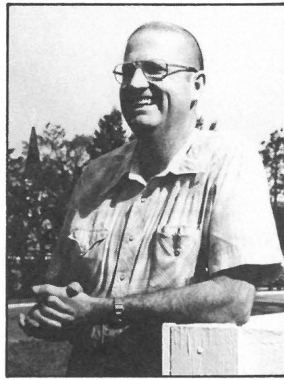

## Youth Ranches Reaccredited by COA

Recently we received the good news that the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches has been reaccredited by the Council on Accreditation of Services for Families and Children, Inc. (COA). Membership in the National Association of Homes for Children, one of the seven sponsoring agencies of COA, is held by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc.

Announcement of the accreditation was made in September during the National Association of Homes for Children conference in Philadelphia.

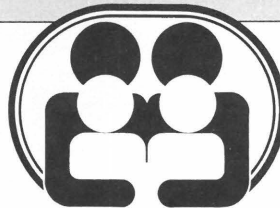
More than 2,400 agencies hold membership in COA, the voluntary accrediting body that evaluates family and child care agencies nationwide.

Accreditation for this agency is like accreditation for a school or a hospital. We prefer to send our loved ones to a school or hospital that is fully accredited by the proper authorities. The same principle would apply to whether or not we do business with a certified accountant, doctor or lawyer.

Reaccreditation for the Youth Ranches has given us another opportunity to examine our basic philosophy and programs against 374 provisions set by COA, while at the same time reevaluating our standards, policies and basic procedures. It has also been beneficial to have outsiders come in and not only take a look at what we are doing, but learn how we are accomplishing it in a systematic manner.

Accreditation is the most accepted standard in the world today that is identified with quality of service. Accreditation has become essential to maintain our program and fund-raising activities in a climate where bad publicity has been created by a few self-serving groups.

I salute the staff and board of directors for this tremendous accomplishment.

# Giving the Easy Way

"I really like what you do for kids," she said. "And if I have anything left when I pass on, I'd like you to have some of it. But it's got to be easy. No lawyers, no complicated papers. And I still have to be able to get to it quickly if I need it for medical or other expenses."

"Well," I said, "I'm not sure you really want to avoid every complexity. Virtually everyone should have a current will prepared by a competent attorney. But there are easy ways to provide for a future gift to the Youth Ranches and still have quick access to your money if you ever need it."

I then went on to tell my friend about the amazing Totten Trust. Don't let the word "trust" turn you off. There's no lengthy trust instrument, and I suspect that the whole thing can be done in less than 15 minutes of your time.

A Totten Trust, you see, is nothing more than a bank account (or certificate of deposit) which you are holding for another. Just tell your banker that you want to establish an account in trust for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc.

All the funds in the account are still yours to use as you wish. And, if you ever want to change your mind, you can. You maintain complete control. But when you die, if your account still lists the Youth Ranches as the beneficiary, all the funds in the account will come directly to us, bypassing probate entirely.

What could be easier? No lawyers, no lengthy trust

papers, no expense to you.

It is true that, if you choose to give to us through a Totten Trust ("Totten," by the way, is simply the last name of the person who first established the concept), there is no current income tax charitable deduction. That's because the money in the account is still yours. But there will be an available estate tax charitable deduction for the gift which occurs at death.

Even though technically no gift has yet been made (because the Totten Trust is revocable), we'd still like to know if you've chosen to remember our youngsters in this special way. We want the chance to say thanks and to be sure you know how much we appreciate your thoughtfulness.

