

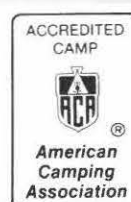

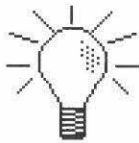

A Great Idea



Volusia County Deputy Sheriff Bob Lambert recently completed his fifth summer as a volunteer counselor at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp in Barberville. He loves the Summer Camping program because he has seen and felt the difference it makes in the lives of the boys and girls in his community.

So when the season began to change, he wondered, "what happens to Summer Camp after the summer is gone?" It's a question not easily answered because the Youth Camp continues to serve troubled youth in many other special ways. Once the home of our "Wilderness" Camping Program, it is presently the Regional Office for our Family Counseling Services and Parenting Classes.

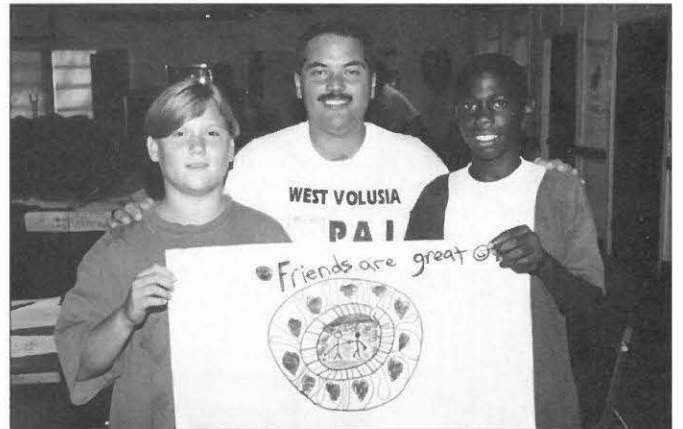
Deputy Lambert began to think that maybe this was an opportunity to solve an emerging community problem with a successfully proven available solution. As the School Resource Officer for DeLand Middle School and volunteer for the Police Athletic League, he was well aware of the growing need to help boys and girls learn to get along together better. The strife, fighting, and occasional violence was escalating and the time to deal with the situation was at hand.

Through a brainstorming session with representatives of the school, the Police Athletic League, and the Youth Ranches, PROJECT HARMONY was born. A cooperative effort aimed at resolving conflict among these children and teaching them positive leadership and communication skills, the group readily agreed that the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp would be the perfect setting for this unique program.

A pilot project was developed and the boys involved responded well. Many people noted a definite change in their abilities to cooperate, communicate, and co-exist on the same school campus after their involvement in PROJECT HARMONY.

