at the Youth Ranch

Nancy Pilcher has seen 87 summers come and go, but somehow the passing years have failed to rob her of many appealing qualities she must have had when she was a young girl. Her smile has not aged, neither has the sparkle in her eyes, and I suspect this charming Nancy has caught my fancy.

I first became aware of my growing affection for her on September 23 when I went to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch to take pictures of ceremonies dedicating a new administration building which was a gift from her and her brother, the late Elmer Ellsworth "Dick" Pilcher.

Perhaps I was attracted to her because generosity was a garment she wore with modesty and grace.

She had asked Youth Ranch officials to keep the dedication rites simple and low key, and they had complied with her wishes. Some of her friends and Clearwater neighbors had been invited to mingle with officials of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund, Boys Ranch and Girls Villa, as well as youngsters and staff members from the Youth Ranch.

A chatting, laughing crowd of about 100 people gathered at the administration building after lunch anticipating an outdoor ceremony in the sunshine. The mood was reminiscent of a garden party or an old-fashioned family reunion, and fortunately, a sudden rain squall that swept in from the Gulf of Mexico failed to dampen it.

Folding chairs were brought inside and dried off. Hasty

preparations were made for an indoor ceremony, and no one, least of all Nancy Pilcher, seemed to mind crowding into a small conference room, or congregating in adjoining rooms and hallways.

Cub Scouts who had planned to hold a flag raising ceremony outside were asked to lead a Pledge of Allegiance inside. An American flag had been hastily thumb tacked on the front wall of the conference room, and although the figures and voices of the Scouts got lost in the crowded space, the audience managed to finish the last line in respectable cadence. Patriotism did not suffer.

Pinellas County Jail Chaplain James A. Riddle, who is accustomed to working in close quarters, delivered an invocation; Youth Ranch Resident Director Joe Spenard introduced special guests; and Don Genung, the Youth Fund's Vice President for Planned Giving, had the honor of introducing Miss Pilcher.

She had consented to give a short speech, but instead she simply talked to the audience informally. I was captivated by her unaffected manner as she began to share some family history.

She said her father had been born in Kentucky in 1860, but his parents had difficulty in selecting a name, and waited

almost a year before naming him in honor of Col. Elmer Ellsworth, a colorful hero who was the first Union Army officer to be killed in the Civil War.

However, the meticulous care used in selecting a name turned out to be futile because an uncle, who must have had Confederate sympathies, insisted on calling the baby "Dick."

"So my father and my brother became Elmer Ellsworth legally, but 'Dick' to family and friends," Miss Pilcher explained. Then she asked her audience: "What gives you more pleasure, getting, having or giving?"

Members of the audience quickly replied "giving," and she agreed. "Especially," she said, "if it is for a good cause such as providing a home for boys and girls.

"You are here today," she told her listeners, "because you have watched the growth of the Boys Ranch, the Girls Villa and now the Youth Ranch, and have helped with good wishes, prayers, services and contributions — some in memory of my brother.

"It takes all of these things to make a building such as this, and I am glad that my brother and I have had a part in promoting the growth of the Youth Ranch. I hope you will continue to help, just as I shall."

She turned away from the podium, and the audience gave her a standing ovation. Then Youth Fund President Harry Weaver stepped to the microphone to invite the crowd outside for the final event of the dedication ceremony.

Out there, with the sun shining again, Miss Pilcher undraped a sign identifying the Elmer and Nancy Pilcher Administration Building, and Weaver announced that the new facility was officially dedicated to the glory of God, in memory of Elmer Ellsworth "Dick" Pilcher, and in honor of Nancy Pilcher.

The crowd applauded, then drifted back inside for refreshments, and in a little while Miss Pilcher came outside again to pose for a picture with the youngsters from the Youth Ranch. I snapped the shutter several times, but I must have been more preoccupied with her warm and friendly manner than I was with picture taking.