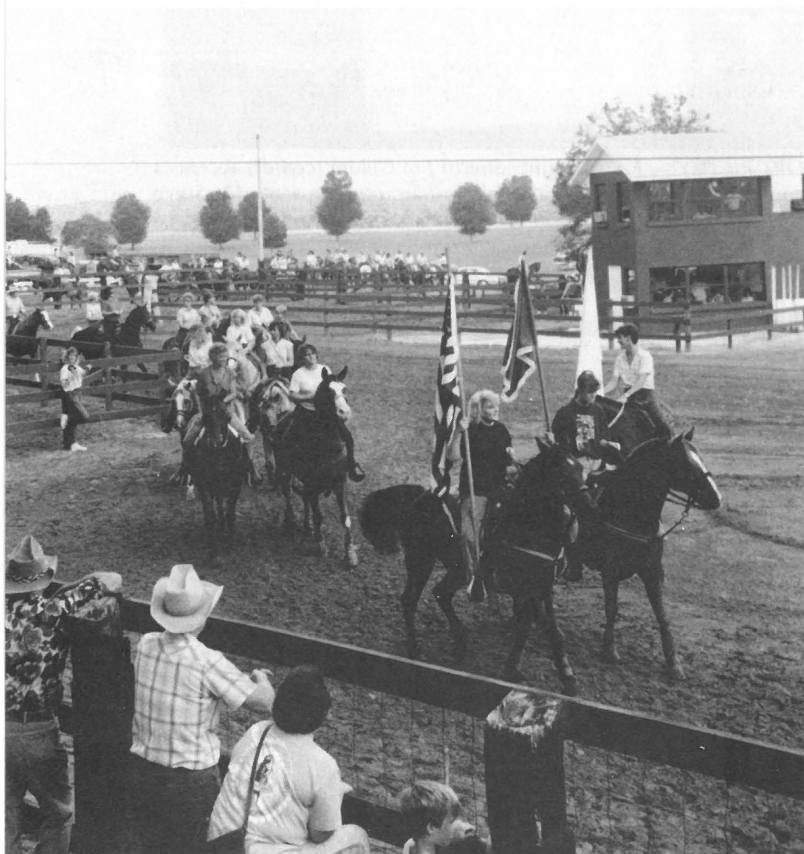

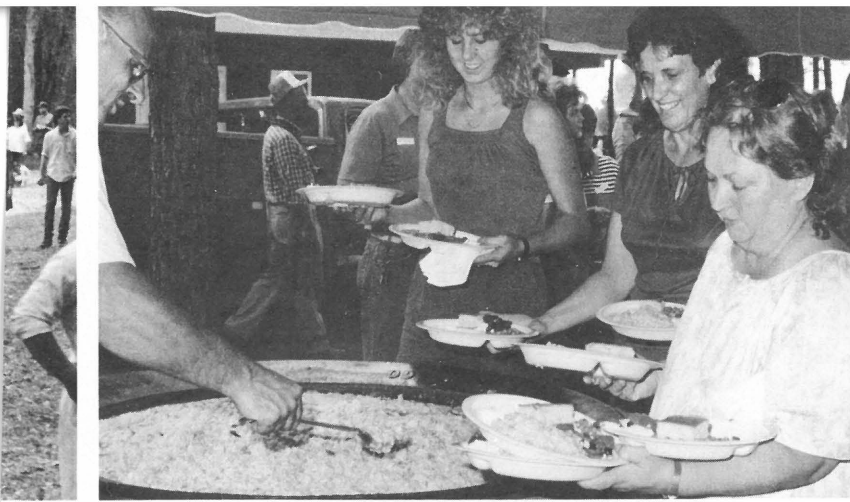
But, that's the way it was at the 32nd annual birthday party of the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch north of Live Oak October 6-8.