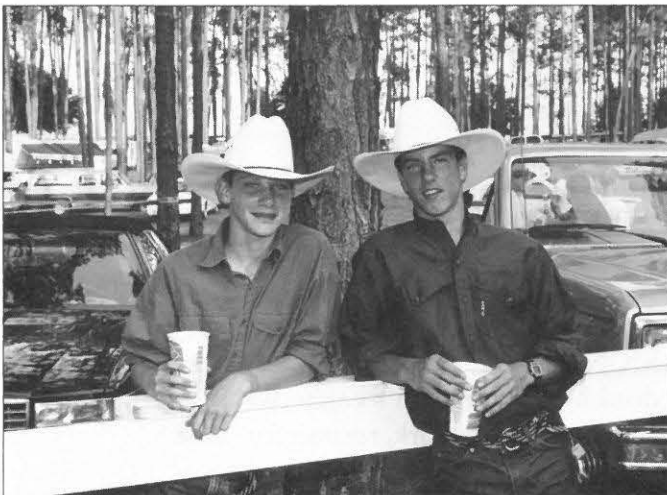

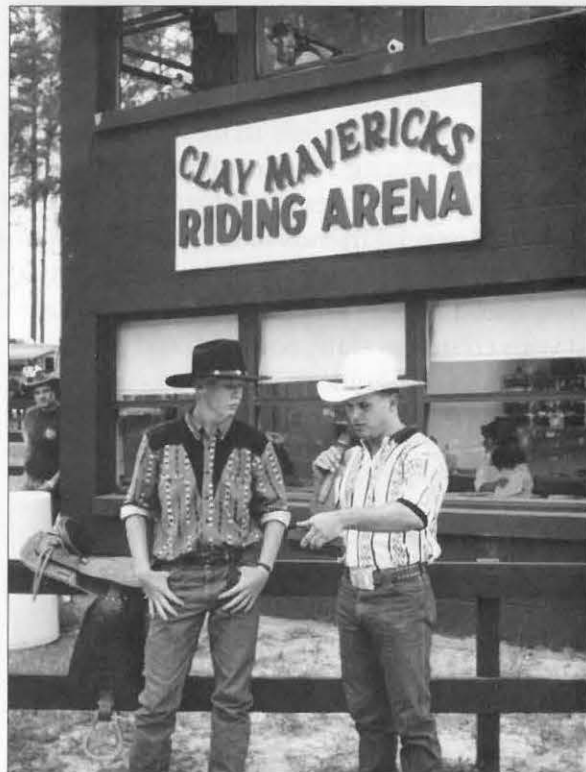

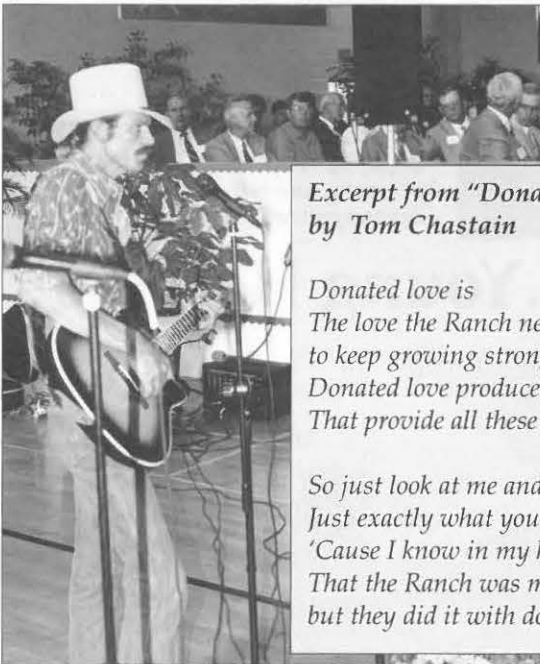

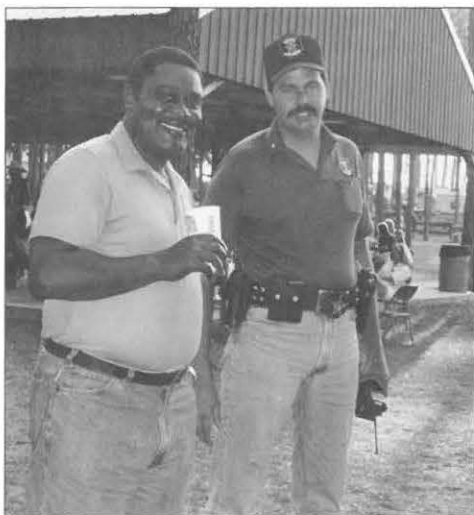
*Donated love is

The genuine interest shown by the boys in capturing the news prompted Mr. Tarleton to promise to return in the future and teach them a bit more about his profession.

Earth-Shattering Ground-Breaking

The youngest of the Youth Ranches programs continues to grow, thanks to the generous donations and strong support of its treasured community. A portion of the funding for the second cottage was provided by the Hugh and Mary Wilson Foundation, Frank Berlin, Phillip Carlton, and Francis S. Robson; and completed with a capping grant from the William G. and Marie Selby Foundation.

For the first time in the history of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, a significant portion of the building drive was derived from law enforcement trust funds. Sarasota County and Manatee County led the combined effort which included additional

gifts from Collier, Seminole, St. Johns, Pasco, and Martin counties.

On October 12, 1994, with shovels dug deep, the soil was unearthed around the future site of Sotatee Cottage which will be completed in 1995. For ten troubled and neglected boys, the home will provide shelter, comfort, and a caring place to work through their problems.

The Youth Ranches thanks all of the dedicated supporters that have taken this dream and shaped it into reality. This kindness and generosity will save ten boys tomorrow, and ten times that, in the days and times ahead.

Long-time Youth Ranches Supporter Celebrates 97th Birthday

On June 30, 1897, life was different. There were no televisions, no microwaves, no fax machines, and no computers; fuel injection and rock-n-roll were unheard of; the radio was just an infant in development, and we only dreamed of reaching the moon and touching the distant stars. In 1897, the year Mrs. Hettie M. Wolfe was born, there was no Youth Ranches to speak of . . . but that all changed exactly 60 years later with the founding of the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch near Live Oak.

