsters. This merger of objectives has been good for all concerned.

The Classic has grown steadily until it has become a major event on Florida's sports calendar. Its two-week fun and sports package now includes — in addition to the original events — a Miss Bartow beauty pageant; a women's team golf tournament; a welcome reception and dance; a fashion show and champagne lunch; and a Saturday night dinner-dance with big name entertainment.

The Girls Villa has also grown and progressed, aided substantially by financial help from the Classic. Since 1970 the Classic has raised over \$130,000 for the Villa. Moreover, it has generated much valuable publicity and good-will for the Sheriff-sponsored institution.


"When you get this kind of commitment, things happen," said Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund President Harry Weaver to a joint meeting of Bartow civic clubs during the 1981 Classic.

"You have given us added desire to do more for the boys and girls of this state," Weaver added. Then he disclosed that a currently proposed Youth Fund expansion program will include two more residence cottages at the Girls Villa.

## Health Care With Almost No Bills Helps to Cure Our Financial Ills

Scattered around Florida are some good guys in white coats who are trained to treat toothaches and tummyaches. Moreover, they also relieve our financial ills by seldom, if ever, sending us bills.

These are friends indeed, these doctors and dentists to whom we send our youngsters an average of 72 times per month. Some have said flat out that they will work for free; some simply get careless on purpose and neglect to send us a bill; some give us substantial discounts; and some, when expensive procedures are involved, bill us for just token amounts.

Their gift of quality health care comes to us unsolicited and without fanfare. These men shun publicity as they would the plague, but we are so enthused about our good fortune that we feel compelled to cite some specific examples.

Dr. Michael R. Blais for instance — he has been coming to the Boys Ranch from Daytona Beach once or twice a year for the past 13 years to give physical examinations to our boys. Each time he visits us he gives up a weekend he could have spent fishing, yet he charges no fees and pays his own expenses.

Dr. Frederick T. Mickler, Jr., from Jasper, has been equally faithful. He comes to the Boys Ranch year after year in the early fall to give flu shots to boys and staff members. He works for free.

Members of the Jacksonville Dental Society give free dental care to Ranchers — at least half of it orthodontic work. One of them, Dr. Leon Smith, comes to the Ranch periodically to give free dental exams, and to set up the schedule we follow when we take our boys to the various participating dentists in Jacksonville.

Dr. Paul E. Coury, a Bartow physician, and Dr. F. Stuart Roux, a Lakeland dentist, give free professional services to the Girls Villa, and also arrange and coordinate the free services donated by other doctors and dentists in the area.

Generosity falls like rain from many sources within the health care spectrum. Pharmacists give us substantial discounts. Dermatologists treat acne, warts and youthful skin disorders free of charge. When a girl bitten by a horse needed expensive plastic surgery, she got it free. Opthamologists give free eye examinations and treatments, while Florida's Lions Clubs provide free eyeglasses.

It's not possible to name all of the people who contribute to the robust good health of our youngsters. The long list would overtax this small publication, and it would also "blow the cover" of some who prefer to remain anonymous. However, if we were requested to single out one man who personifies the high calibre of concerned attention we get from health care practitioners, Dr. Sherman Pace, a Clearwater physician, would be one of our first choices.

Dr. Pace is the volunteer medical director of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch, which is located a few miles from his office. He also serves on the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund Board of Directors. Visits to his office by (continued on next page)

Youth Ranch youngsters average about five a month, and he also makes house calls. He gives the Youth Ranchers their annual physical examinations and refers them to other doctors when they need the attention of a specialist.

Early on, when the subject of his fee came up, Dr. Pace said he would settle for an occasional peanut butter and jelly sandwich. The staff didn't take him at his word and prepared something more elaborate. He appreciated their thoughtfulness, but what he really wanted, he confided later, was a very simple lunch that would have given him plenty of time to get acquainted with staff members.

"I had to wait while they were dilly dallying around in the kitchen," he said, "and that really ruined my purpose for going."

Dr. Pace's interest in the Youth Ranch can never be described as casual. He wants to be a concerned and involved family doctor in the old traditional way; and, in spite of his busy schedule, it's not unusual to find him and his wife Marion attending Youth Ranch parties.

He's on call day and night, and the Youth Ranch has a list of telephone numbers where he can be reached including his home, office and hospital numbers. Sometimes his house calls to treat one patient turn into something resembling army sick call, with several youngsters reporting ailments. On one occasion he found that all ten of the youngsters in one cottage needed his attention because of a flu epidemic.

"He seems to get along real well with the kids, but he's

rough on adults," said one Youth Ranch staff member.


This assessment was borne out when Dr. Pace attended his first Youth Fund board meeting and introduced a no-smoking-during-meeting resolution. It passed, and a number of cigarettes were immediately stubbed out in ashtrays. Since then at least one Youth Fund staff member has quit, "cold turkey." Dr. Pace is a no nonsense sort of guy who makes no attempt to hide his sentiments — especially those that are anti-smoking and pro-children.

