by the Florida Sheriffs Association, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches has hit another milestone. We have helped over 128,000 boys, girls and families!


Citizen donors joined with the Sheriffs of Florida to create a children's home for abused, neglected and troubled boys and girls. As "Flor-

vised by their mother who struggled to raise three boys and a baby girl. About five years ago, they were reunited with their baby sister and thought their family was complete.

This year, everything changed again and their family grew by leaps and bounds. Tommy was searching the web and discovered a photo of his grandfather. He tagged it and made an amazing discovery!

Even as an adult, this photo remained a prize possession as he hoped to one day find his lost family. Keith's daughter, Mary, took it upon herself to help her dad and started a search which included posting a photo of her great grandfather.

When Tommy tagged that photo, and the family confirmed the relationship, the joy was overwhelming. Keith heard about the boys' life at the Ranch and brought his family down to our annual Open House celebration to

illiam E. "Bill" Powers, Jr., has been practicing law for over 40 years. A 1963 graduate of the University of Dayton, he received his law degree from Cleveland State College of Law in 1968 and obtained an L.L.M. degree in labor law from New York University School of Law in 1969.

Bill Powers has provided free legal services including consultation, representation, employee training, and other forms of support for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches since the early 90's. Valued at an extremely conservative rate, this represents a pro bono service donation of over \$50,000.

Additionally, he and Karen, his wife, have made significant personal cash contributions to the boys and girls served by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. including scholarship funds and senior graduation gifts. They regularly attend dinners and events at the Boys Ranch.

Bill's determination and humility is evident in a letter he wrote in 1992 to Youth Ranches President Harry K. Weaver..."This commitment is based on my sincere belief that the Youth Ranches has made a substantial difference in the lives of hundreds of young men and women, and my desire to assist the Ranch, however slightly, in continuing its efforts to provide these boys and girls with a realistic opportunity for future success as a meaningful member of society."

Offering a positive new day to each of the youngsters in our care is both a privilege and a challenge. Our Cottage Parents are on the front lines (and sometimes the firing line!) and it is a labor of love. There really is not a "typical day", so to offer you

This work is a calling, a ministry and a commitment. We live with the children 24/7,

"streets" are often unaccepted in the broader society. They are angry at parents, authority figures, peers, themselves and life in general.

The Ranch team offers solutions by working together with parents or guardians, teachers, cottage parents, unit directors, therapists, nurses, clinical director, work place supervisors, case managers and administrative staff to implement a specific, personalized treatment plan. Our goal is to meet each youngster where they are and show them a

more excellent way forward. Utilizing flexibility, adaptability, tenacity and perseverance, we strive together to assist in building a bridge over troubled waters, resting on a solid foundation of character and integrity.

But, we often get asked, what does a

Cottage Parent actually do all day? Come along with me to experience one day in a cottage with 10 boys (or girls)!

**5:00 AM:** My alarm sounds and the morning routine begins. The coffee is made, messages checked and schedule reviewed.

**5:40 AM:** Boys who attend school in town are awake and begin their morning routine

of cleaning their room, getting ready for school, doing chores and occasionally, cramming for tests. They eat breakfast, we do group devotions and they pack their back pack. The telephone is already beginning to ring.

**6:30 AM:** Town school boys head for the bus. Those who attend the school on campus wake up, check in, clean their rooms, get dressed and do their chores.

**7:00 AM:** Breakfast is served as problems are solved, issues and questions are answered. Morning devotions are held, encouragement and daily motivation echoes through the house.

**7:45 AM:** All boys are out the door and off to school. On the way, we empty the daily trash.



**8:15 AM:** ALL RIGHT!! Boys at school.... time to relax, enjoy the morning and do nothing until they get out of school, Right?? NOT REALLY!!

8:30-9:30 AM: Daily reports and meet-

ing with the Unit Director and Therapist to discuss the previous day including problem solving and conflict management issues.

**9:30 AM:** Back at the Cottage...Room inspections, check chores, etc.

**10:30 AM:** Time for training, various other meetings or supply runs. Some days,

we may go as far as 100 miles with a child who needs to see a medical specialist, not available locally.

**12:00 PM: LUNCH TIME!!** Noon until 2:00 PM is QUIET Time at the cottage. No phone calls, visits or other disturbances..... NOT REALLY!?! Like most kids, some call or return to the cottage for books, papers, gym shorts, projects, etc.