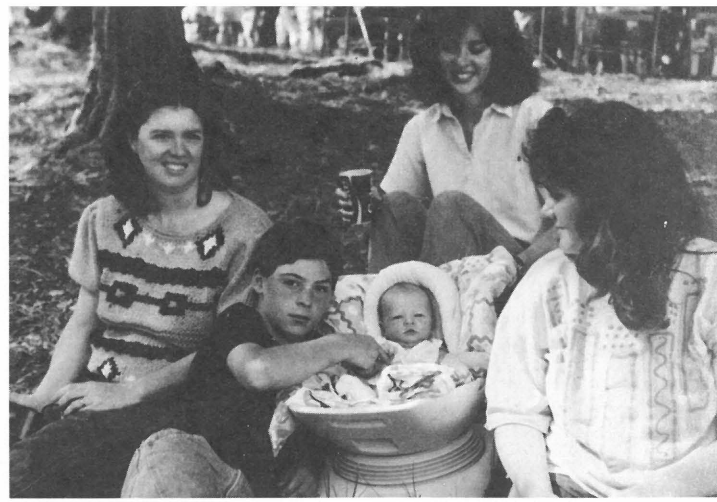

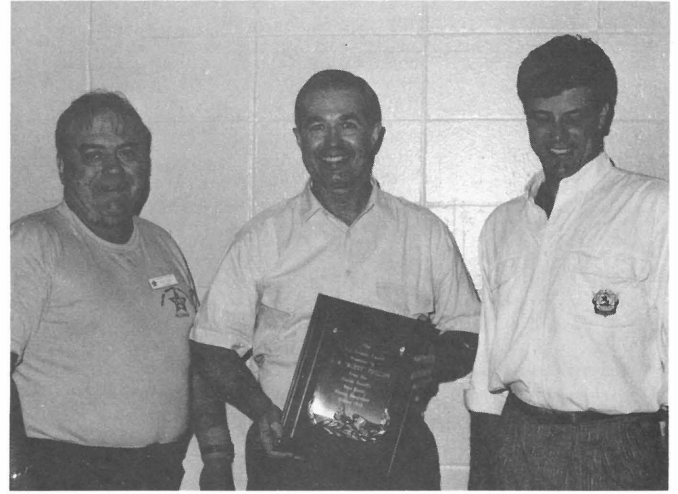

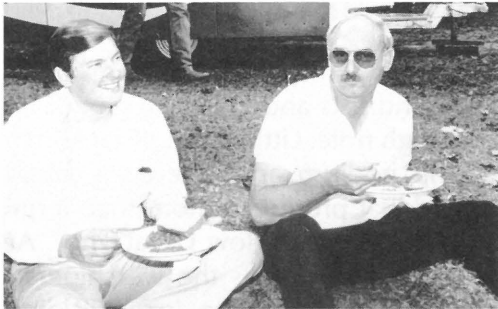

# The Worship Service was a stirring experience

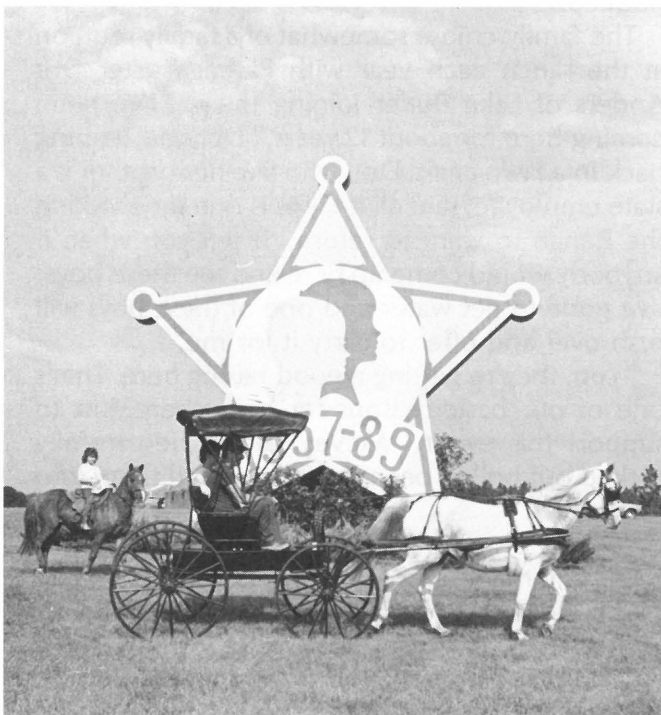

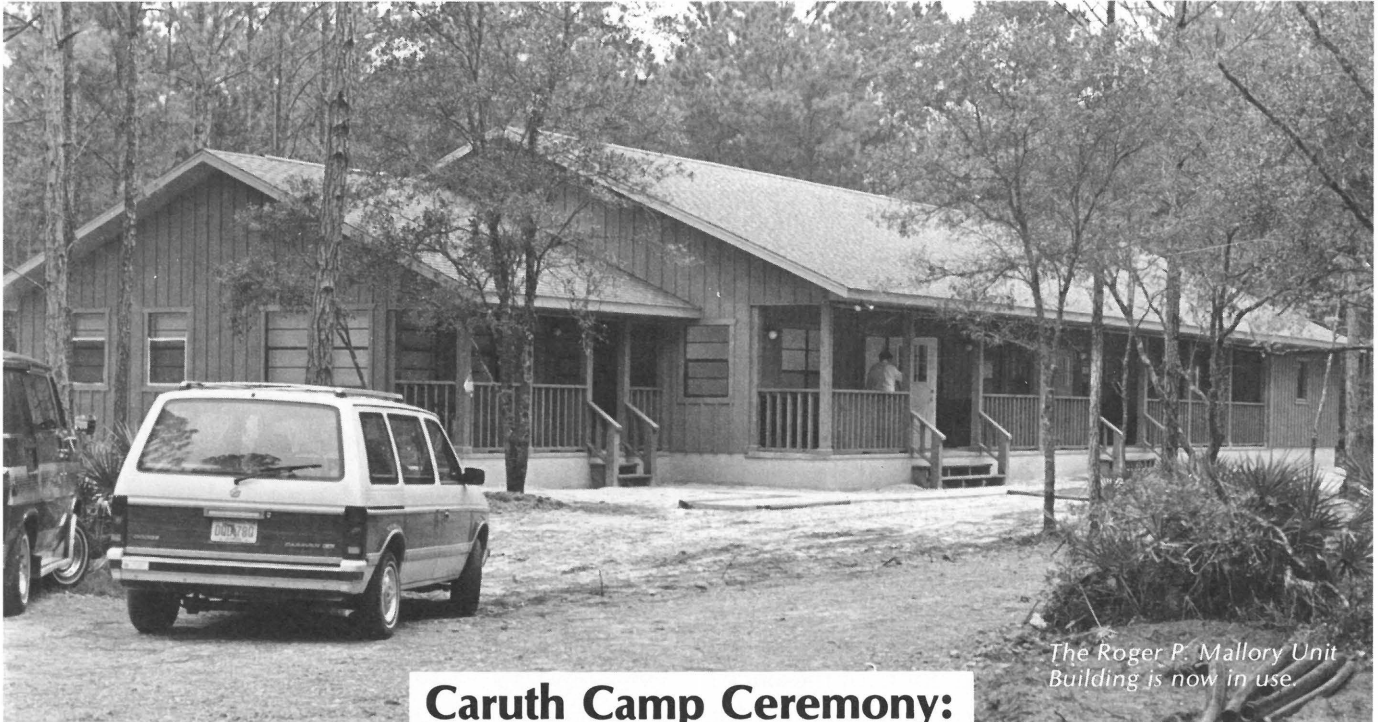
Ranch Chaplain Warren Thompson's message, "Good News!" centered on making the future better as he recited the Prayer of Serenity:

**Caruth Camp Ceremony:**

**Mallory Unit Building will be dedicated on March 18, 1990**

Here's good news from Caruth Camp near Inglis/Yankeetown:

The first of two proposed Unit Buildings has been completed and will be dedicated in memory of the late Roger P. Mallory of St. Petersburg on Sunday, March 18, 1990. It will serve the present Florida State Moose Association campsite, plus two future campsites, as a combination administration and activity center.

Roger Mallory's widow, Beatrice, bequeathed a large portion of her estate to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches for various capital projects. Youth Ranches officials decided to use part of the funds to construct and help furnish the building. Additional funding commitments were received from W. W. Caruth, Jr.; The Saunders Foundation; Dunspaugh-Dalton Foundation; Mr. Thomas H. Jones; Independent Life and Accident Insurance Company; Mr. and Mrs. Stephen P. Ivan, and the William B. Caulkins Foundation to complete the project.

The Mallory Unit Building provides a dining and meeting room, learning center, kitchen, showers, laundry room, conference room, offices, and living quarters for counselors.

Caruth Camp's master plan calls for one more unit building, with each serving three campsites for a total of 54 boys and girls.

## Tough request:

*“I asked them to help me one more time.”*

In 1988, after having dropped out of college for the second time, after letting four college scholarships fade away, after working a series of less than promising jobs, Mary Braunagel showed up at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa, near Bartow, and did the hardest thing she'd ever done in her life.

“I asked them to help me one more time,” she said.

“I asked them to have a little more faith in me and lend me 1200 dollars to go to the police academy. And guess what — after all they'd done for me since I was 15 years old, those folks were still right there for me even though I'd just finished letting them down again,” Mary said.