"My husband helped support the first Ranch," recalled Mrs. Wolfe. "The Youth Ranches has done more good for little boys and girls than anybody I

know. I can't believe how much they've grown."

Over the past 35 years, the Wolfes have remained steady supporters. Mr. Wolfe was recognized in Clay County for his work with the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches and even after her husband's passing, Mrs. Wolfe continues to help Florida's children through their painful and troubled lives.

"It's a wonderful organization," continued Mrs. Wolfe. "Mr. Weaver knows exactly what those boys and girls need, and he gives it to them . . . kindness, wisdom, and support."

HOW FITTING!

The Youth Ranch-Bradenton/Sarasota received a healthy donation from Riscorp Management Services, Inc., to purchase some wonderful camping and exercise equipment for the boys.

"The new equipment is extremely beneficial," said Youth Ranches Resident Director Jim Laurent. "The boys use the machines in the evenings, after school, after study hour, and on Saturdays."

The new equipment teaches the boys the value of staying healthy and remaining in shape. Some use the weightlifting machines simply as recreation during free-time, while others have developed a strict workout regimen under careful supervision.

Like Snowflakes in December

Stephen was nine-years-old when he ran competitively for the first time. The morning of the race was sunny, both warm and cool all at once. An ocean breeze was dancing in from the Gulf of Mexico, pushing sand in circles on the beaches and blowing strands of hair on little boys' heads, into the eyes and around the face.

The "Turkey Trot" fell on Thanksgiving Day and was one of the most popular races in Clearwater. Participants ran a course through scenes of downtown and along wind-etched shorelines. For Stephen, this year's race was special. As the youngest family member entered, it would be his first, and he looked to his older brother, Mark — a long-legged and more experienced teenager — for guidance. Stephen hoped to follow in his brother's footsteps.

On the big day, Stephen was wearing blue nylon shorts with a white stripe diagonally painted over both legs, a tank-top to match. He wandered through the crowd and over to his brother, taking a seat next to those size "9" Nike sneakers he had tried so desperately to fit into so many times before. Mark, in similar clothes, sat in a patch of grass just yards from the starting ribbon, bending at the waist, stretching away any tightness in his leg muscles.

"You'd better stretch, you don't want to get cramps your first time out," said Mark. Stephen copied every move his brother made, watching intently not to make a mistake — bending at the waist, holding his toes, making that "funny" face, "we are ready," he thought.

At 8 a.m. the shot sounded, echoing over rooftops, off buildings, and coming to rest in the lukewarm waters of the ocean — a "blast" to start the race. Thousands of runners leaped forward through the plastic white tape, which stretched between two traffic poles some 50 yards apart. Stephen's father let him jog in front of the rest of the family, perhaps to allow him to feel like he was winning, but mainly to keep an eye out for his young boy. Mark followed closely, Stephen would have it no other way.

"Tell me when you need to stop, Steve," his father

Mark had quite an endurance, but his skills were not completely developed; and Stephen was only a novice in the sport. But the day was not about winning, or losing, or finishing, or competing. It was about

being a family — racing together, resting together, finishing or not finishing together — that's what mattered most.

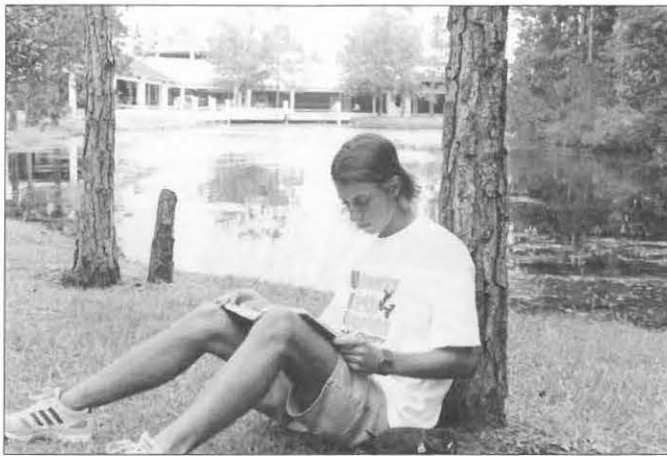
So, when the time came and Stephen had to quit; rest, and escape the glare of the afternoon sun, everyone stopped. They ended the race together, as one family should.

