Afterwards, another five young men joined them and commenced to put forth a show of true horsemanship. Many of these young men had never ridden a horse before coming to live at the ranch. Yet here they were putting on an exhibition that would make any experienced rider proud.

Miracle moments happen every day here at the Youth Ranches! It may be the moment a young boy or girl receives their first "A" on a report card, or praise for job well done. It could be when a child realizes that someone truly cares what happens to them. Or it could be when their cottage parents say the words that so many children long to hear, "I love you". My miracle moment that day on the podium was remembering that everything we do is for





 Ranches for a period of 10 or 20
 years, then the balance is distributed
 to your heirs when they are older
 and better prepared to receive these
 funds







Fifth Annual Corporate SWAT Challenge


