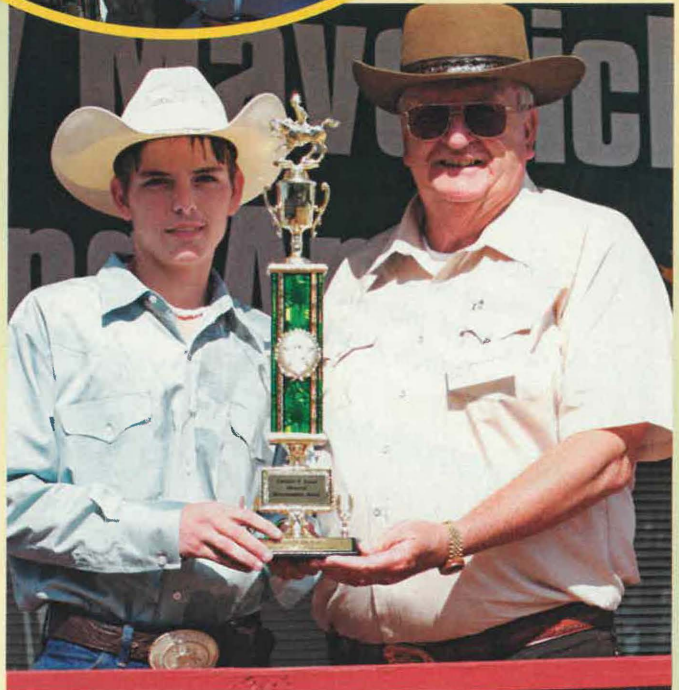

Eventually, she was always drawn back to where her heart is. We didn't mind sharing her because we knew she was doing something good here. Through her work at the Ranch, she has taught us about loving and serving others with the spirit of Christ. We are so grateful for our mom and the example she has set for us. For her thoughtfulness and selflessness, we love you Mom!"

Remembering Mom...Providing Healing Hope

Many of our kids have experienced loss in their lives...some from separation, some from rejection, some from abandonment, and even some from the death of a parent. But, when they come to the Ranch, we hope the healing will begin.

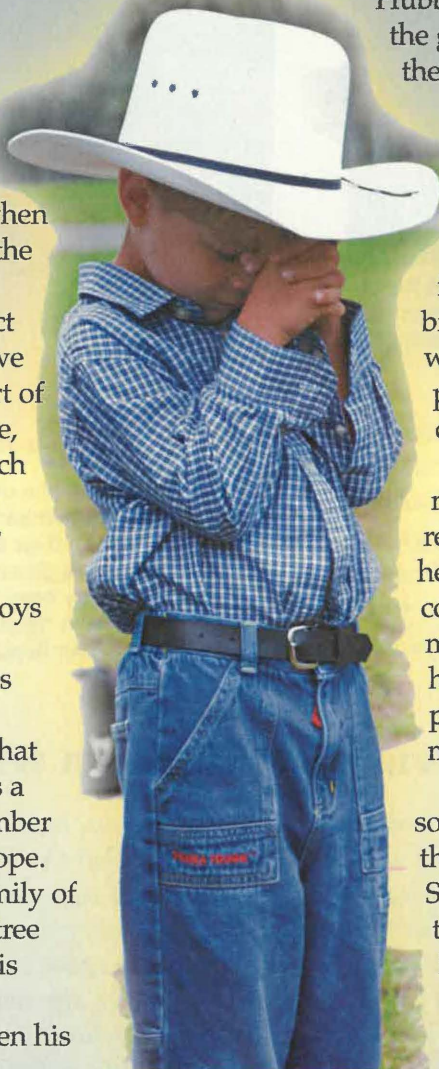
Much as we would like to protect them from ever feeling this pain, we know and understand loss is a part of everyone's life. So when we grieve, we grieve together. We lean on each other, planting a seed of hope and remembrance that strengthens our character and helps us grow.

It matters not that many of the boys who live here now did not know "Mom" Hubbard, nor that the ones who returned to honor her have moved on with their lives, rather that her family felt the Boys Ranch was a special place and wanted to remember her here with a living symbol of hope.

So we gathered together, as a family of support, to witness a very special tree planting ceremony outside of Lewis Cottage.

Young Gabriel was an infant when his parents, Rob and Diane Hubbard expanded their family to include ten teenage boys. "Diane's heart was here. Our first few days as Cottage Parents were very challenging. When questioning if this was our true calling, she said, 'We are exactly where God wants us to be.' For the next two years, they raised the boys in Lewis Cottage as if they were their own.

It was a time of challenge and change. The

Hubbards made a difference as they provided the guidance, structure and love needed by these boys. As this season in their life drew to a close, they moved on to the next challenge in their lives.