That tough request was nearly two years ago, but now, at 22, Mary Braunagel has been a deputy with the Polk County Sheriff's Office for a solid year.

She has a darling townhouse that looks light and airy and definitely feminine with its shades of pink and pots of flowers. Even her three silly kittens, Miss Muffet (also known as Big Foot), Little Pete and Tinkerbelle (oops, it turns out Tinkerbelle is male) set off the decor with their white fur and pink noses.

Mary's trademark is her energy and her outgoing nature. She'll strike up a conversation with anyone anywhere as she seems to revel in trading jokes, offering advice and finding out what makes people tick. She's bouncy, confident, and very pretty with creamy skin, curly blonde hair and big brown eyes. She also has a top-flight, lightning-quick mind.

When Mary arrived at the Youth Villa in 1983, she was 15 years old and had a pretty rough history.

Because of drug abuse and other desperate circumstances, the last vestiges of her family had disintegrated by the time she turned 13, so she had simply quit going to school. As a child with no choices, she fell into an itinerant life style for survival. At 14 Mary became a ward of the state and began a round of foster homes.

But, just before she turned 15, she lived with a Naples family who built a room for her and insisted she go back to school. For the first time, she felt as though she had a family.

“When I talk about Mom and Dad, they're who I

mean,” she said, referring to Cheryl and Bernie Blackburn.

Although Mary couldn't understand it at the time, the Blackburns felt the best place for her was at the Youth Villa, where she had been slated to go when she moved in with them.

“I was so mad. I was awful for the first six months, but people at the Villa just give you so many chances that I finally figured out I could make something of myself. I could have goals.”

Mary laughs and recalls the first time she saw the Youth Villa — the day she arrived.

“I thought, ‘Oh, thank God. There aren't any bars on the windows.’ ”

Mary had lost a lot of school time and had only two-and-a-half years to complete four years of work if she wanted to graduate with her age group.

She not only did it (by taking extra classes, home study courses and full loads at summer school), but when she was graduated in 1985 with honors and four academic scholarship offers, she was also a member of just about every club possible at Bartow Senior High.

"No one at the school or at the Villa ever told me I couldn't do it. They all said, 'Sure, it'll be hard AND you can do it.' There were never any BUTs."

However, college didn't mesh with Mary's accelerated view of life. She wanted a home and a career and she wanted it immediately. College was just too long-range for her.

So she went for a career in law enforcement and it seems to be a great fit.

"It's a career, not a job. In a job, you go to work for eight hours, come home and don't think about it again until the next day. In a career, you care about it all the time. It's in your heart. That's the way I feel about this. When I come home, I think about my people and my cases and I'm always trying to figure out solutions," she said.

Because she knows her district so well, and because she's so enthusiastic about the work, Mary is consistently among the first three or four deputies in her unit in the number of arrests she makes each month.

Of course, the Youth Villa is still very much a part of Mary's life. She's a willing speaker on its behalf and she loves to tutor Villa residents at the cottages. And, judging from all the hugs and squeals her arrival prompts, it's clear the girls love her.

Oh, yes, Mary is also planning to go back to school, probably in the St. Leo College independent study program.

"People ask me if I'll major in criminology, but that's too obvious. What I really want is a degree in psychology," she said.

Anyone who has ever met Mary Braunagel knows one thing: If she wants a degree in psychology, she's going to get it.

## *It's obvious — Mary loves her career*

Mary Braunagel, a former Youth Villa resident, is in love with law enforcement and it really shows when she talks about her job as a Polk County Deputy Sheriff.

Some days are routine and boring, and then there are other days when she finds herself in the middle of scary and dangerous situations. She likes that kind of variety — especially if she survives without serious injury and can laugh about it later.

One of her favorite "war stories" from her days as a new recruit involves an attack by a pit bulldog.

"We were told to go pick up this man and that he liked to play with guns," she said. "He was well into knives too, and he had this dog named "Killer," who is an attack pit bull that outweighs me by eight pounds.

"We knocked. He came to the door. We told him we were not arresting him . . . we only needed to take him in for a mental evaluation.

"When we started out with him he said, 'Can I let my dog out?' The dog was in a back bedroom and the

owner was told to get him and hold him by the collar.