Later, on my way home, I checked my camera and discovered the consequences of my infatuation. I had failed to advance a new roll of film properly, and, well, sorry, Miss Nancy, I will have to take another picture of you and the youngsters some other time.

Instant Grandparents

The 20 members of "Golden K" Kiwanis Club, all retirees over 55, had time on their hands and wanted a special project to celebrate the International Year of the Child.

Joe Spenard, Resident Director of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch, visited the Dunedin Club and suggested that the Kiwanians and their wives could add a new dimension to the lives of his boys and girls by acting as foster grandparents. His suggestion clicked, and the result was "instant grandparents."

Once each month Golden K members and wives take some of the boys and girls on a day's outing. On one occasion they went on a sightseeing trip to the ultra-modern Tampa International Airport and had dinner in a restaurant. Another time it was a trip to the ball park to see a professional baseball game, and again dinner out.

Periodically the hosts and guests will switch roles and the foster grandparents will be invited to the Youth Ranch for a dinner prepared by the youngsters.

Warm and rewarding friendships are developing.

Herb Rogers, immediate Past President of the Golden K Club, said he and his fellow members have been interested in the Youth Ranch from its early days. Volunteers from the club built storage shelves in one of the Youth Ranch buildings. The club has also given cash gifts to the Youth Ranch, and Christmas gifts to the youngsters.

Rogers has been a supporter of the Boys Ranch and other Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund projects for some 15 years. He and club President Walter Lewis have also worked closely with Spenard in setting up the foster grandparents project.

Free taxi service too

In addition to serving as volunteer grandparents, members of "Golden K" Kiwanis Club also provide a free transportation service to take Youth Ranch youngsters to and from their doctor and dentist appointments.

Youth Ranch Resident Director Joe Spenard said each month one lead man and two back-up men from the Dunedin

club volunteer for the taxi duty. They provide their own cars and their own gas, which is both a great convenience and a considerable benefit to the Youth Ranch staff.

Doctor and dentist appointments require three or four trips a week, Spenard said.