Beaming with the news of adding a beautiful daughter to their family, Diane and Rob also encountered the incomprehensible diagnosis of advanced breast cancer. Choosing to protect the child within her, Diane pursued medical procedures that gave her child the best chance at life.

Several months later, Charisma, which means "a gift of God's grace" and represents the power of life, arrived at a healthy 7 pounds 5 ounces. Diane continued the fight and savored the moments with her family. However valiant her battle, her time was way too short. She passed away at the age of 29, just 20 months after giving life to Charisma.

Now, nearly one year later, Rob and his son, Gabriel, journeyed back to the place that once brought Diane so much joy. Sharing with the boys, Rob spoke with a tenderness they understood. He talked of life and loss, challenge and triumph. As they watched Rob, Gabriel and former Rancher Jeremy plant the tree in memory of Diane, solemn tears slid slowly down some faces.

And, as the ceremony ended, the boys came forward, taking yet another step into the adult world and reached out to Rob with words of comfort and encouragement. There is no doubt, they understood his pain and offered him the healing hope of our Ranch family.



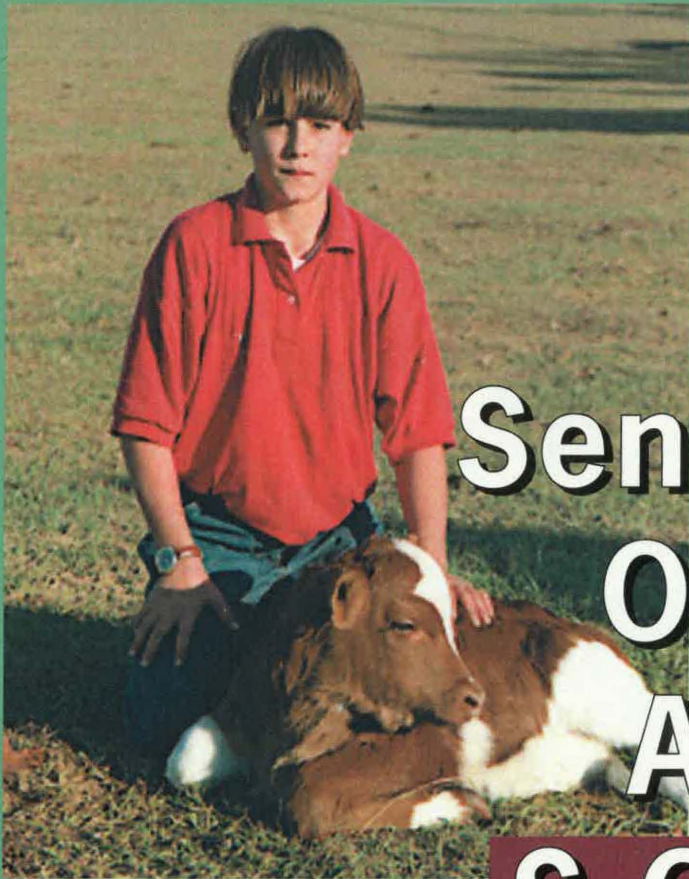

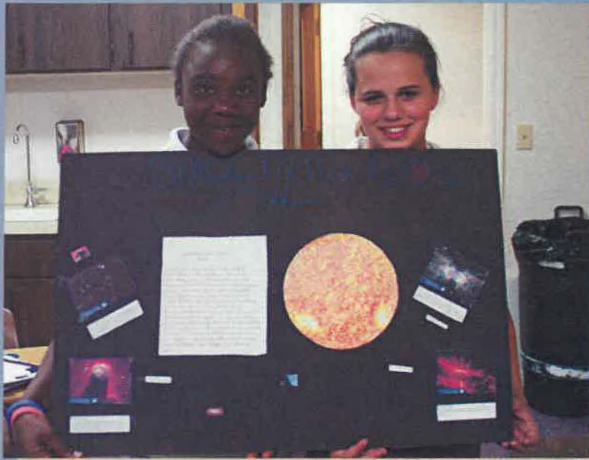
CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITIES allow a donor to make a gift to the Youth Ranches and receive annual payments for life. The annuity payment an individual receives is based on the amount of the gift and the age of the donor when the donation is made. The older the donor is, the higher the gift annuity rate. A portion of the gift is immediately tax deductible while a portion of the periodic payment is tax-free during normal life expectancy. A gift annuity may be funded with cash or appreciated securities.

THE CHARITABLE REMAINDER UNITRUST allows donors to permanently transfer money, securities or both to a trustee who pays them an income for life. The income paid is based on a percentage of the trust assets value annually. The trust can also provide income for a survivor (e.g., a spouse) for life. After which, the trust assets can benefit the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

THE CHARITABLE REMAINDER ANNUITY TRUST involves the transfer of money, securities or both to a trust that pays the donor a fixed dollar amount annually for life. The trust can also provide income for a survivor. After which, the trust principle helps the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

Focused on Success... Youth Villa Tutoring Program in Full Swing!