"I'm on a deck outside the trailer and there are four big deputies standing in front of me. I'm so short I can't see over anybody and they're all lookin' in the door watchin' all this stuff. I'm just standin' back there tryin' to peek through 'em.

"Then the guy opens the bedroom door and says 'Come on Killer.' Well, the next thing I knew Killer came barrelin' out of the trailer. These four big, strappin' men in front of me did the parting of the Red Sea . . . whoosh! . . . and next thing I knew there was the dog in front of me. I didn't have a chance to do anything. I had a flashlight in my hand and he grabbed my hand. I kinda did a roll and the dog went to the other side of me and a deputy shot him.

"I'll never let those guys forget that. Here I was the smallest midget out there and all these big, strappin' men . . . I said, 'Thanks guys.' Training's big."

Mary doesn't carry mace, a spray can that temporarily incapacitates unruly characters who are resisting arrest, but she knows how it feels to get maced.

She and her training officer were trying to handcuff a suspect who was putting up a vigorous battle when a bystander — demonstrating good intentions but bad judgment — tried to intervene with mace. He only made things worse.

"I'm on my knees trying to get 'cuffs' on the prisoner," Mary explained, "but I can't see because of the mace. I grab an arm and the training officer yells 'Hey! That's my arm!' Mace works. Let me tell you, it really works!"

Mary's love affair with law enforcement began when she took a temporary job as a radio dispatcher in the Polk County Sheriff's Office, and although years have passed she is still enthusiastic about her career.

"I love it," she said recently. "I can't believe that people pay me for it."

## 424 boys and girls set Youth Camp record

Four hundred and twenty-four youngsters from 52 Florida counties set a new attendance record at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp during the past summer.

In keeping with the camp theme, "Law Officers Are Your Friends," they had an opportunity to get acquainted with 59 deputy sheriffs from 24 counties who volunteered to serve as counselors. The camp staff also included college students, school teachers and other experienced individuals from outside the law enforcement field.

An expanded recreation program was enhanced by a new athletic field and sand volleyball courts. New activities included overnight camping trips that gave campers an opportunity to "rough it" and

learn survival techniques.

Increased emphasis on safety was one of the goals during the 1989 summer sessions. As a result, five staff members were certified in advanced lifesaving and 26 were certified in adult cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and standard first aid.

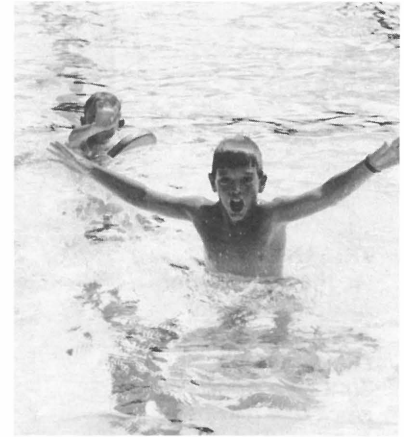
Demonstrations presented by special units from various sheriffs' offices added an interesting and unique dimension to the camping experience. Charlotte County

provided airboat rides. The Lee County Scuba Rescue Squad and the St. John's County SWAT Team demonstrated its skills. Volusia County's helicopter caused a stir of excitement. The Jacksonville (Duval County) Sheriff's Office presented a drug education program.

The schedule of special events also included a demonstration by wildlife officers from the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission.

## Bless the bikers!

We salute those saddle-weary individuals who raised \$12,000 for the Youth Ranches

**QUESTION** — Why would 21 otherwise normal individuals spend three days riding bicycles 240 miles in the heat of early September, suffer the indignity of saddle sores, bivouac in odd shelters such as a medical clinic and a gymnasium, sustain an assortment of sore muscles, pull some ligaments and expose their hands to handlebar cramps?

**ANSWER** — To participate in the second annual Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches Bike-A-Thon and raise approximately \$12,000 for Caruth Camp, a Youth Ranches child care program located near Inglis.

The funds were provided primarily by sponsoring business firms and individuals who paid varying sums of money per mile, but the pedaling participants earned every dollar while cruising from Tallahassee to Inglis/Yankeetown at an average speed of almost 15 miles per hour.