Here below...”*



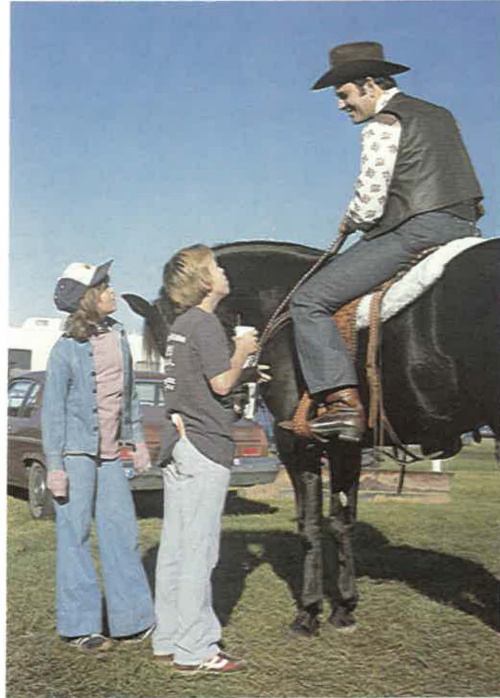

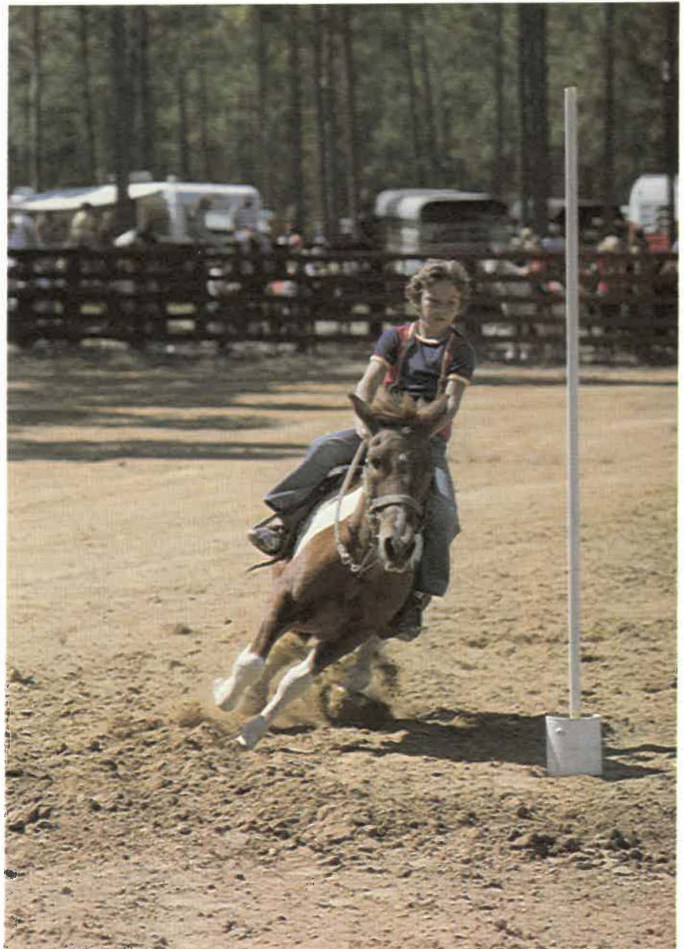
Guests were welcomed with generous helpings of the famous Boys Ranch chicken pilau.

The clear notes of the trumpet sped over fields and woods and were quickly gone, but their message lingered on. They had shaped an appropriate mood for the anniversary worship service; and they had also served to remind Ranchers and visitors that this haven for hapless youngsters which was now commemorating its 22nd year of uninterrupted success had always been sustained by God's blessings.

The beneficence of the Creator was everywhere apparent during this anniversary weekend; not only in the green fields, the handsome buildings, and the attractive setting of the Boys Ranch; but also in the perfect weather, the large crowd of well-wishers, and the prevailing mood of carefree fun.

Visitors began arriving Friday evening, October 5, towing horse trailers behind cars, trucks and vans. Some brought motor homes. Others came prepared to rough it in small tents.