Most of the youngsters who live at the Youth Villa have struggled in school at one time or another. Often, their behavior and other choices left them outside the traditional classroom setting and failure became a part of "the easy way out."

Recognizing the need for a focused, interactive tutoring program, Youth Villa Program Director Brad Gregory sought out the help of the Learning Resource Center (LRC) of Polk County, Inc. The pilot program started with two tutors in a different cottage each night of the week. It was helpful, but the reality was many of the girls needed daily support in completing their school assignments.

Understanding the two general areas of need (Mathematics/Sciences and Language/Arts), Learning Resource Center Program Coordinator Susie Stone revised the schedule to provide two tutors (certified teachers), each with a specialization

in a core area, who would provide guidance to two groups of girls, four nights every week. The plan is working perfectly.

Who is expected to attend? Any Youth Villa resident who received a "D or F" on her report card, or any Junior/Senior student who has not passed any portion of the FCAT exam. The incentive is clear! Do well in school and you have an extra hour of free time four nights a week. That alone, is priceless to a young teenage girl!

Determined to show them that success breeds success, Mr. Gregory has added a new twist to the program this year. "If the girls attend these specialized tutoring classes, they know they have every opportunity to bring up their grades. Once they

have achieved this goal, I want to be sure we maintain that focus. To keep them moving ahead, I have offered each girl a special reward if she brings home a report card with all passing grades, no suspensions and no absences. "I am not quite sure how we will

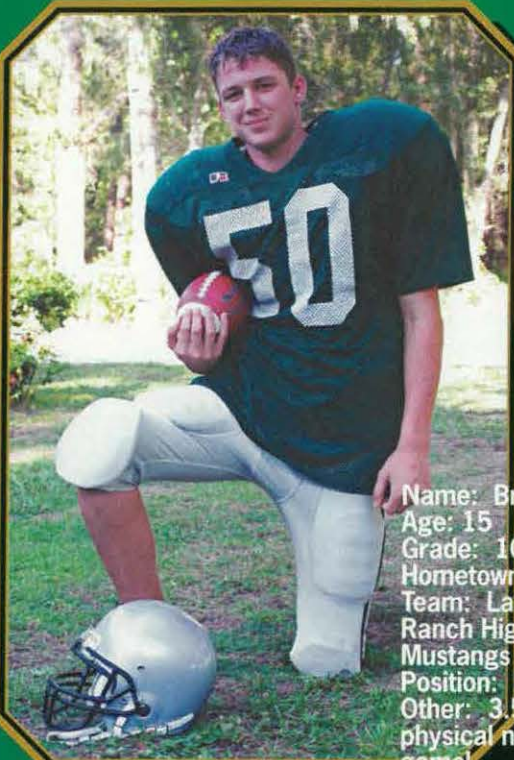
pay for the shopping trip incentive, but I imagine our donor family will help if they can."