With a quick sense of humor, Stephen adds, "Sometimes I wish my dad had started us out in golf or something with air conditioning. In any event, I love to run, it's a wonderful part of my life with many great memories."

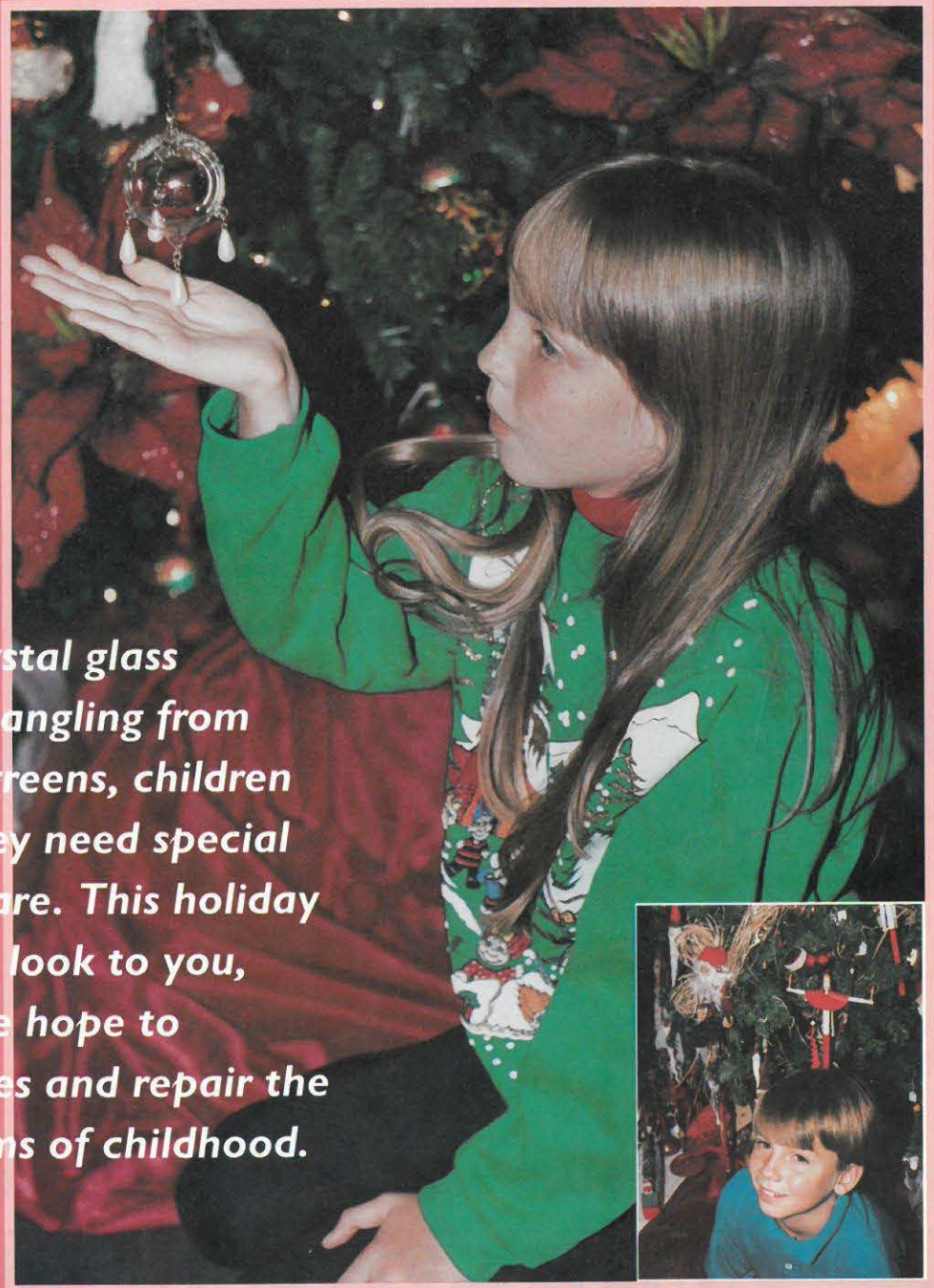