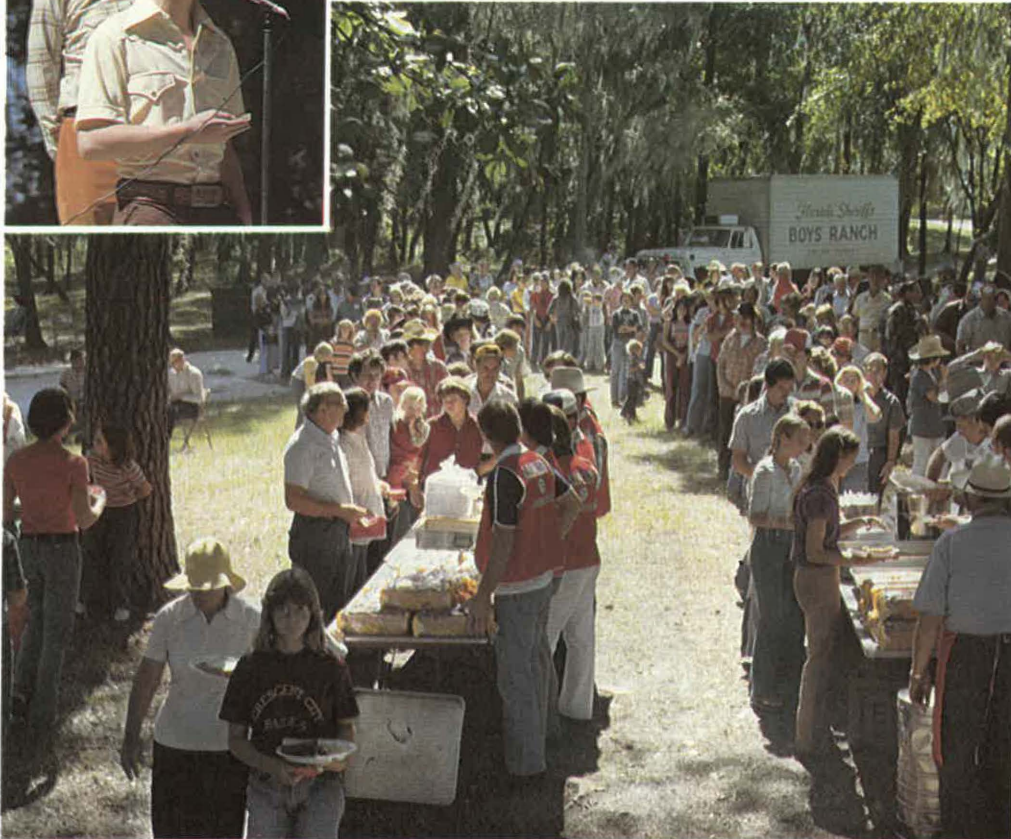

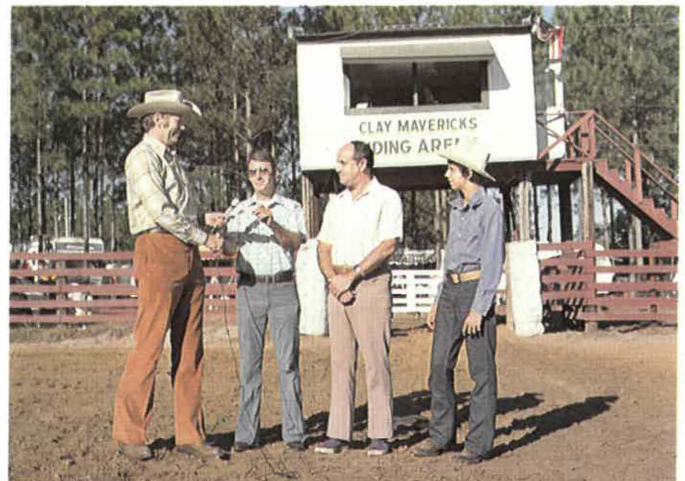

open the second round of competitive events; and at noon there was a general stampede of horsemen and spectators to the banks of the Suwannee River where a free barbecue was served to some 1,500 guests.

In the afternoon guests were given an opportunity to tour Ranch facilities, and also to witness the presentation of the Carleton F. Tweed Memorial Horsemanship Trophy to Rancher Jay Raulerson, the talented young man whose picture is featured on our cover.

Another important presentation took place in the arena Sunday morning after the worship service. It involved a substantial cash gift to the Boys Ranch from the Clay Mavericks, the Clay County riding organization that donated the horse show arena to the Ranch many years ago and has also maintained a custom of giving a large cash gift to the Ranch at each anniversary celebration.

The simple ritual of a check passing from the hand of Mavericks President Glynn Herring to the hand of Fred "Mac" Stones, Resident Director of the Boys Ranch, seemed to provide an appropriate climax for the weekend. It was simply one more example of God's blessings flowing to the Boys Ranch through the hands of generous friends.

President's Perspective

A message from
Harry K. Weaver, President
of the Florida Sheriffs
Youth Fund.



Somewhere out there are a lot of people — a lot of families — that, at one time or another, have talked about sharing their home with a youngster who is not their own. Strangely enough, not very many have taken the next step which would be to inquire about it.

Meanwhile, within our programs at the Ranch, Villa and Youth Ranch, there, occasionally, are youngsters who could benefit from foster placement in individual family homes.

We give our youngsters all the love and attention that we can possibly give in a group care setting. For most, it is sufficient, but there are those who require a bit more. This extra personal touch can best be provided in a private family home.