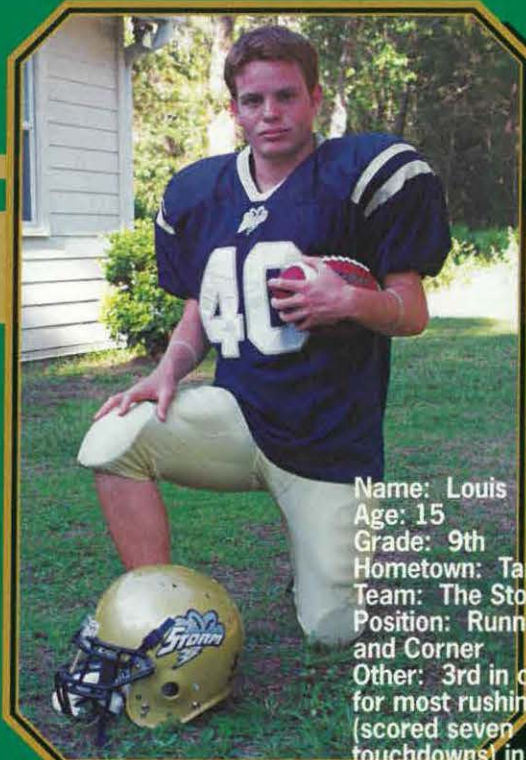

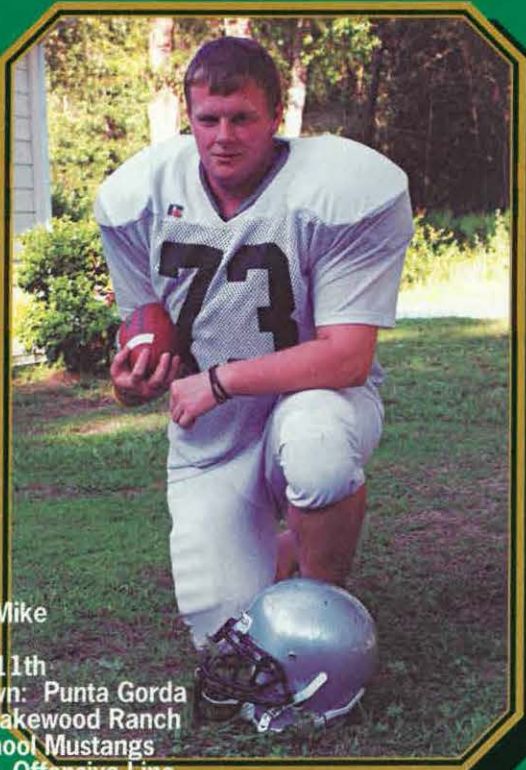

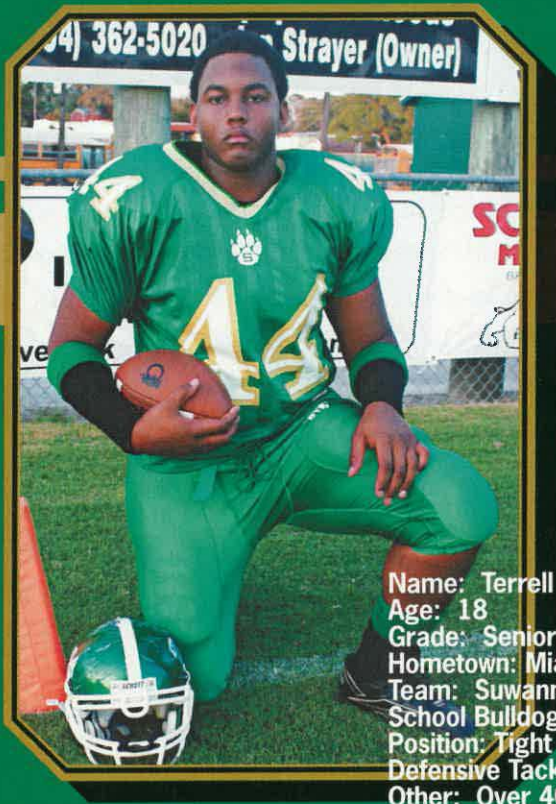

Fall Means Football!

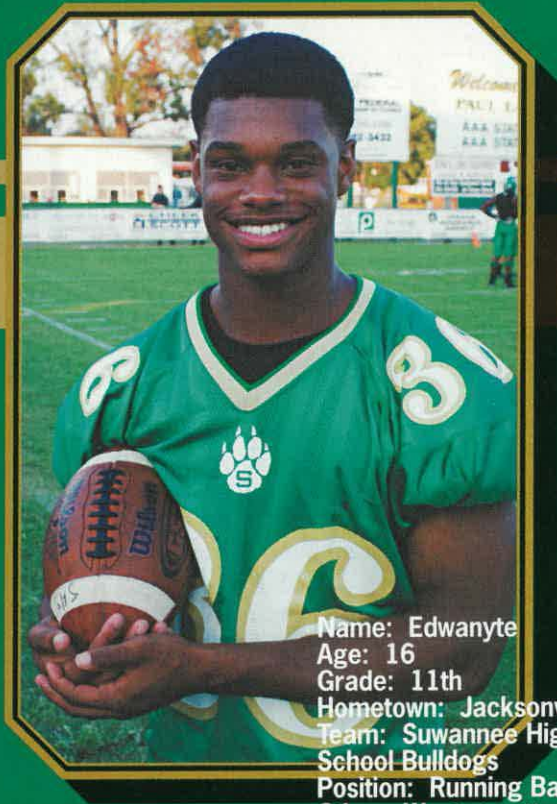

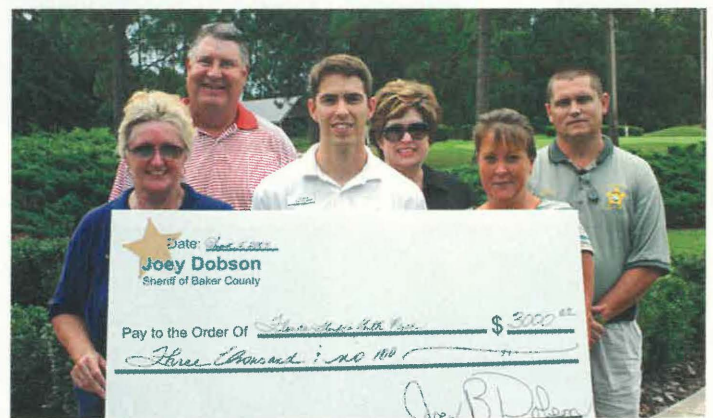