The bikers who volunteered for this rigorous ride included nine teen-agers from Caruth Camp

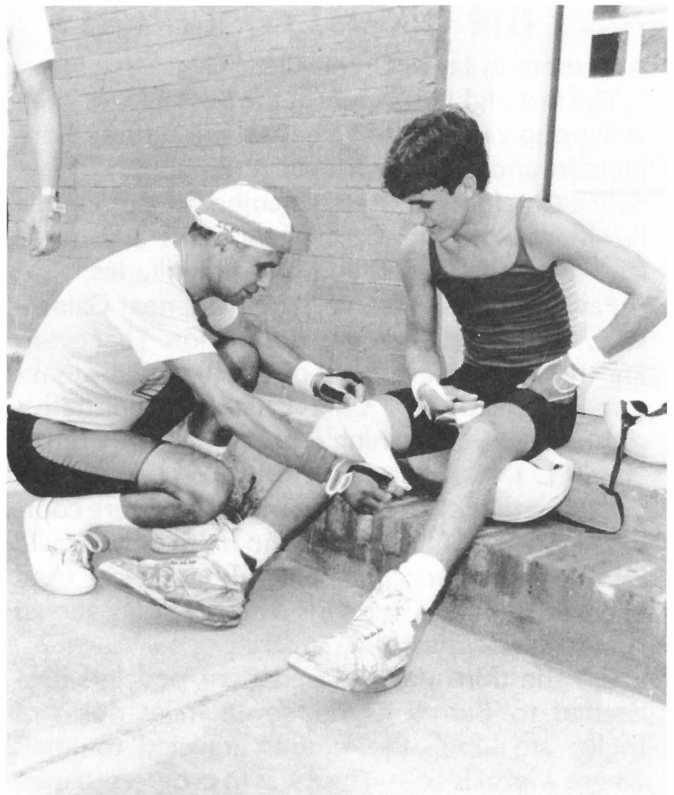

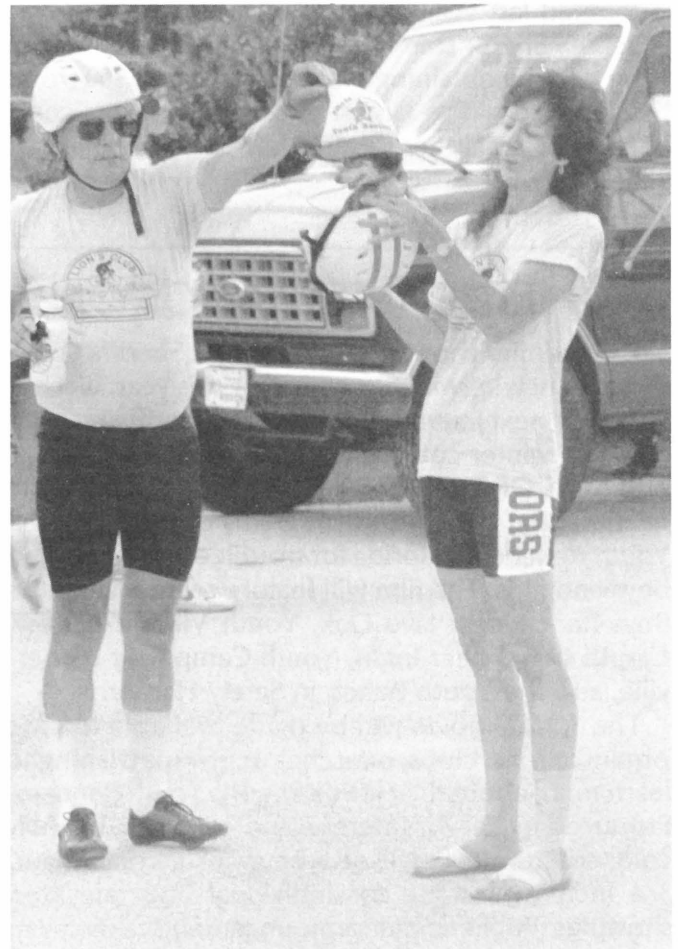
State Rep. Allen Boyd rode with the crew for the first 45 miles, and was its host for lunch after they reached his home town, Monticello. He continued

with them as far as Greenville.