**2:30 PM:** Boys from the school on campus return home and MUST have an afternoon snack! Then they are off to their work sites on the Ranch. Some boys work cottage crew and afternoon work projects often require supervision.

**3:00 PM:** Boys participating in sports, music lessons or other activities are dropped off in town. We also work with the kids on grocery shopping, clothes shopping, balancing the checkbook and budgeting, planning

home visits, meeting with guidance counselors or therapists and writing thank you cards.

**3:45 PM:** The local school bus arrives at the Ranch. These boys MUST have a snack

before they go to their work sites. The Clinical Director calls about a boy who has a Treatment Plan Review or therapy session.

**4:30 PM:** Another town run to pick up everyone who has been dropped off at schools, thrift store, work, music lessons, etc.

**5:30 PM:** Family dinner together at the cottage around the dinner table. This is time to catch up, tell stories and discuss pressing issues.

**6:00 PM:** Evening chores, laundry, phone night and two hours of

FREE TIME...if "BOB" (Based on Behavior) says it is okay! Otherwise, all consequences must be done before any free time. The boys may go to the gym, pool, book club, or oth-

er available activities on the calendar.

**7:00 PM:** Early bed for those who have lost their privileges. Hopefully, they will get plenty of rest and reflection to correct their behavior the next day.

**8:00 PM:** Evening curfew and showers BEFORE their snack. There are usually many unique and interesting discussions each evening near bedtime.

**9:00 PM:** All Ranchers to their rooms, with lights out at 9:30. Only now do the boys remember they need sunglasses, a book, a shirt for tomorrow or any

other excuse to come out of their rooms. One warning, then everything gets relatively quiet.



**10:00 PM:** Cottage parents start on required paperwork, review schedules and ap-

pointments for the next day and catch their breath.

Think about it! What time did the alarm go off this morning?

**5:00 AM!!** 17 HOURS ago!!

Often we are totally spent physically, mentally and emotionally! I usually get caught up on the news or sports and my wife checks our family blog for recent pictures of our grandchildren and the latest from friends. Then this schedule repeats itself for seven more days in a row.

During our first week "on our own" in a cottage, we heard

glass breaking in one of the boys rooms. He hit the window with his fist in anger. An experienced Cottage Pop came over, walked into the room, began to pick up the glass

> as he calmed the boy down and put some cardboard over the window. He later told me, "If each boy goes to bed at night with ten fingers and ten toes, you have done a great job!" That put things in perspective and has really helped me over the years.

We know our every word may have an impact on a young man's life. This snap shot of the ever-changing days on the Ranch is meant to honor the commitment and dedication of each and every Cottage Parent,

past and future. They may never know (on this side of eternity) the vital and important work they do every day!! ★

# Three Days and the Kids Now PLAY!

arlier this year, we began reaching out to younger children by providing a safe home for sibling groups who have been removed from their homes due to a crisis in the family. Serving children as young as three years old, we evaluated our campus resources and immediately discovered the need for a playground.

We all know that imagination driven, unstructured, child-directed play has been proven to help kids develop physically, socially and cognitively, yet today's kids have less time and fewer opportunities to play than any previous generation. Through a Let's Play grant, Dr. Pepper/ **Snapple and KaBOOM!** made a generous grant to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches to build a new playground at the Youth Ranch in Safety Harbor. The condition of this grant was raising additional money and developing a volunteer base in the local community to build the playground.

Immediately, we asked for support from you, our donor family. Many of you responded with generous gifts and our Board Member Bob





Pinellas County Sheriff Bob Gualtieri came out to congratulate the volunteers from his office led by Lt. Sean McGillen and Deputy James Campbell. Then he watched all the kids who live at the Youth Ranch enjoy the new playground.

Owens stepped up by providing a large grant from the JM Rubin Foundation. Once the money was raised, it took two calls – one to Pinellas County Sheriff Bob Gualtieri and the other to Hillsborough County Sheriff David Gee and our law enforcement family responded by providing more than enough volunteers to help us construct this new playground in three days!

Wednesday morning we started with a patch of grass, four pallets of equipment, two truck loads of mulch and many faithful volunteers ready to go to work for our kids.

They were amazed to see how quickly the "yard" became a "park." Chloe daintily thanked everyone for building her "park" and when asked what she wanted on her park, she replied, "A Princess!" Immediately, one volunteer responded, "Chloe, you can be the princess of this park!" She beamed with pride, smiled and said "OK!"