The Youth Fund is concerned with doing what is best for each individual boy and girl who comes into its care. That is why, in addition to residential group care, our programs are licensed for foster care and adoptive placement, and that is why we use these alternatives whenever they seem appropriate for a particular child.

It is not difficult to become a foster parent. The prime qualification is a desire to share your home and your love with a child who is not a natural member of your family.

Are you concerned about the additional financial burden? You needn't be. Supplemental funds are available, as needed, for medical and dental care or for any unusual expenses which might be incurred on the youngster's behalf. Even normal living costs for the youngster can be subsidized if necessary.

Do you fear making a commitment and being saddled with a child who might not fit in with your family? Foster placements can and will be terminated if they are wrong. Qualified representatives of the Youth Fund will monitor the child's progress closely and will be available to help as they are needed.

We would be deceiving you if we said that there are not criteria and conditions which must be met. Of course, there are. Certain conditions are essential for your protection and for the protection of the child. These are only reasonable safeguards which are readily acceptable to the sincere individual or family who wishes to help a dependent, neglected, or homeless youngster in this very special way.

Let me ask once again . . . Are you among those who have thought about becoming a foster parent? Are you ready to take the next step and inquire about it? The right boy or girl, who needs someone like you, could make you very glad that you did.

Telephone (813) 533-0371. Ms. Morgan is the coordinator for the Youth Fund on foster care and adoptive placement.

FLORIDA SHERIFFS YOUTH FUND IS...

A charitable, non-profit corporation, sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, to manage and operate the Boys Ranch, the Girls Villa, the Youth Ranch, and any other youth programs that may later be developed by the Florida Sheriffs Association. One of the most important functions of the Youth Fund is the raising, receiving, budgeting and disbursing of funds for its programs. Gifts and bequests can be made to the Youth Fund for the exclusive benefit of any single youth program, such as the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, or Youth Ranch. BOYS RANCH

IS a home for dependent, neglected and homeless boys sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association and operated under the management of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund, Inc. It is not an institution for delinquents.

The Boys Ranch was founded in 1957 and is located nine miles north of Live Oak, Florida. It has approximately 100 boys in care at any given time, and it is supported almost entirely by voluntary gifts through the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund, Inc.

GIRLS VILLA

IS a similar institution for needy and worthy girls located near Bartow, Florida. It was founded in 1970. The first buildings were completed in July, 1972, and the first girls were admitted in August, 1972. Current enrollment is 24 girls.

YOUTH RANCH

IS the newest group child care facility sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association. It was founded in 1976, and is located near Clearwater, Florida. The first youngsters were admitted in August, 1978. The Youth Ranch provides a homelike environment for brothers and sisters who are dependent, neglected or homeless.

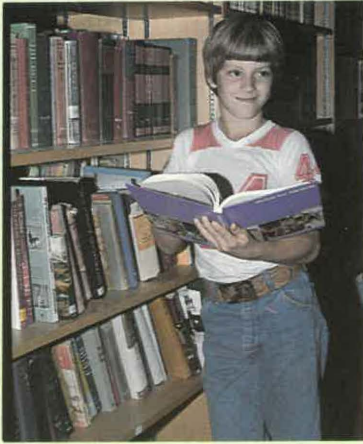

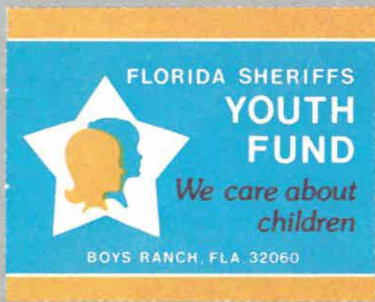

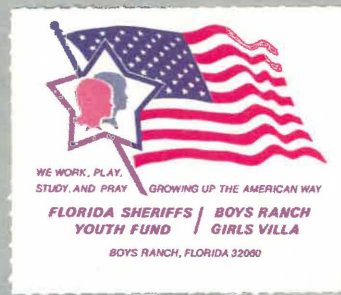