He began supporting the Boys Ranch with cash contributions years ago. Later on, in 1976, when the Youth Ranch was founded as a companion child care institution, he immediately volunteered his professional services. He also told the Morton Plant Hospital medical staff about the Youth Ranch and several doctors volunteered their services.

Asked recently to account for his strong loyalty to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund and its child care activities, he said "When it comes to donating money or talent to something like a civic project, versus a child's life and a child's welfare, it just seems to me there's no comparison as to where the money and talent ought to go.

"If we can save from a life of crime, and what have you, even a small percent of these children, it will be of great importance. I guess it boils down to a matter of putting your money where you personally think it will do the most good."

Dr. Pace considers well spent the money, time and talents he gives to the Youth Fund and the Youth Ranch. "It's a pleasure, really," he said. "It brings me a lot of satisfaction, I promise you."





**Canteen Now Offers More of Everything** 

The Boys Ranch Canteen, a sort of convenience store that features arts and crafts supplies, is more spacious, offers more variety, and is more conveniently located now that it has been moved to the Arts and Crafts Building. Prices are considerably lower than those offered at discount stores in the area, but the canteen still makes a small profit which is turned over to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund.

## President's Perspective

A message from Harry K. Weaver, President of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund



Things are always changing, and we are constantly reviewing things we have already done to be sure they are still adequate and appropriate in the world of today.


The 1981 tax bill, recently signed into law by President Reagan, will touch the lives of most Americans and will, perhaps, have the effect of changing some of the ways we deal with our financial affairs.

Beginning in 1982, taxpayers who use the standard deduction in figuring their federal income tax will be able to take credit for a part of their charitable gifts. This feature will phase in over a period of years with 25 percent of the first \$100 being deductible in 1982 and increasing amounts in successive years until 1986 when 100 percent of all charitable gifts will be deductible.

Under the same legislation, corporations will be allowed to deduct up to ten percent of their pre-tax net income in gifts to charity as opposed to the former limitation of five percent.

Perhaps, one of the most significant aspects of the 1981 tax law is the liberalization of estate taxes, including an unlimited marital deduction. The estate tax exclusion will be increased, in yearly stages, from its present \$175,625 to \$600,000 in 1987. Meanwhile, the maximum rates of taxation will be descending, in stages, from 70 to 50 percent. By 1986, we will be looking at estate tax rates that range only from 37 to 50 percent. These are just some of the highlights of the new tax bill...there are still other features which may warrant your attention and consideration.

What does all this mean to us? Certainly it means that our tax burden, at least in some areas, has been lightened. It means that many of us need to consult with our accountants or attorneys and review our wills to see if we and our heirs can benefit from the new estate tax and marital deductions. *(continued on next page)* 



#### **BOYS RANCH IS...**

A residential group child care program for dependent, neglected, or homeless boys between the ages of eight and eighteen. It is not an institution for juvenile delinquents. The Boys Ranch is sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association and operated by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund. It was founded in 1957 and currently has approximately 100 boys in residence at any given time. The Boys Ranch is located in North Florida, about halfway between Jacksonville and Tallahassee and nine miles north of the town of Live Oak on County Road 795. THE FLORIDA SHERIFFS YOUTH FUND IS ...

A charitable, non-profit corporation, sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, to manage and operate the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, Youth Ranch, and any other Youth programs that might later be developed by the Florida Sheriffs Association. An important function of the Youth Fund is the raising, receiving, budgeting, and disbursing of funds for its programs. The Youth Fund and its programs are supported almost entirely by voluntary gifts. Gifts and bequests can be made to the Youth Fund for the exclusive benefit of any single program, such as the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, or Youth Ranch, or they may be made without restriction, to be distributed among existing programs as most needed or to be used for the development of new programs at the discretion of the Governing Board. Youth Fund Central Offices are co-located with the Boys Ranch.

#### **GIRLS VILLA IS...**

A similar program for girls located two miles east of Bartow, Florida, on Route 60. Originally conceived by the Sunshine State Women's Chamber of Commerce of Madeira Beach, Florida, the Girls Villa was adopted as a project of the Florida Sheriffs Association in 1970. The first buildings were completed and the first girls admitted in 1972. There are approximately 24 girls in residence at any given time. Mailing address and telephone number for the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, and Youth Ranch are the same as for the Youth Fund.

#### YOUTH RANCH IS . . .

The most recently developed residential group child care program of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund. Also sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, it was founded in 1976 and opened in 1978. It is located just east of the intersection of the McMullen-Booth Road and County Road 102 near Clearwater, Florida. The Youth Ranch has approximately 20 boys and girls in residence at any given time. It provides care in a homelike environment for brothers and sisters who are dependent, neglected, or homeless. Mailing address and telephone number are the same as for the Youth Fund. It has been speculated upon and studied, and will be for years to come, that the new tax law may significantly decrease the incentive for charitable giving. We don't know what effect it will have, but we have a lot of faith in our Youth Fund family — the good people who support our programs. We think they are people who are involved — who truly care about the children we serve.

There is nothing wrong in taking advantage of a tax exemption when one is available, but we doubt very seriously that tax exemptions are the only motivation for the generous gifts we receive.