The first night was spent at the Boys Ranch. Then the group pedaled to Live Oak where they were greeted and feted by Mayor A. P. "Buddy" Nott, Police Chief Jack Garrett, Chamber of Commerce President Marjorie Carmichael, Miss Suwannee County (Dana Carter) and other dignitaries.

Paynes Prairie Preserve State Park, near Gainesville, was the second day's destination. That evening the bikers were treated to a spaghetti dinner served by Lt. Von Cille Bruce, administrative assistant to the evening's host, Alachua County Sheriff L. J. "Lu" Hindery.

During this leg of the journey escorts were coordinated by Sgt. Bear Bryan, who is not only an avid Bike-A-Thon supporter, but also collects used bikes for the boys and girls who are being served by Youth Ranches programs.

On the third day the persistent pedalers proceeded to Caruth Camp, seven miles north of Inglis; ate lunch there; then traveled to Inglis where a local Bike-A-Thon was in progress to raise funds for Caruth Camp.

The funds raised this year almost more than doubled last year's total of \$5,200. Citrus County Deputy Sheriff Dan White set this year's fund raising pace by obtaining pledges totaling \$1,300 from his sponsors. The largest gift from sponsors consisted of stock certificates valued at \$4,000 collected by Frank Kenny.

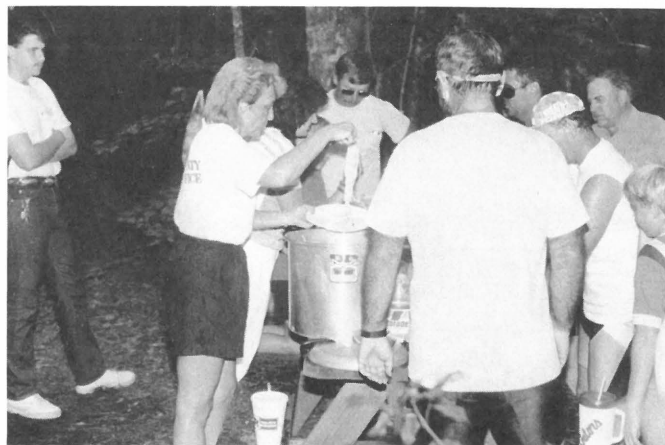

The trip was accident-free, due primarily to the excellent escort duty provided by sheriffs' deputies from Leon, Jefferson, Madison, Suwannee, Columbia, Alachua and Levy counties; and by officers from the Gainesville Police Department.

A support staff that included Youth Ranches staff members, wives of bikers, law enforcement officers and media reps also contributed substantially to the success of the venture.

Twenty-one bikers completed the entire 240-mile route. A few others rode part of the way.

A residential group child care program for Florida's neglected, unsupervised, and troubled boys between the ages of eight and eighteen. It is not an institution for juvenile delinquents. The Boys Ranch is sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association and operated by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. It was founded in 1957 and currently has approximately 96 boys in residence at any given time. The Boys Ranch is located in North Florida, about half-way between Jacksonville and Tallahassee and nine miles north of Live Oak on County Rd. 795. Telephone: 904/842-5555

### YOUTH VILLA IS . . .

A similar program for boys and girls located two miles east of Bartow, Florida, on Route 60. Originally conceived by the Sunshine State Women's Chamber of Commerce of Madeira Beach, Florida, the Youth Villa was adopted as a project of the Florida Sheriffs Association in 1970. The first buildings were completed and the first children admitted in 1972. There are approximately 50 boys and girls in residence at any given time. Telephone: 813/533-0371



### YOUTH RANCH IS . . .

A residential group child care program of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. It was founded in 1976 and opened in 1978. It is located just east of the intersection of the McMullen-Booth Road and County Road 102 (Enterprise Road) in Safety Harbor, Florida. The Youth Ranch has approximately 30 boys and girls in residence at any given time. It provides care in a homelike environment for brothers and sisters who are neglected, unsupervised and troubled boys and girls. Telephone: 813/725-4761

### YOUTH CAMP IS . . .

A facility which operates a Summer Camping Program for boys and girls. The 200-acre campsite is located one mile northeast of Barberville, near DeLand. Campers are normally selected from among boys and girls who have had Requests for Service submitted to the Youth Ranches on their behalf. Many of these youngsters are already on the waiting list for admission to Youth Ranches residential facilities.
